PROCLAMATION

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 3975. "An Act to approve adopt authorize and ratify an Agreement between the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Northcote and the Trustees for the time being of the Victorian Board of Directors of the Australian Natives Association and to provide for the Form of the Debentures to be issued pursuant to the said Agreement."

No. 3976. "An Act to amend sub-section (2) of Section Eleven of the *Financial Emergency Act 1931*."

BY-LAW No. 42 MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

Part I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1928*, within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

Part II.

BEAUFORT WATER SUPPLY.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water), save as hereinafter provided, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Forty shillings, and, in addition to such rate, for each garden upon a tenement a further sum of Five shillings, and there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement. For each water trough supplied with water, such trough having a ball-tap attached thereto, the sum of Ten shillings; for each steam-boiler supplied with water, the sum of Fifteen shillings; for each syphon supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings. For water supplied by measure to the Beaufort Bowling Club, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made with a minimum charge of Ten pounds (£10). For water supplied to the Beaufort Croquet Club, a charge of £2 10s. per annum will be made. For water supplied to Public Buildings, a charge of Five pounds (£5) per annum will be made. For water supplied to buildings and reserves under the control of the council, charges under special agreement.

(b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Twenty shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

(c) On every house, tenement, or public building being outside the boundaries of the Township of Beaufort, and which is supplied with water from the Pipe Line from Mt. Cole to Beaufort, by measure at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but in no case shall such charge be less than the minimum sum of Seventy shillings. The council shall let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Seven shillings per annum for half-inch meters. Such rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jonathan's Reservoir, and Jackson's Reservoir, situate to the north, and Goldfield Reservoir, situate to the south of the Township of Beaufort, and the springs, races, and pipe lines which feed such reservoirs.

Part III.

THE WATERLOO WATER SUPPLY.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion there-

of is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement, or opposite some portion of such frontage of such house or tenement, the sum of Thirty shillings per annum. For water supplied to Public Buildings a charge of Thirty shillings will be made.

5. "The Waterloo Water Supply" means the "Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the Parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about 5 miles in a northerly direction from the Township of Beaufort.

Part IV.

6. Such rates and meter rents as aforesaid are made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of October, 1931, and ending on the thirtieth day of September, 1932, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the *Water Act 1928*.

7. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

Hospitals and Charities Act 1928.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of December, 1931.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Williams | Mr. Kiernan.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, pursuant to the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1928*, rescind all Regulations hitherto made under the said Act, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Regulations under the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1928*.

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“The Act” means the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1928*.

“Hospital” means a hospital not exempted from the operation of the Act.

“Intermediate patient” means a patient, not being a “private” patient, who is able to pay to—

(a) the committee or board of management of the hospital whereof he is a patient the prescribed fees for hospital attention, accommodation, and nursing; and

(b) medical practitioners, surgeons, or specialists for services rendered fees not in excess of the maximum fixed for intermediate patients under authority of these Regulations.

“Prescribed” means approved by the Board unless the contrary intention appears.

“Private patient” means a patient who is able to pay to—

(a) the committee or board of management of the hospital concerned the prescribed fees for hospital attention, accommodation, and nursing; and

(b) medical practitioners, surgeons, or specialists for services rendered fees in excess of the maximum fixed for intermediate patients under the authority of these Regulations.

3. Nominations by the Metropolitan Hospitals Association, the Country Hospitals Association, and the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies (other than hospitals), whether within or outside of the metropolis, respectively for the appointment of persons to replace members of the Board nominated by such associations, institutions, or societies, but retiring by effluxion of time, shall be made under the hands of the president and secretary of the association, institution, or society concerned, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Victoria within a period of two months from the date upon which nominations are called for.

4. Where any subsidized institution or benevolent society referred to in the last preceding Regulation desires to submit a nomination to appoint a person to replace a member of the Board retiring by effluxion of time from the Board the following procedure shall be adopted:—

(a) The committee of each such institution or benevolent society concerned may in manner hereinbefore provided submit to the Treasurer of Victoria the name of one person qualified for appointment. Provided that where there is no such committee the nomination may be signed by the person or persons who is or are recognized by the Treasurer as the controlling authority of the institution or benevolent society concerned.

(b) If the total number of names of persons eligible for appointment to the Board submitted by all the committees or controlling authorities of the institutions and benevolent societies concerned exceeds the number of appointments to be made, the Treasurer shall cause ballot-papers to be prepared with the names of all such persons printed thereon in alphabetical order, and one of such ballot-papers shall be forwarded by registered letter to the committee or controlling authority of each institution and benevolent society concerned.

(c) Upon the receipt of the ballot-paper the committee or controlling authority of each institution or benevolent society shall record a vote thereon against as many names as there are vacant positions on the Board and indicate the order of preference of such votes by placing the figures 1, 2, 3, and so on opposite to the names of the persons who it is desired should receive nomination.

(d) Each ballot-paper must be signed by the president and the secretary to the institution or benevolent society concerned (or in cases where there is no committee, by the person or persons referred to in paragraph (a) hereof) and must be forwarded so as to reach the Treasurer within a period of two months from the date upon which nominations are called for.

(e) Upon the receipt of such ballot-papers the Treasurer shall appoint a returning officer to count the votes and report the result to him. The persons whom the said returning officer reports as having been elected shall be deemed to have been nominated by the subsidized institutions and benevolent societies concerned, and such nominations shall be recommended to the Governor in Council for appointment to the Board.

(f) In counting the votes the returning officer shall, so far as practicable, follow the procedure laid down under the preferential system for the time being in force for the election of senators for the Commonwealth of Australia.

(g) In the event of two or more candidates obtaining an equal number of votes at an election, the returning officer shall determine by lot the person or persons to be nominated.

(h) If any dispute or difference arises in regard to the election or nomination of persons whose names are submitted for nomination for appointment as members of the Board, the matter shall be submitted to and decided by the Treasurer of Victoria, whose decision thereon shall be final.

5. If at the annual general meeting of the contributors to an incorporated institution held for the purpose of electing members of the committee or other elective officers more than the number of candidates required to constitute such committee or to fill vacancies in any elective office are nominated an election shall be held, and the contributors there present shall thereupon fix a day for the taking of a ballot, and shall appoint a returning officer and such other officers as are necessary for the conduct of the election. The meeting shall then be adjourned without prejudice to the completion of any other business before it until after such ballot has been taken, and at the adjourned meeting the returning officer shall report the result of the election.

6. Payment to the subsidized institutions of any sum of money from the Hospitals and Charities Fund shall be made on the conditions following:—

(a) That all forms of returns from time to time prescribed are properly completed and verified as printed thereon, and lodged at the office of the Board on or before the dates indicated thereon.

(b) That the prescribed forms of admission of patients shall be used.

(c) That in each published annual report issued to subscribers a comparative return covering the last preceding five years, and setting out an abstract of receipts, expenditure, and general statistics, is included.

(d) That accounts and records of transactions are kept under what is known as the Burdett system, subject to such alterations, additions, amendments, and audit as may be directed by the Board from time to time.

(e) That, in case of necessity, the Board shall have power to—

(i) transfer to any suitable institution in which there is accommodation available any destitute, aged, or infirm person who has been sent to gaol merely for medical treatment or shelter and not for crime;

(ii) transfer to any suitable institution in which there is accommodation available any destitute, aged, or infirm person confined in a hospital for the insane who has regained sanity;

(iii) send to any suitable institution in which there is accommodation available any destitute person whose case may, after due inquiry, be certified by a police magistrate to be that of a person who should be maintained in a charitable institution;

(iv) transfer persons more suitable for a benevolent asylum from a hospital to a benevolent asylum where there is accommodation available.

(f) That all pecuniary gifts (*inter vivos* or testamentary) made to the hospital specifically for endowment purposes are placed to the credit of the Endowment Fund.

- (g) That all unconditional pecuniary gifts (*inter vivos* or testamentary) not exceeding the sum of £100 are paid to the credit of the maintenance account.
- (h) That all unconditional pecuniary gifts (*inter vivos* or testamentary) exceeding the sum of £100 are paid to the credit of a reserve fund.
- (i) That credits accumulated in the maintenance account are not applied for endowment purposes. Provided, however, that such credits may be transferred to a reserve fund.
- (j) That all amounts placed in a reserve fund are invested from time to time in such manner as the committee directs and that any income arising from such investments is paid to the credit of maintenance or reserve funds. Provided that the committee may at any time for maintenance, building, or equipment purposes, authorize the disposal of the whole or any part of the reserve fund.
- (k) That the mortuary attached to any institution at any place where there is no public morgue may be utilized by the Government for the reception of dead bodies pending inquest or inquiry.
- (l) That in contracts for burials of destitute persons from institutions provision is made for procuring the services of a minister of religion of the denomination named in the order for burial.
- (m) That no payment by way of retiring allowance or gratuity is made from the funds of an institution or benevolent society.
- (n) That no medical officer attached to any institution is allowed to accept from patients not being private or intermediate patients either directly or indirectly any fee for his own use for services rendered at the institution, and that this condition is communicated to patients who receive treatment or relief.
- (o) That no officer attached to any institution is allowed to accept from patients either directly or indirectly any fee for his own use for services rendered at the institution.
- (p) That the erection of new buildings or alterations to existing buildings involving an expenditure of more than £300 are not undertaken without the approval of the Board, to which all plans and specifications must be submitted, and that copies of all plans approved by the Board are lodged with the Board for filing.
- (q) That in computing the number of days a patient has been in an institution the day of admission and the day of discharge are counted as only one day. (A case admitted and discharged on the same day must not be counted as an in-patient.) A case re-admitted within a month of discharge is not to be counted as a new case; but, if the institution is a hospital and the patient be re-admitted suffering from an ailment other than that for which he was first treated, he may be counted as a new case.
- (r) That no member of committee of an institution directly or indirectly supplies goods to the institution when such goods can be satisfactorily obtained elsewhere locally.
- (s) That no hospital makes any agreement or arrives at any undertaking with any municipality or group of municipalities in respect to the treatment of infectious diseases without having first obtained the approval of the Board and the concurrence of the Treasurer of Victoria.
- (t) That the committee or board of management of any institution when required by the Board purchases equipment, furnishings, and supplies:—
- in conformity with the standards approved by the Board; and
 - through a purchasing agency approved by the Board.

7. The register of all institutions and benevolent societies registered under the Act shall be made and kept by the Board in the following form, and shall have one page of the constituted volume appropriated to each registered institution and benevolent society:—

Name of institution or benevolent society.
 Address of institution or benevolent society.
 Classification.
 Functions and objects.
 Date of foundation.
 Date of registration.
 Date of incorporation.
 Particulars of property.
 Remarks.

8. (1) (a) Subject to the approval of the Board, any hospital may provide, on such terms and conditions as the Board approves, wings, wards, or parts for private and intermediate patients, or either of them.

(b) The Board may require any hospital to make provision for private and intermediate patients or either of them.

(c) The committee or a sub-committee of the hospital concerned shall be the authority, on a recommendation by a medical practitioner, to determine the admission of private or intermediate patients.

(d) The fees to be charged by any medical practitioner for services rendered by him to any private patient shall be a matter solely between the medical practitioner and the patient.

(e) The maximum fee to be charged by any medical practitioner for services rendered by him to any intermediate patient shall be according to a scale of fees approved by the Board on the recommendation of some association or body of medical practitioners which represents the majority of medical practitioners practising in Victoria.

(f) The fees payable by private and intermediate patients to the management of a hospital for accommodation and nursing shall be such as are approved by the Board, after consultation with the hospital committee or board of management concerned.

(g) All reputable medical practitioners in districts served by a hospital shall be entitled to render service to private and intermediate patients in such hospital.

(2) For the purpose of this Regulation the municipalities set out in the Fourth Schedule to the Act shall be the districts served by all hospitals situate in those districts.

(h) Any approval granted by the Board to the committee of any hospital to provide accommodation for private or intermediate patients in structures existing on the 28th day of May, 1929, shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i) No destitute person or a person unable to pay the fees prescribed for private or intermediate patients shall be refused admission to the hospital by reason only of inability to pay;

(ii) that separate records and accounts, in the form and on the basis prescribed by the Board, shall be kept in respect to all transactions relating to private and intermediate patients, and that such records and accounts, duly certified in manner required by the Board, shall be presented to the Board at the close of each financial year;

(iii) that any balance at credit at the end of each year shall, except for any special reasons approved by the Board, be paid in full to the maintenance account of the hospital for use of the general purposes of such hospital.

(i) Where, with the approval of the Board, separate wings are provided for the accommodation of private or intermediate patients the committee or board of management of the hospital shall—

(i) give to such wing or wings a separate name;

(ii) cause to be kept separate records and accounts in the form and on the basis prescribed by the Board, and shall cause such records and accounts, duly certified in manner required by the Board, to be presented to the Board at the close of each financial year;

(iii) ensure that no capital expenditure in connexion with the provision of buildings, equipment, furnishing, or any charge whatsoever in connexion with the provision of accommodation for private or intermediate patients is met from the funds of the hospital not specifically provided therefor.

(iv) ensure that no maintenance expenditure in connexion with patients or staff, buildings, equipment, furnishings, or any charge whatsoever in connexion with the accommodating of private or intermediate patients is met from the funds of the hospital not specifically provided therefor.

(v) at the end of each year unless otherwise approved by the Board cause any amount at credit of the private or intermediate patient's account to be transferred to the maintenance account of the public section of the hospital.

9. If any dispute arises as to the application or interpretation of these Regulations the matter shall be decided by the Board, provided that an appeal against any ruling of the Board may be made to the Treasurer of Victoria, whose decision thereon shall be final.

And the Honorable E. J. Hogan, His Majesty's Treasurer for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

All that piece of land in the Parish of Boodyarn, the boundaries of which are as follow:—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 40 of the said parish; thence by lines bearing respectively 89 deg. 46 min. 124 links, 143 deg. 11 min. 339 links, 74 deg. 4 min. 226.6 links, 37 deg. 36 min. 267 links, 89 deg. 46 min. 134 links, 218 deg. 21 min. 479 links, 270 deg. 20 min. 268 links, and 323 deg. 11 min. 463 links to the point of commencement—which said piece of land is particularly delineated and shown coloured red on survey plan No. 2629, lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

AMENDMENT OF ORDER IN COUNCIL PRESCRIBING A
ROUTE WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN AREA ALONG
WHICH MOTOR OMNIBUSES FOR WHICH "REGULAR
SERVICE" LICENCES ARE GRANTED MAY PLY FOR
HIRE.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 15 (1) (b) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), doth by this Order amend the Order in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 20th April, 1931, prescribing a route within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the said Act may ply for hire, in the manner following:—

For Route No. 75A there shall be substituted the following route:—"Commencing at the Shire Hall, Keilor, via Keilor-road, Mount Alexander-road, and Russell-street to Essendon Railway Station."

Under the heading "Sections (if any) on Route," for the words and figures "(1) Between Shire Hall, Keilor, and Treadwell-road; (2) between Treadwell-road and Tramway Terminus," there shall be substituted the words and figures "(1) Between Shire Hall, Keilor, and Foster's-road; (2) between Foster's road and North Pole-road; (3) between North Pole-road and Treadwell-road; (4) between Treadwell-road and Tramway Terminus; (5) between Tramway Terminus and Essendon Railway Station; (6) between North Pole-road and Essendon Railway Station; (7) between Foster's-road and Essendon Railway Station."

Under the heading "Time-tables to be Observed," for the words "Minimum service, six trips daily, week days," there shall be substituted the words and figures "Minimum service: Leave Keilor, Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, 7.40 a.m., 8.45

a.m., 11 a.m., 1.30 p.m., 3.45 p.m., 5.15 p.m., also Fridays and Saturdays, 7 p.m., Sundays 9.30 a.m., 1.45 p.m., 5.30 p.m., 7 p.m.; leave Essendon Railway Station, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8.20 a.m., 10.30 a.m., 11.30 a.m., 2.30 p.m., 4.45 p.m., 6.30 p.m., also Fridays, 9.30 p.m., Saturdays, 8.20 a.m., 10.30 a.m., 12.45 p.m., 2 p.m., 4.30 p.m., 6.30 p.m., 11.45 p.m., Sundays, 11 a.m., 2.15 p.m., 6.30 p.m."

Under the heading "Fares to be Charged," for the words and figures "Section No. 2, 2d.; through fare, 1s.; return through fare, 1s. 6d.," there shall be substituted the words and figures "Sections (1), (2), and (3), 3d. each; section (4), 2d.; section (5), 6d.; section (6), 6d.; section (7), 9d. single, 1s. 3d. return; through fare, 1s. single; 1s. 6d. return."

Pursuant to the provisions of section 15 (1) (c) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said Licensing Authority all of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act* 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act* 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act* 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act* 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

TENDERS will be received before Noon on Tuesday, 22nd December, 1931, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act* 1928 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except under the 121st section of the *Land Act* 1928, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council.

2. 3. 4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6.
