The charge to manufacturers, and for water supplied by meter separate from house connexions, for gardens, nurseries, and cricket clubs, bowling greens, or places of a similar nature, shall be One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons, provided that not less than 40,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge is to be One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons.

- 6. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stone, or plastering, or, should the Trust require a meter to be put on, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons.
- 7. For a garden licence, issued to occupiers of tenements rated at £20 or under per annum, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable on 1st January, 1932.
- 8. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

GENERAL BY-LAW No. 34.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Water Act 1926, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

- (a) In respect of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any standpipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be only one-half, and, where such tenement or land is over one-quarter of a mile from such standpipe and within half a mile thereof, be only one-fourth of the amount which would be payable if such land or tenement were supplied with water from service pipes.
- (b) For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Twelvepence per 1,000 gallons.
- (c) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be-taken or used.
- (d) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per amount for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such eases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (c) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special rate.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE KNOWN AS "RUSSELL SQUARE," IN THE TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST, NOW CITY OF BALLAARAT.

NOW CITY OF BALLARAAT.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the Land Act 1928 it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes, mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 182 Land Act 1928: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Ballaarat and to their successors in respect of a Public Park in the Town of Ballaarat East (now included in the City of Ballaarat), and known as "Russell Square": Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve for Public Park in the City of Ballaarat known as "Russell Square":—

Regulations.

# REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be at all times open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

  4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

  5. No person shall not in the Reserve any cettle barren.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. The Trustees shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.

- 7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fetes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Trustees may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Trustees in their absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees.
