## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 8 (DAIRY PRODUCE AND COOKED MEAT).

Note.—This Determination on the 13th April, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1923 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder: such partions of the city of Sandringham as are not within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geolong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

I N accordance with the provisons of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of a seller of Dairy Produce or Cooked Meat," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 13th April, 1931, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(3)</sup> OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the number of hours as fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

<sup>(4)</sup> Time Rate.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed in this Determination for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

<sup>(5)</sup> Termination of Employment.—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

<sup>(6)</sup> Special Rates.—Time and a half shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Royal Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day; but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

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
