Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

## DETERMINATION OF THE PHOTOGRAPHERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 9th September, 1932, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the City of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopel.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process of making photographs" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 9th September, 1932, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(3)</sup> ORDINARY WEER'S WORK.—The number of hours which shall constitute an ordinary week's work shall be—

1st November to the end of February :: ... 48 hours.

1st March ,, October ... 44 ,,

(4) Overtime.—All work done in excess of the number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(6) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Anzac Day, or Good Friday; and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Easter Monday, King's Birthday (3rd June), or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
