Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act 1931.—Part II.

PROTECTION CERTIFICATE.

In the Court of Petty Sessions at Swan Hill, in the Midland Bailiwick.—In the matter of an application by SAMUEL JOHN TAYLOR, of Lake Boga, for a Protection Certificate.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamations made the eleventh day of June, 1913, and the twenty-ninth day of November, 1927, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of June, 1913, and the thirtieth day of November, 1927, respectively, regarding the use of mesh nets in Port Phillip Bay, and providing in lieu thereof that the following restrictions shall apply to the use of nets for the purpose of taking fish in the waters of Port Phillip Bay:—

1. The use of "mesh" or "set" nets containing meshes measuring less than four inches is prohibited from the first day of November in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive), provided that in the portion of Port Phillip Bay lying to the westward of an imaginary line running from the Werribee Sand Spit to the West Channel Pile Light and thence to Point King, near Sorrento, the use of such nets shall be prohibited from the first day of October to the thirtieth day of April next following (both days inclusive).
2. The use of "baited" mesh or set nets containing meshes measuring less than two and one-quarter inches is prohibited throughout the whole of each year.
3. The use of "seine" nets measuring more than two hundred fathoms in length is prohibited in the waters of Port Phillip Bay lying to the westward of an imaginary line running from the Gellibrand Pile Light to the West Channel Pile Light, and thence to the seaward end of the fishermen's pier at Queenscliff throughout the whole of each year.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS IN THE SHIRES OF ALBERTON, BACCHUS MARSH, BASS, BEECHWORTH, BENALLA, BERWICK, BET BET, BRIGHT, BULN BULN, COHUNA, CORIO, CRANBOURNE, DONALD, DUNMUNKLE, ELTHAM, HEALESVILLE, AND YEA.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the fifth day of September One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

Resolution for declaration of Main Roads under the Country Roads Act.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads acting under the powers conferred upon the Board by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty (20) in any one year) as the Reserve, or any part thereof, may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or other amusement, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult person to the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the gates, fences, trees, or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones, or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game, amusement, or sport, and from time to time grant to any club, or association of clubs, the use of the ground as set apart, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

6. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve, or any portion thereof, for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of five pounds five shillings (£5 5s.) per day.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

8. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

No person or persons shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such parking areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and every person using such parking area shall, on demand, pay a fee, not exceeding One shilling (1s.) per car or motor cycle, for entrance and use thereof, on such days only as a charge for admission is being made, as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.

17. No person shall engage in motor car or motor cycle racing or training within the Reserve without first having obtained the permission, in writing, from the Committee of Management. The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

REGULATION No. 31.

Open Sea Bathing.

A Regulation of the Shire of Winchelsea, numbered 31, under section 1 of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928* in force in the Shire of Winchelsea by virtue of the provisions of By-law No. 19, adopting Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

1. For repealing Regulation No. 2 (Bathing Regulations).
2. For the regulation of open sea bathing within the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and every other power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea order as follows:—

- (1) Regulation No. 2 (Bathing Regulations) be and the same are hereby respectively repealed.
- (2) No person shall bathe in the open sea at any part of the seashore within the municipal district of the Shire of Winchelsea, unless effectively and decently clothed.
- (3) No person shall dress or undress, or remove, or displace any part of his or her bathing costume in any place open to the public view, or enter or be or remain upon the said seashore, or within 300 yards of the seaward boundary of the said municipal district, with any part of his or her bathing dress so removed or displaced.
- (4) No person shall in or upon any part of the beach seashore, dressing-shed, or water used by the public for bathing purposes do any act which would injure, endanger, obstruct, inconvenience, or annoy any person.
- (5) No male over the age of ten years shall trespass in any dressing-shed, bathing-box, or latrines reserved for females, and no female shall trespass in any dressing-shed, bathing-box, or latrines reserved for males, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.
- (6) No person shall loiter, misconduct himself, commit a nuisance, bring any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into, or damage, disfigure, or write upon any of the bathing-boxes, dressing-sheds, or enclosures set apart or authorized by the Council for bathing purposes.
- (7) No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner in or on any part of the beach seashore or water set apart or used for bathing purposes or in connexion with such purposes.
- (8) Any constable or officer of police, or any duly authorized officer of the Council, may order any person who, in his opinion, is not sufficiently or decently dressed, or who, clad in bathing costume, acts in an indecent manner, uses indecent language, or in any way offends against this Regulation to resume his or her ordinary dress and/or leave the seashore and the vicinity thereof, and he or she shall forthwith comply with such order.

(9) This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district and/or within three hundred yards seaward of the boundary thereof.

Resolution for passing this Regulation agreed to by the Council on the 13th day of April, 1932, and confirmed on the 11th day of May, 1932.
