Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 15 (GROCERS).

Note.—This Determination on the 21st April, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order-in-Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business of a grocer, including a seller of tea," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That, on the 21st April, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(6) Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid, for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed in this Determination for an ordinary week's work, at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of 40 per centum. ALLOWANCE. Where, in conformity with the custom of the trade, an employee wears, when at work, a washable onter garment, the laundering of which is not paid for by the employer, such employee shall be paid 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the ordinary rate.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(9) SPECIAL RATES.

Time and a half shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Royal Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or New Year's Day; but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
