RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

ORDERS OF 31ST OCTOBER, 1932.

Relating to—

- (1) Certain matters arising out of Awards Nos. 8, 9, 30, and 31.
- (2) A difference between the Victorian Railways Commissioners and the grade of Skilled Labourer employed at the Ice Works, Melbourne.
- (3) A difference between the Victorian Railways Commissioners and the grade of Painter employed at the Amalgamated Workshops, Spotswood.

In the matter of the Railways Act and in the matter of references by the Victorian Branch of the AUSTRALIAN RAILWAYS UNION and the Victorian Branch of the AUSTRALIAN FEDERATED UNION OF LOCOMOTIVE ENGINEERS for interpretations of certain matters arising out of Awards Nos. 8, 9, 30, and 31 of the Railways Classification Board.

THESE references having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board and the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

AWARDS NOS. 8 AND 31.

Division 12.—Travelling and Waiting Time.

In the case of certain employees who were engaged on track repair work near Marshall and who claimed travelling time from and to Geelong, such travelling time is not payable.

Division 12.—Travelling and Waiting Time.

In the case of Acting Driver E. J. Hyatt, who travelled from Mildura at 8.30 p.m. on the 4th February, 1932, to undergo medical examination at Melbourne, arriving there at 10 a.m. on the 5th idem, and who commenced to return at 5.6 p.m. on the same day, arriving at Mildura at 7 a.m. on the 6th, he should be credited with one and a half days' travelling and waiting time in respect of the twenty-four hours from 8.30 p.m. on the 4th until 8.30 p.m. on the 5th, full time thence until 1.30 a.m. on the 6th, and three-quarter time from 1.30 a.m. until 7 a.m.

Division 13.—Relieving Expenses.

In the case of Relieving Guard R. P. Robinson, who relieved at Frankston, relieving expenses for two months from 23rd June, 1931, including 19th and 20th August, on which dates he was off duty in lieu of Sunday time and overtime, are payable.

Division 13.—Relieving Expenses.

In the case of Relieving Train Examiner W. Chamberlain, a single employee, who relieved at Donald, Maryborough, and Ouyen from 22nd December, 1931, relieving expenses for one month from that date are payable.

Division 15.—Transfers, Expenses, &c.

In the case of Acting Driver C. E. Ellis, who travelled from Ouyen at 10.50 p.m. on the 13th June on transfer to Ararat, arriving there at 1.20 p.m. on the 14th idem, two days' pay should be allowed.

Division 14.—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.

In the case of the guard who commences duty at Dimboola at 6.15 p.m.; runs to Rainbow, rests there overnight, leaves for Pimpinto at 10 a.m. next day, and ceases duty at Dimboola at 4.30 p.m., trip allowances amounting to 6s. 6d. are payable.

Division 19.—Relieving in Higher Positions.

Division 16.—Allowance in Lieu of Quarters.

In the case of Guard J. W. Bowman, who was required to perform the duties of station-master at Elaine on 12th August, 1932, the amount of 15s. 7d. is payable as indicated hereunder:—

Where the driver of an express or country passenger train has an interval between the trips run by such train, such interval time shall be paid at the higher rate.

The provisions of this award are applicable to special inquiry officers at Geelong and elsewhere.

THIS difference having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board, and it appearing that the above-mentioned employees claim that the work performed by them is substantially the same class of work as that of persons described as Painters in the Determination of the Painters' Board under the Factories and Shops Acts, and that the Commissioners affirm that the work of such employees is not substantially the same class of work as that of the persons so described in the said Determination, the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of both parties and the evidence adduced, and having determined that the said employees are not performing substantially the same class of work as the persons so described in the said Determination except when painting fixed structures, doth hereby order that sub-section (2) of section 187 of the said Act is applicable to the said employees when painting such structures, but otherwise is not so applicable.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Acts in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act Regulations, and these Regulations may be cited together as the Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act Regulations.

2. In these Regulations, the expression "the Act" shall mean the Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Acts.

3. In these Regulations, the expression "Board" means the Farmers Relief Board.

4. Clause 4 of the Regulations published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, No. 232, dated 2nd October, 1931, pages 2769-2774, and Forms Nos. 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 in the Schedule thereto, are hereby cancelled. The Regulations published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, No. 252, dated 11th November, 1931, are hereby cancelled. Clauses 1, 4, 6, 8, and 10 of the "Further Regulations," published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, No. 271, dated 25th November, 1931, pages 3310-16, and Forms Nos. 10 to 23 inclusive in the Schedule thereto, are hereby cancelled.

5. The forms set out in the Schedule hereto shall be used for the purposes of the Act as far as they are respectively applicable.

6. On receipt by the Clerk of Petty Sessions from the Secretary to the Farmers Relief Board of an application for a Protection Certificate, which is required to be heard and determined by the Court, the notification to be sent by registered letter by the Clerk of Petty Sessions to a creditor shall specify a date on which the Court will proceed to hear such application, being not less than twelve days after the day on which, in the ordinary course of post, such letter would be delivered to such creditor. The Clerk of Petty Sessions shall also give similar notice to the farmer, and to any mortgagee, vendor, owner, or lessor referred to in Sub-section 2 of Section 8 of the *Farmers Relief Act 1932*.

7. On receipt of an application for a Protection Certificate, other than one which is to be heard and determined by the Court, or of any application for extension or cancellation of a certificate, or for the deletion of land from the specification in a Protection Certificate, the notification to be sent by registered letter by the Secretary to the Board to a creditor shall specify a date on which the Board will proceed to hear such application, being not less than twelve days in the case of an application for a Protection Certificate, and not less than five days in the case of any other application herein referred to after the day on which, in the ordinary course of post, such letter would be delivered to such creditor. The Secretary to the Board shall also give similar notice to the farmer, and to any mortgagee, vendor, owner, and lessor referred to in Sub-section 2 of Section 8 of the *Farmers Relief Act 1932*.

8. Upon the issue of a Protection Certificate by the Court, the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall return to the Secretary to the Board—
(a) the application therefor; (b) any notice of debt relating thereto; and shall also forward (c) a copy of the Protection Certificate; and (d) all relevant documents.

9. The provisions of Sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section 31 of the *Unemployed Occupiers and Farmers Relief Act, 1931* shall extend and apply to any order of the Board deleting from a Protection Certificate, or from any order extending the same, the specification of any land.

10. In every case where an applicant is a lessee of Crown land, the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the Closer Settlement Board, or the Lands Department, as the case may be, shall forward to the Secretary to the Farmers Relief Board any information as to the use being made of the farm, the purposes to which it is best suited, and generally as to the farmers' methods, the securities executed by the farmer, the financial and other relevant particulars with respect to land and advances.

"In any case where the total amount payable to the farmer in respect of any transaction does not exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds such sum may, notwithstanding anything in section 32 of this Act, be paid to the farmer, who shall forward the sum forthwith to the Board."

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE FOOD AND DRUG STANDARDS REGULATIONS 1930 AND THE FOOD AND DRUG STANDARDS REGULATIONS 1931 (No. 2).

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1932, and shall come into operation one month after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Regulation 16 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1930 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

16. EXEMPTIONS FROM STATEMENT, OF WEIGHT, MEASURE, OR NUMBER.

(1) Packages of food or substances named hereunder shall be exempt from declaration in the label of weight, measure, or number of the contents thereof:—

Aerated waters.
Alcoholic liquors liable to Customs or Excise duty.
Anchovies.
Australian wines.
Beverage powders.
Calves' feet jelly in tins or bottles.
Candied peels marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed".
Capers in bottles.
Cheeses marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed".
Chutney in bottles.
Confectionery in packages of two pounds' weight or under.
Crystallized fruits marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed".
Curry powder in bottles.
Dehydrated or dried vegetables.
Dried culinary herbs.
Dried codfish in blocks.
Dried figs.
Dried or dehydrated fruits in packages of two pounds' weight or under.
Fish in tins or glass containers.
Flavoured cordials and syrups.
Flour in bags of twenty-five pounds' weight and over.
Food substances sold with directions to dilute with water to a definite amount or to taste; condensed and concentrated milks excepted.
Fruits in bottles.
Fruit juices or fruit extracts.
Fruit juice cordials and syrups.
Fruit squash.
Fruit squash cordials and drinks.
Ginger in jars or in fancy packages.
Gingerbeer powders and other beverage powders.
Hams marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed".
Honey in comb.

Hops in packages of one pound weight or under.
 Ice-cream, flavoured ices, and flavoured ice-blocks.
 Imitation cordials and syrups.
 Mineral waters.
 Non-excisable fermented drinks.
 Nuts in packages of four ounces or under.
 Ox tongues.
 Oysters in bottles or tins.
 Pickles in bottles.
 Popcorn.
 Potted meat and pastes.
 Prepared puddings marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed".
 Preserved ginger marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed".
 Raspberry vinegar.
 Rennet.
 Salt in tins or bottles.
 Salt substitutes in tins or bottles.
 Sauces.
 Soap.
 Soup in packets.
 Soup sausages.
 Summer drinks.
 Temperance drinks.
 Vegetables preserved in tins.
 Food substances supplied in bulk for re-sale.

(2) Exemption from declaration of weight, measure, or number in respect of any of the above-named foods or substances shall not apply when they are packed in a different manner from that specified.

Regulation 5 of the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1931 (No. 2) is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor—

27A. Eggs.

- (1) For the purposes of this Regulation unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 "Cold storage premises" includes any premises where eggs are chilled.
 "Egg" means the egg of the domestic hen or duck.
 "Preserved eggs" means eggs that have been subjected to any preservative treatment other than chilling.
 "Proprietor" includes the owner the occupier the lessee or person in charge of any premises where eggs are sold stored chilled or preserved.
- (2) No person shall sell any egg unless—
 (a) it is sound and wholesome; and
 (b) on candling the white is translucent and the yolk translucent or but faintly visible.
- (3) (a) No person shall sell any chilled egg or preserved egg if the air cell exceeds three-eighths of one inch in depth or if the shell is not marked in legible and durable characters with the word CHILLED or PRESERVED as the case may be.
 (b) No person except with the approval of the inspector shall remove eggs from any cold storage premises unless the shells are marked with the word CHILLED and no proprietor of such premises shall cause allow permit or suffer any eggs to be removed therefrom unless the shells are so marked.
- (4) No person shall retail eggs—
 (a) not being chilled or preserved, if the air cell exceeds one quarter of one inch in depth;
 (b) unless the shell is clean and free from cracks and stain; and
 (c) unless they are graded in accordance with their weight as prescribed hereunder—

Grade.	Weight of each egg (in ounces).
Special	Not less than 2½
Standard	Not less than 2
Medium	Not less than 1½
Small	Less than 1½

(5) The proprietor of every shop stand stall vehicle or other place where eggs are retailed shall—

(a) keep or cause to be kept the different grades of eggs in separate receptacles;

(b) affix or cause to be affixed to each receptacle a placard on which shall be printed or written the grade of the eggs and in addition in the case of chilled or preserved eggs the word CHILLED or PRESERVED as the case may be;

(c) in the case of duck eggs include or cause to be included on the placard the word DUCK;

(d) print or write or cause to be printed or written on the placard all the prescribed words in plain and legible characters; and

(e) display or cause to be displayed each placard in such a position that the words thereon are plainly visible to customers.

(6) It shall not be deemed to be a contravention of this Regulation if any egg sold or described as being of a particular grade weighs not more than five parts per centum below the weight prescribed for such grade; provided that any twelve eggs supplied to any purchaser shall weigh not less than twelve times the minimum weight of the grade asked for or described by placard.

4. Sub-clause (2) of Regulation 40 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1930 is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "six and one-third" from the sixth line thereof and the substitution therefor of the word "seven."

5. Regulation 49 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1930 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

49. ICE-CREAM, FLAVOURED ICES AND FLAVOURED ICE-BLOCKS.

Ice-cream.

(1) Ice-cream is a preparation of milk or cream or milk products and sugar with or without eggs juice or pulp of fruit nuts candied fruits liqueurs spirits wine flavouring essence or permitted colouring sterilized by boiling or pasteurised by being kept at a temperature of not less than 156° Fahrenheit for twenty minutes or of not less than 165° Fahrenheit for ten minutes and subsequently frozen, and shall contain not less than ten parts per centum of milk fat.

Flavoured Ices.

(2) Flavoured ices are preparations of wholesome foodstuffs with or without additions of fruit or vegetable substances flavouring or permitted colouring, sterilized by boiling or pasteurizing by being kept at a temperature of not less than 150° Fahrenheit for twenty minutes, or of not less than 160° Fahrenheit for ten minutes, and subsequently frozen.

Flavoured Ice-blocks.

(3) (a) Flavoured ice-blocks are frozen preparations of fruit squash or fruit squash cordial or fruit juice or concentrated fruit juice or fruit juice cordial with or without addition of water.

(b) "Flavoured ice-block" includes fruit juice block, fruit juice cube, ice fruit block, fruit juice cube, juicy fruit block, frozen fruit juice or any other expression which indicates infers or implies that the substance to which the expression is applied is a frozen preparation of fruit juice.

Permitted Additions.

(4) (a) The addition to ice-cream and flavoured ices of flavouring derived from fruit and/or colouring is hereby permitted without declaration.

(b) Ice-cream and flavoured ices may contain gelatine in proportion not exceeding one part per centum.

(c) Flavoured ice-blocks may contain pectin or agar in proportion not exceeding one-fourth of one part per centum.

Labelling.

(5) Every package of ice-cream or flavoured ice containing any synthetic or artificial flavouring shall bear a label in which shall be written the name of the flavour together with the word IMITATION.

6. Immediately following Regulation 59 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1930, the following Regulation is hereby inserted:—

59A. Pectin or agar may be added to fruit squash cordial, fruit juice, concentrated fruit juice and fruit juice cordial provided that where pectin or agar is added there shall be included in the label in prominent and legible characters in letters of not less than six points the words—

Contains added Pectin (or Agar).

Specially prepared for the making of flavoured ice-blocks.

7. Sub-clause (3) of Regulation 71 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1930 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

(2) Malt ale or malt beer, ale, beer, porter or stout shall not contain more than two grains of free sulphur dioxide per gallon or more than five grains of total sulphur dioxide per gallon.

And the Honorable Sir Stanley Seymour Argyle, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE QUARRY RESERVE IN THE
PARISH OF MOOROOLBARK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 18th May, 1880, as a site for a Quarry in the Parish of Mooroolbark.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, fencing, shire properties, or water supplies, nor remove any materials that will cause damage.
3. Fires shall not be lighted in the open between the dates from 30th November to the 31st of the following March for any purpose in connexion with any work that is needed.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve, and shall have full power incidental to that status within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to such Committee of Management of such fees as the said Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, and gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Commit-

tee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.

10. The Committee of Management may from time to time and at any time arrange with the Country Roads Board for the supply and removal of stone from the Reserve for the maintenance and construction of roads within the shire on such terms and conditions as it may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

11. This Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Lillydale as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

SEA LAKE RECREATION RESERVE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF
THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF
SEA LAKE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and rescind Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the balance of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 3rd May, 1898, 7th October, 1913, and 19th October, 1925, as a site for Public Recreation in the Township of Sea Lake, known as "Central Park," hereinafter referred to as "The Reserve"; and doth hereby rescind Regulations made on 27th August, 1914, in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 3rd May, 1898, aforesaid.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the written consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or in any other way damage any of the fences, buildings, gates, or other property in or around the Reserve, nor leave or roll stones therein or pollute any water in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any sand, soil, or manure.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or throw any stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.
8. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the Reserve, nor hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without having first obtained the written permission of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall light any fires in the reserve without the special permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any description within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. The Committee of Management may at any time and from time to time set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sport, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and the reservation, the use of the grounds so set apart.

15. There shall be paid to the Committee of Management, or to any caretaker appointed by such Committee to receive the same, a fee not exceeding One shilling upon each occasion for the use of the tennis courts or tennis pavilion, the croquet green or pavilion, the bowling green or pavilion, or any other sporting improvement in the Reserve, but the Committee of Management may, as a term of the arrangement with any club, remit this fee in the case of the fully paid up members of such club.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act

1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- (g) Providing, with respect to buildings thereafter erected for—
 - (i) Regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
 - (ii) Means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fire in buildings;
 - (iii) The ventilation and lighting of buildings;
 - (iv) The minimum size of any dwelling rooms.
- (h) Regulating or prohibiting the keeping or storage of anything, in the opinion of the Council, injurious to health or dangerous;
- (i) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council; and
