REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND AT ELSTERNWICK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 31st October, 1928, as a site for Public Recreation and Children's Playground in the City of Brighton at Elsternwick, Parish of Prahran (Elsternwick Children's Memorial Playground).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, which is parcelled out in the undermentioned divisions, shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—

- (a) The Children's Playground.
- (b) The remainder of the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein. All paper, fruit, peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Committee of management for the purpose.

5. (a) No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over or upon the same, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(b) No person shall lead, ride, drive, or exercise any horse or other animal within any portion of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Playground, or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon: Provided, however, that parents and other attendants shall be at liberty, notwithstanding, to enter the Children's Playground to watch over children who are in their charge.

14. The swings and other appliances erected in the Children's Playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children be waiting to use them.

15. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purposes for which they are respectively provided.

16. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground.

17. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.

18. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.

19. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the directions of any duly authorized officer of the said Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct therein.

20. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee of Management shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the City of Brighton as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISHES OF WHITFIELD AND WHITFIELD SOUTH, AND TOGETHER KNOWN AS THE POWERS' LOOK-OUT RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the

land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 25th October, 1886, as a site for Public purposes in the Parish of Whitfield (now Parish of Whitfield South) and the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 21st January, 1931, as a site for Public purposes in the Parishes of Whitfield and Whitfield South, together known as Powers' Look-out Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sums which the Committee of Management may at any time, determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Oxley as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE DUNOLLY RACECOURSE RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 22nd May, 1917, as a site for a Racecourse and for the recreation, convenience, or amusement of the people, being 80 acres 1 rood 14 perches in the Parish of Dunolly.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding sixteen (16) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for horse racing, fêtes, football, cricket, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the fees provided hereinafter may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve, such Reserve being parcelled out in the following divisions:—

- (1) The grandstand and conveniences connected therewith.
- (2) The weighing yard, the stewards', jockeys', and committee rooms, and enclosure.
- (3) Any enclosure called the "birdcage" and the approaches thereto.
- (4) The remainder of the Reserve.

2. The Committee of Management may—

- (1) Let the Reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations; but the maximum fees payable therefor shall not exceed viz., £20 per day from any racing or trotting club; from other bodies, 10 per cent. of the gross receipts at entrance gates.
- (2) Set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purposes of any lawful game, horse races, trotting, coursing, or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

3. The following is the scale of entrance fees and other charges which may be levied for admission to the several divisions of the Reserve and the buildings thereon respectively, on such days as the Reserve has been set apart as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations:—

For the admission of each adult on race days—

- (a) To the first division, such sum as shall not exceed 10s.
- (b) To the third division, such sum as shall not exceed 3s.
- (c) To the remainder of the Reserve, such sum as shall not exceed 3s.

For the admission of each horse for training or exercising on the Reserve, for every half-year, 20s.

For the admission of each adult to the Reserve, or any part thereof, on any day set apart for fêtes, football, cricket, sports, or holiday amusements, such sum as shall not exceed 5s.

4. No person or persons—

- (1) Except the judge, timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box or the approaches thereto, nor the stewards' stand or the stewards' room, or approaches thereto, except the stewards of any club using the Reserve, and such persons as they may invite to do so.
- (2) Shall enter the weighing yard, jockeys' and committee rooms and enclosure, or the approaches thereto, except the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the body conducting galloping or trotting races or other sports gathering on the day, or their respective officers, and such other persons as the aforesaid Committee of Management and committee or stewards may invite and/or permit to do so.
- (3) Shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- (4) Shall damage in any way the trees in the Reserve, or light fires therein.
- (5) Shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- (6) Shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission,

in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

- (7) Shall be permitted to train any horse within the Reserve, or bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- (8) Shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any buildings, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (9) Shall carry on the trade or calling of a bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management and/or the committee or stewards of the body conducting galloping or trotting races or other sports gathering on the day with permission of the Committee of Management.

5. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or of the committee or stewards of the body conducting galloping or trotting races or other sports gathering on the day, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or by any other competent racing or sporting tribunal, to have been at any time guilty of malpractice, or dishonest, corrupt, or fraudulent or improper practices on the turf, or dishonorable action or conduct in connexion with racing or recreation, or have been proved to the satisfaction of such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or other competent racing or sporting tribunal, to be a defaulter shall enter upon the Reserve or any part thereof, or remain upon the Reserve or any part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or by any person appointed by them for that purpose on such days as the Reserve has been set apart as provided in Regulation No. 1.

6. Every member of the body conducting galloping or trotting races or other sports gathering on the day, and every person paying for admission to the first, third, and fourth divisions of the Reserve, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which shall be upon demand produced or (if required) surrendered to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the body conducting galloping or trotting races or other sports gathering on the day, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards to demand the production or surrender of same.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

(For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.)

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, horse racing, fêtes, coursing, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any other order given by the Committee of Management.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
