Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE WHARFS AND JETTIES BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 25th September, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder; such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Onliwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorpanyal riding of the shire of Corio.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board which since the 10th November, 1927, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of constructing or demolishing wooden or concrete wharfs, piers, or jetties," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 25th September, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) WET WORK RATE.—Men who in the ordinary course of their work are-
 - (i) Wetted from feet to knees shall be paid 1s. per day or portion of a day extra, irrespective of ... whether rubber boots are worn or not.
- (4) SHIFTS .- That-
 - (a) The hour of beginning and the hour of ending each shift shall be as follows:--

⁽b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a half for the first four hours, and thereafter double time.

⁽⁵⁾ SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
