Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

## DETERMINATION OF THE GARDEN EMPLOYEES BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 21st March, 1931, applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677); such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not within the said District, and the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Mordialloc, and Warrnambool.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed as gardeners or gardeners' labourers-

- (a) by a master gardener other than a market gardener;
- (b) in connexion with the laying out, cultivation, or keeping in order of a garden belonging to a private house;
- (c) in the laying out, cultivation, or keeping in order of a garden or lawn in connexion with a racecourse;
- (d) in the laying out, cultivation, or keeping in order of a garden, lawn, fairway, or green in connexion with any golf links or putting green";

has made the following Determination, namely:-

- (1) That this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 21st March, 1931.
