VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RESPECTING THE REGISTRATION OF FISHING BOATS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the eighth day of April, 1913, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the sixteenth day of April, 1913, respecting the registration of fishing boats, by adding to such Proclamation the following paragraph:—

"5. When two boats are engaged or employed by a licensed fisherman at the same time in the one fishing operation, the smaller boat shall be deemed to be a "tender" to the larger boat. One fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall cover the registration of both boats when used in such circumstances. The "tender" shall have

the letters—^T_{R.F.B.} followed by the registration number of the larger boat painted on both bows in the manner prescribed by paragraph 4 of this Proclamation."

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW NO. 36, FOR MAKING AND LEVYING RATES.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

- (a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement: Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20, and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (e) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1933, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1933, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1933, at the office of the Water Commissioners at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates and valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in the Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic, as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Tenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such persons as the Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Betting Tax (Shooting Contests) Act 1932* in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say) :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Betting Tax (Shooting Contests) Regulations 1932.
2. The Authority required by the *Betting Tax (Shooting Contests) Act 1932* to be obtained by any bookmaker before betting on any day on a sports ground with any person or persons during the holding on such sports ground of a shooting contest shall be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto, and shall be issued at the Office of the Comptroller of Stamps at the Chief Office for Stamp Duties, Melbourne, in accordance with requisitions for that purpose made by persons requiring the same.
3. Such requisitions shall be prepared in duplicate in the form of Form "A" contained in the Schedule to the Betting Tax Regulations 1932, and shall be submitted to the said Comptroller, who shall thereupon issue the said Authority duly impressed with stamps representing the appropriate amount of stamp duty.
4. No such stamps shall be so impressed unless the value thereof is paid in advance; cheques other than bankers' cheques will not be accepted in payment of such value.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-widths of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purposes to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbour or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the Council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbour or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin:

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the eighteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.

ALTERATION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (19 Geo. V., No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation, and the good government and management of all public wharfs: And that any such Regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby repeal Regulation No. 57 for ports in Victoria, having reference to bathing of horses at St. Kilda, which Regulation was made by Proclamation dated 19th February, 1918, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 27th February, 1918, page 1077, and do substitute the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

"57. Bathing of horses is prohibited in that portion of the sea adjacent to the foreshore extending from an imaginary line being the continuation seawards of the centre line of Fraser-street, St. Kilda, south-easterly to an imaginary line being the continuation seawards of the centre line of Head-street, St.

Kilda, except in that section of the sea lying between the south-eastern side of the dinghy pier, or the imaginary line being the extension thereof, and the imaginary line being the continuation seawards of the north-western side of Dickens-street where, on days other than Sundays and public holidays, bathing of horses is permitted before the hour of Nine o'clock a.m.

Any horse must be taken into or from the sea only by way of the area lying between the line of the south-eastern side of the dinghy pier and a line parallel to this line, and distant 50 feet south-easterly therefrom.

After any horse has been taken into the sea for a distance of 200 feet from high-water mark, such horse may be bathed in the section of the sea described above, that is to say, between the line of the south-eastern side of the dinghy pier and the extension seawards of the north-western side of Dickens-street, but must not be allowed to approach within 200 feet of high-water mark on any part of the foreshore except when being taken from the sea by way of the area prescribed for such purpose.

The person in charge of any horse shall be responsible for the removal and disposal of all manure left by such horse above low-water mark."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE AT BEECHWORTH KNOWN AS "WALLACE PARK."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in Trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 10th April, 1922, as a site for Public Recreation purposes in the Town of Beechworth, and known as "Wallace Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 24 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set aside for bowling or tennis matches, sports, entertainments, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 2s. (Two shillings) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve.
2. The Committee of Management may allow any club, person, or association to hold or conduct entertainments, musical performances, bowling matches, tennis tournaments, sports, pastimes, or other gatherings of a like nature in the Reserve, provided, however, that such club, person, or association shall during its hire or occupancy of the Reserve be subject to any direction made or given by the Committee of Management.
3. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games or sports, and from time to time grant to any club, person, or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.
4. No person shall damage in any way the turf, bowling greens, or tennis courts within the Reserve.
5. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing grounds during the progress of any match, tournament, game, or sports, nor walk on the bowling green at any time unless a member of the club or a visitor entitled to play thereon by permission of the Committee of Management, and then only when wearing rubber-soled footwear without heels.
6. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, ferns, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills, or cut names on fences, seats, trees, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish of any kind therein.
9. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals.
10. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law in force for the time being relating to the impounding of cattle; for the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
11. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or booth or any other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. Persons renting or hiring any enclosure or building on the occasion of any sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding (£5) Five pounds by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such building or enclosure; and the Committee of Management, in its absolute discretion, may make good any loss, damage, or injury sustained by such building or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good any such loss, damage, or injury from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any Order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of any young trees or shrubs.

14. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission or of membership of any of the clubs playing tennis or bowls in the Reserve, or any part thereof, with the consent of the Committee of Management:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being in an intoxicated condition.
- (c) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (d) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting language.
- (e) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (f) Willfully interfering with or disturbing any entertainment, performance, game, amusement, or tournament to the annoyance, detriment, or discomfort of any person or persons engaged in such entertainment, performance, game, amusement, or tournament.

The Council of the Shire of Beechworth has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law; and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES IN THE PARISHES OF NEPEAN AND FINGAL KNOWN AS "OCEAN PARK," SORRENTO (INCLUDING "LONDON BRIDGE" SITE).

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and to rescind Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in Trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon; Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Reserve in the Parishes of Nepean and Fingal, known as "Ocean Park," Sorrento, and the areas permanently reserved for Public Park and Recreation purposes in the Parish of Nepean by Orders in Council 18.7.1924 and 13.5.1932 (including "London Bridge" site) hereafter called the "Reserve," and doth also hereby rescind Regulations made on 15th October, 1915; and 16th September, 1930, in respect of the Reserve known as "Ocean Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations the word Reserve shall embrace the portion of the beach abutting thereon to low-water mark, and the word "committee" shall mean the members for the time being of the Committee of Management of such Reserve.

2. No person shall disturb the soil within the Reserve in any manner or for any purpose, or erect any bathing box, tent, pavilion, building, fence, wall, bridge, or other structure without the previous consent, in writing, of the Committee. Such

consent may be issued subject to such orders, terms, fees, and conditions as are deemed desirable by the Committee, which shall have the power to collect and receive all tolls, entrance fees, or other charges in connexion with the Reserve.

3. No person shall bathe from the shore of the Reserve unless attired in a proper bathing trunk or bathing dress, or such other costumes as shall be necessary to preserve public decency.

4. No person shall kindle or maintain any fire within the Reserve without leave of the officer appointed by the Committee, and then only in such place as he shall indicate; and no person shall cut or in any way injure or interfere with the timber, trees, shrubs, flowers, wells, or birds, or with any vegetation, or break or damage the rocks in the caves and arches, or the thatchings in the banks, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve.

5. No person shall climb, walk, or jump or get upon or over the thatched banks or any of the fences or gates of the Reserve, or cut, carve, break, or in any way remove, injure, or damage any such fences or gates, or any of the seats, buildings, bowers, posts, fences, gates, pavilions, rooms, or other erections therein, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any of such fences, gates, seats, or buildings, or roll or throw stones or missiles, or leave any bottles, glass, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish in the Reserve.

6. No person shall hawk, or sell, or offer for sale in the Reserve anything of any description without the previous written permission of the Committee.

7. No person shall ride or drive any horses, bicycle, tricycle, or vehicle of any description upon the footpaths in the Reserve, and no vehicle plying for hire shall be allowed to proceed beyond the upper turntable without permission of the Ranger.

8. No person shall behave in the Reserve in a disorderly or noisy manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

9. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, pigs or poultry.

10. No person shall drive any vehicle in the Reserve at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour.

11. No person shall be allowed to park a motor car, cab, or other vehicle in the Reserve without payment of parking fee, and then only on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic. The fee to be charged shall be 1s. per day per vehicle, or 3s. per week.

12. No person shall ply for hire in the Reserve with motor cars, cabs, or other vehicles without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained; and then only on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic. The fees to be charged for admission to the portions of the Reserve specially provided for wheeled traffic of motor cars, cabs, or other vehicles plying for hire shall be as follows:—

For every motor car licensed to carry six passengers or under, £1 per annum.

For every motor car licensed to carry seven passengers or over, £1 10s. per annum.

For every cab and other vehicle carrying ten passengers or under, £1 per annum.

For every cab and other vehicle carrying more than ten persons and under sixteen persons, £1 5s. per annum.

For every cab and other vehicle carrying sixteen passengers or over, £1 10s. per annum.

13. No person shall, unless he is entitled to ply for hire in the Reserve, enter in or upon the Reserve with any vehicle licensed to carry passengers or for hire.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any Member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or Member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

2. No person for the purposes of selling or offering for sale or exposing for sale of flowers, fruit, vegetables, fish, flesh food, ice cream, or any other foodstuff shall occupy any fixed stand in or upon any street, road, or public place within the said borough.

2. No person, having obtained the consent as per clause 1 hereof, shall carry on the business of a hawk or itinerant trader dealing in flowers or foodstuffs in any street, road, or public place except between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. on Fridays, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays from the 1st May to the 30th November, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. on Saturdays, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Wednesdays from the 1st December to the 30th April.

4. No child as defined by the *Shop and Factories Act 1928* shall be employed as a street hawk or itinerant trader, nor permitted to manuege or occupy a stand in any street, road, or public place within the Borough of Queenscliffe.

5. Any person who by any wilful act or default contrary thereto shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, for every first offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
