Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE TENTMAKERS BOARD.

This Determination on the 14th March, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board, which since the 13th September, 1927, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing—

(a) articles made of canvas or a substitute for canvas such as-

Sails, tents, marquess, ships' gear, wings of aeroplanes, horse rugs, cow rugs, water bags, outside blinds (except Venetian blinds), filters, mail bags, tarpaulins;

(b) any other kind of canvas goods except those subject to the jurisdiction of any of the following Boards:-

Agricultural Implements Board, Country Agricultural Implements Board, Boot Board, Carriage Board, Leather Goods Board, and Rubber Trade Board;

(c) flage;"

has made the following Determination, namely :--

(1) That on the 14th March, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

Apprentices. One male apprentice to every three or fraction of three male workers receiving not less than 87s. per week of 48 hours. One female apprentice to every three or fraction of three female workers receiving not less than 52s. per week of 45 hours. D'An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed was approved on 12th September, 1923.

Improvers.

One male improver to each male worker receiving not less than 87s. per week of 48 hours.

One female improver to each female worker receiving not less than 52s. per week of 45 hours.

Provided that one female improver in lieu of one male

improver may be employed.

(5) Special Rates.—That double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday. Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.

(7) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 150 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at any work for which the Board has fixed the minimum wage, provided that such employer shall be such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
