Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE HORSEHAIR BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 3rd October, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of preparing horsehair for trade or sale," has made the following Determination, namely:—

NOTE.—On the 16th June, 1913, the powers of the Horsehair Board were extended to enable it to deal with rates for cowhair or pighair.

(1) That on the 3rd October, 1931, the last previous Determination of the Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—All work done on Sundays, Good Friday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), and Christmas Day, shall be paid for at the rate of double time, and for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, and Boxing Day, the rate of payment shall be time and a half; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above holidays, the special rates shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act 1931.

REGULATIONS.

At Horsham, the first day of October, 1931.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Slater

Mr. Pollard.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act 1931* and by the *Justices Act 1928* in that behalf His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act Regulations 1931* and shall come into operation on the 2nd day of October, 1931.

In these Regulations the expression "the Act" shall mean the *Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act 1931*.

2. The forms set out in the Schedule hereto shall be used for the purpose of proceedings under the *Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act 1931* so far as they are respectively applicable.

3. A copy of an application for a Protection Order may be served in the same manner and at the same time as a Special Summons under the *Justices Act 1928*. The person serving such copy shall endorse on the original application an affidavit of service as is required by section 23 of the *Justices Act 1928*.

4. On receipt of an application for a Protection Certificate the notification to be sent by registered letter by the Clerk of Petty Sessions to a creditor shall specify a date on which the Court will proceed to hear such application, being not less than 12 days after the day on which in the ordinary course of post such letter would be delivered to such creditor.

5. In any case where the landlord being a mortgagor or lessee of the dwelling is required to send to his mortgagee or lessor by registered letter a notice that an application has been made under sub-section (5) of section 6 of the Act, it shall be sufficient if he sends by registered post to such mortgagee or lessor a true copy of the copy application with the time and place appointed for the hearing endorsed thereon.
