STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION.

AMENDMENT OF ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDERS.

Shire of Doncaster.

IT is recommended that the Governor in Council, pursuant to the power in that behalf reserved in the Orders in Council made under the Electric Light and Power Acts 1896 and 1915, which Orders in Council are recited in the schedule hereunder, approve of the undertaker for the purpose of those Orders charging on and after the first day of September, 1930, for energy supplied by it to any consumer for heating or power for any use other than normal domestic use or than use for heating and power at and for the normal conduct of an hotel or boarding-house by the following method, that is to say:—

A fixed periodical or service charge which shall be payable whether any or no energy is consumed during the period for which it is payable, and a charge according to the amount of energy supplied or to the electrical quantity contained in such supply.

Provided that the said fixed periodical or service charge shall not exceed a sum calculated upon the horse-power of motors installed for the time being or the capacity of furnaces or appliances installed for the time being other than motors in accordance with the following table:—

Horse-power installed by consumer:—

Service charge per horse-power per month—50 and under, 6s.; 51-100, 5s. 6d.; 101-200, 5s.; 201-500, 4s. 6d.,

which charges shall be subject to discount in accordance with the following:—

No. of motors:—

Discount.—3 motors, 5 per cent.; 4 motors, 10 per cent.; 5 motors, 15 per cent.; 6 or more motors, 20 per cent.,

it being understood that in the case of furnaces or appliances other than motors the same service charge will be made for every 746-watts capacity of the furnace or appliance as is to be made per horse-power of motors, and the energy charge shall not exceed One penny per unit.

NOTICE OF INTENTION RE PROHIBITION OF NETTING IN PORTION OF BANCROFT BAY, IN THE GIPPSLAND LAKES.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamations dated the 18th day of July, 1919, and the 26th day of January, 1926, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd July, 1919, and the 27th January, 1926, respectively, and in lieu thereof to prohibit during the whole of each year:—

- (1) The use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing at Metung, in Bancroft Bay, within or shorewards of a line running from the lighted beacon on Shaving Point to Travers Point, east of the boundary between allotments 4 and 5 of section 1, Parish of Bumberrah.

MARIBYRNONG RIVER.

HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

Notice to Boatmen.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 7th February, 1931, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand and carry a bucket for fire-extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers, and no boat deemed by the River Officer or his deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly, shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boats, except such as have permission of the River Officer or his deputy.

After sunset motor boats shall exhibit a red light and go slow.

Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

Rowing boats shall exhibit a white light after sunset.

All boats must give way to racing boats going upstream to the start of the course.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the Council of any municipal district or any country district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be included in and form part of such fire district: And whereas the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare that, pursuant to the provisions of section 5 (1) of the aforesaid Act, the portions of the Shires of Eltham and Heidelberg comprised within the following boundaries shall, from the 1st day of January, 1931, be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, viz:—

BY-LAW No. 110.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under sections 197 and 228 of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 110, for altering By-law No. 107, prescribing areas within the Municipal District as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such area the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in the By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

1. Clause 1 of By-law No. 107.—Alteration of residential area No. 9, South Ward, is hereby repealed.

2. The area within the municipal district hereunder specified shall be a residential area:—

Area No. 9.—South Ward.

The whole area contained by a line commencing at the intersection of the southern building line of Swan-street and the eastern building line of Mary-street; thence in an easterly direction along the southern building line of Swan-street for a distance of approximately 196 feet; thence in a southerly

direction running parallel with the western building line of Coppin-street to its intersection with the northern boundary of the railway property; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the railway property, across Coppin-street, to its intersection with the eastern building line of Coppin-street; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern building line of Coppin-street, across the railway and Madden-grove to its intersection with the southern building line of Madden-grove; thence in an easterly direction along the southern building line of Madden-grove to its intersection with the western building line of Rooney-street; thence in a southerly direction along the western building line of Rooney-street, across Rose-street to its intersection with the northern building line of Barkly-avenue; thence in a westerly direction along the northern building line of Barkly-avenue, across Coppin-street, to its intersection with the eastern building line of Mary-street; thence in a northerly direction along the eastern building line of Mary-street, across Madden-grove and the railway, back to the commencing point—containing an approximate total area of 16 acres.

SHIRE OF HEYTESBURY.

BY-LAW FOR SWIMMING POOL.

By-law No. 32.

A By-law of the Shire of Heytesbury, made under Part VII. and Part XXIX. of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 32, for preserving good order and decency in the Public Baths (Swimming Pool) in the Shire of Heytesbury and in the land and buildings used in connexion with the said Baths, and preventing damage to such buildings or to the furniture or fittings thereof, and for the management and use of the said Baths, buildings, furniture, fittings, or other property or effects used in connexion therewith, the public reserve upon which they are situate, and for fixing the amounts to be charged for admission to and for use of the same or any part thereof, and for fixing the hours during which such Baths shall be open.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heytesbury order as follows:—

1. Wherever appearing throughout this By-law, unless otherwise stated or inconsistent with the context, the word “Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Heytesbury; the word “municipality” shall mean the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heytesbury; the word “Baths” shall include the swimming pool, showers, dressing-rooms, conveniences, paths, passageways, fences, accessories, and the grounds fenced in with and known as the Cobden Swimming Pool in the Shire of Heytesbury and the premises in connexion with the same; the words “Baths attendant” shall include the Council’s employee or employees superintending the Baths; words in the singular shall include the plural; words in the plural shall include the singular; and words importing the masculine gender shall include females.

2. No person using the Baths nor any Bath attendant or officer or servant or other person employed thereat shall at any time bring or introduce into the Baths or any part thereof spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

3. No person shall enter or remain in or on the Baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

4. No person resorting to the Baths shall, after using the swimming pool or any shower, loiter or remain without reasonable excuse in any passage-way to or from the swimming pool or any shower. No person shall resort to or use the Baths except for the proper purposes thereof.

5. No person shall cause or allow any dog or animal belonging to him or under his control to enter or remain in the Baths. Any dog or animal found in the Baths may be destroyed.

6. No officer or servant employed at the Baths other than the duly authorized Baths attendant shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for the hire or use of any article or articles; or for any purpose whatsoever, without the knowledge and consent of the Baths attendant.

7. No person shall by forcible or improper means seek admission to any dressing room, or shower, or convenience which shall be occupied by any other person.

8. No man or boy above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate yard, passage, or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

9. No woman or girl above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower, or conveniences which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate yard, passage, or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

10. No child under the age of eight years will be brought or admitted to the Baths unless, in the opinion of the Baths attendant, such child is in the care of a responsible person.

11. No person shall smoke in any dressing-room, convenience, or passage-way, or within 15 feet of the swimming pool.

12. No person shall, whilst suffering from any disease of the skin or infectious or contagious disease, apply for admission to enter into or upon or make use of the Baths. Any such person shall be liable, in addition to the penalties set out in this By-law, to be removed from the Baths immediately and handed over to the proper authorities.

13. Every person using the swimming pool shall wear a suitable bathing gown or other sufficient dress or covering to prevent indecent exposure of the person.

14. No person shall use in the swimming pool soap or any other substance or preparation which might cause the water to become discoloured, turbid, unpleasant, or unfit for its proper use by bathers, or make use of the Baths whilst in an unclean condition.

15. Every person shall, before using the swimming pool, make use of the cleansing shower baths provided, in which the use of soap is permitted.

16. The Council reserves to itself the right at any time and from time to time of closing or restricting the use of the Baths or any part thereof for cleansing, repairs, or other purposes without incurring any liability to any person.

17. For the purpose of maintaining good order the Baths attendant may refuse admission to the Baths to any person.

18. No person shall spit in the Baths, or deface any wall, fittings, or any portion of the Baths by cutting or writing thereon.

19. No person shall wilfully and improperly throw or place any foreign substance or foul or pollute the water in the swimming pool, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile or interfere with any article of clothing, towel, bathing trunk or drawers, or bathing dress belong to the municipality or otherwise, or any dressing-room, convenience, or passage-way, or any furniture or other article therein.

20. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently damage, injure, or destroy any part of the Baths, or any plant, tree, shrub, flower, or grass growing within or about the same, or any article or thing therein.

21. No person shall at any time, whilst being in the Baths, use any indecent, offensive, or abusive language, or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

22. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with the Baths attendant, or any officer or servant employed at the Baths, in the performance of his duty at the Baths.

23. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any dressing-room or in any other part of the Baths shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to the Baths attendant or other person acting on his behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in a book kept for that purpose; and any person who shall have lost such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the Baths attendant or other person authorized to receive such article upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.

24. The municipality or any of its officers or employees shall not be responsible for any article damaged, injured, or lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Baths.

25. The municipality may, by ordinary resolution (to be published once in the *Cobden Times* newspaper), fix fees and charges for the use of the Baths and hours for the use thereof. No person shall enter or attempt to enter the Baths except on payment of the fees and charges so fixed, or except during such hours.

26. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such breach on conviction.

27. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of that part of the municipal district of Heytesbury wherein are erected or may be erected public baths and buildings used in connexion therewith.

28. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the *Local Government Act 1928*, in the *Government Gazette*.
