THE MEDICAL ACT 1928, PART II, AND THE DENTAL
BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATION.

WHEREAS under section 54 of the *Medical Act 1928*, the Dental Board of Victoria may from time to time, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make, alter, and repeal regulations specifying what certificates, diplomas, memberships, degrees, licences, letters, testimonials, or other titles, status, or documents granted in a British possession other than Great Britain and Ireland, or granted in a foreign country, will be recognized by the said Board as qualifying persons holding them or any of them to be registered under this Part as dentists: Now therefore the Dental Board doth, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulation:—

The Board shall recognize the following degrees and diploma as qualifying the persons holding them or any of them to be registered under this Part of this Act as dentists, viz.:—

The degree of Bachelor of Dental Science of the University of Melbourne, Victoria.

The degree of Doctor of Dental Science of the University of Melbourne, Victoria.

The degree of Bachelor of Dental Surgery of the University of Sydney, New South Wales.

The degree of Doctor of Dental Science of the University of Sydney, New South Wales.

The degree of Bachelor of Dental Surgery of the University of Adelaide, South Australia.

The degree of Doctor of Dental Science of the University of Adelaide, South Australia.

The degree of Bachelor in Dental Surgery of the University of New Zealand.

The diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria.

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

AWARD No. 30.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *Railways Act 1928* (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

(1) The rates of salaries and wages to be paid to officers and employees during the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one shall be as set forth hereunder:—

(a) Adult male employees (except Gatekeepers) shall be paid a basic wage of 13s. 8d. per day and in addition the margins prescribed therein in the schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, and 26, and in the schedule to this award.

(b) Adult officers shall be paid a basic salary of £214 per annum and in addition the margins prescribed in the schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, and 26, and in the schedule to this award.

(c) During the period from 1st January to 14th February, inclusive, adult Male Gatekeepers shall be paid a rate 1s. per day less than the basic wage.

(d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therein in the schedule to this award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

(e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed therefor in the schedule to this award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

(2) (a) On and from the first day of the first pay period commencing in the months of February, May, August, and November, the basic wage or the basic salary payable to adult male employees and/or officers shall be based on the Commonwealth Statistician's weighted average purchasing power of money index number (food, groceries, and house rent) for Melbourne, Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool for the then preceding quarter ending 31st December, 1930, 31st March, 30th June, and 30th September, 1931, respectively. The basic wage and/or basic salary so payable shall be the monetary figure (which includes the Powers 6d. per day) assigned to the numerical division within which such index number falls in the table prescribed in sub-clause (a) of clause 2 of Award No. 26 of the 29th December, 1930.

(b) The rates prescribed for casual employees, junior employees, and female employees are based on an adult male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day, and those prescribed for junior officers are based on an adult male basic salary of £226 per annum, and the said rates shall, on the same dates, be increased or decreased in the following manner:—

(i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.

(ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, and of junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest penny or the nearest pound (as the case may be):

Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage.

(3) Any increase prescribed by this award or as a result of the quarterly cost of living adjustments shall not entitle any officer to a salary exceeding £500 per annum.

(4) If in any period during the currency of this award the Commissioners are bound to pay to any grade referred to herein the rate provided in respect of such grade in any other award or in any agreement, undertaking, or Act binding upon the Commissioners, then the rate prescribed herein shall not apply during such period, but there shall be payable in lieu thereof a rate not less than that provided in such other award or in such agreement, undertaking, or Act.

(5) During the period from 1st January to 14th February, inclusive, the provisions of clause 5 of Award No. 26 of the 29th December, 1930, shall apply to the rates of salaries and wages payable to officers and employees, having regard to the margins prescribed by this award and to any deduction already made under the provisions of such clause.

(6) As from 15th February and until otherwise determined—

(a) The adult male basic wage and the adult male basic salary payable under the provisions of this award shall be subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent.

(b) The margins over the basic salary or basic wage payable to officers and employees shall be those prescribed in the schedules of rates applicable on 3rd October, 1930, subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent., including any deduction already made under the provision of Award No. 28 of 24th April, 1931.

(c) The rates of salary or wage payable to junior officers, junior employees, and female employees, and the rates payable to employees paid at hourly rates, shall be those prescribed in the schedules of rates applicable on 3rd October, 1930, adjusted from time to time in accordance with the cost of living adjustment then in force, subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent.

(d) Adult male gatekeepers, with free quarters, shall be paid a rate 7d. per day below the basic wage.

(e) Any adult male officer or employee shall be remunerated at a rate not lower than the basic salary or basic wage, subject to an emergency deduction of 10 per cent.

(7) The amount of the emergency deduction made under the provisions of the foregoing clause shall be calculated to the nearest pound or the nearest penny (as the case may be).

AWARD. No. 31.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *Railways Act 1928* (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

For the clauses indicated in the undermentioned divisions of award No. 8, of 7th June, 1923, viz.:—

Division 1.—Preliminary.—“Suburban Area.”

Division 13.—Relieving Expenses.—Clauses 1, 2, and 3.

Division 14.—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.—Clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, 13, and 14.

Division 15.—Transfer Expenses, &c.—Clause 1.

Division 17.—Youths Living away from Home.—Clauses 1 and 2—

there shall be substituted the following clauses:—

DIVISION 1.—PRELIMINARY.

“Suburban area” shall be deemed to include the lines from Melbourne to Ashburton, Croydon, Broadmeadows, Glenwaverley, East Kew, Campbellfield North, Flemington Racecourse, Fitzroy, Eltham, Kew, Frankston, Dandenong, Port Melbourne Pier, Thomastown, Sandringham, St. Kilda, St. Albans, Altona, Williamstown Racecourse, Williamstown Pier, Newport to Sunshine, Albion to Broadmeadows, and the tramway tracks from St. Kilda to Brighton Beach inclusive, and from Sandringham to Beaumaris inclusive.

DIVISION 13.—RELIEVING EXPENSES.

Country.

(1) Country relieving expenses shall be as follows, viz.:—

Officers whose rate of salary is £300 per annum (disregarding any emergency deduction) or over—36s. 6d. per week;

Officers whose rate of salary is less than £300 per annum (disregarding any emergency deduction), and all employees—33s. per week;

and shall be paid to any officer or employee on the regular relieving staff when engaged on relieving duty outside the suburban area.

Suburban.

(2) (a) Suburban relieving expenses at the rate of 2s. per day shall be paid to—

Any officer or employee on the regular relieving staff, when engaged on relieving duty in the suburban area;

Any signalman or block recorder engaged on regular relieving duty in the Melbourne yard;

Provided that any officer or employee in receipt of suburban relieving expenses who is obliged to remain away from home overnight and incur expenses shall in addition be granted expenses on the basis of the travelling scale, subject to a maximum of 4s. 6d.

(b) Any officer or employee on the regular relieving staff whose head-quarters are outside the suburban area shall, when engaged on relieving duty in the suburban area, be granted country relieving expenses.

(c) Any officer or employee performing relieving duty inside and outside the suburban area on the one day (calculated from midnight to midnight) shall be paid the suburban relieving allowance if he be for the greater portion of the day in the suburban area, and country relieving expenses if he be the greater (or an equal) portion of the day outside the suburban area.

General.

(3) No single officer or employee engaged for a period in excess of one month on relieving duty, and no married officer or employee engaged for a period in excess of two months on relieving duty—

(a) at any one place; or

(b) at different places between North Melbourne and Richmond inclusive (excluding any signalman or block recorder on regular relieving duty in the Melbourne yards),

shall be allowed any expenses in respect of the period after the one month in the case of the single officer or employee, and after two months in the case of the married officer or employee, except with the sanction of the Commissioners.

DIVISION 14.—TRAVELLING AND INCIDENTAL EXPENSES.

(1) The following shall be the scale of travelling and incidental expenses, viz.:—

Officers whose rate of salary is £300 per annum (disregarding any emergency deduction) or over, and special inquiry officers and special ticket checkers (country)—10s. 4d. per day (i.e., 2s. 6d. for each meal and 2s. 10d. for each bed) for the first seven days at the same place; 6s. per day thereafter;

Officers whose rate of salary is less than £300 per annum (excluding any emergency deduction), and all employees (except special inquiry officers and special ticket checkers (country))—8s. 6d. per day (i.e., 2s. for each meal and 2s. 6d. for each bed) for the first seven days at the same place; 4s. 9d. per day thereafter;

and, except as hereinafter provided, such scale expenses shall be granted to—

(a) any officer or employee whose head-quarters are within the suburban area, and who is required to travel on duty away from his head-quarters to a place outside of the suburban area and distant at least ten (10) miles from his head-quarters; or

(b) any officer or employee whose head-quarters are outside of the suburban area, and who is required to travel on duty away from his head-quarters, to a place distant more than ten (10) miles from his head-quarters.

(2) For the purposes of this Division, the first seven days at the same place shall not be deemed to include the day of departure from head-quarters unless a full day's expenses are payable for such day.

(3) Subject to the provisions of clauses 4 and 11 of this Division, no allowance for breakfast, dinner, or tea, as the case may be, shall be granted to any officer or employee unless he commence travelling from his head-quarters earlier than the time specified in the second column hereunder, and/or does not return until after the time specified in the third column hereunder:—

Payment Allowed for—	If Departure be before—	If Return be after—
Breakfast	7.0 a.m.	8.0 a.m.
Dinner	12.30 p.m.	1.30 p.m.
Tea	6.0 p.m.	7.0 p.m.

(4) Subject to the provisions of clause 11 of this Division, no allowance shall be payable to any officer or employee for being absent from his head-quarters when he leaves and returns on the same day, provided that any officer or employee who is required to leave before 7 a.m. shall be granted an allowance for breakfast, and that any officer or employee who is unable to return until after 7 p.m. shall be granted an allowance for tea.

(13) The travelling scale allowance for meals shall be granted to any head office clerk for each day whilst engaged away from his head-quarters in paying the staff or checking pay-rolls, provided that any such clerk is required to commence duty by at least 7 a.m.

(14) Camping allowance—

(a) Any employee “camped out” and provided with sleeping accommodation by the Department for at least three (3) days either in a continuous period or in any one working week shall be granted a “camping” allowance of 2s. if he be married and 1s. if he be single in respect of each day on which he is “camped out.”

Any such employee whose duties necessitate his absence from the place where he is “camped out” shall be treated on the basis prescribed in respect of the “trip” allowance as if such place were his head-quarters.

(b) Any employee provided with sleeping accommodation by the Department and obliged to “camp out,” but otherwise not coming within the provisions of (a), shall be treated on the basis prescribed in respect of the “trip” allowance.

DIVISION 15.—TRANSFER EXPENSES, ETC.

(1) Any officer or employee shall, when transferred, be granted—

(a) a free pass for himself and his wife and family (if any) and any relatives solely dependent upon him for support; and

(b) free transport by rail of his household effects and any other effects which may be sanctioned by the Commissioners.

DIVISION 17.—YOUTHS LIVING AWAY FROM HOME.

(1) Any junior clerk in receipt of a salary of less than £86 per annum who, in the opinion of the Commissioners, is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a board and lodging allowance on the basis of the difference between his annual salary and £86 per annum.

(2) Any lad or apprentice in receipt of a wage of less than 5s. 6d. per day who, in the opinion of the Commissioners, is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a daily board and lodging allowance for six (6) days per week equivalent to the difference between his daily wage and 5s. 6d. per day.

(5) For making and levying such rates, the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

(6) Such person or persons as the Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by section 36 of the *Unemployment Relief Amendment Act 1931*, it is provided that the Governor in Council may make Regulations with respect to any matters therein referred to: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

(1) In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Act" means the *Unemployment Relief Amendment Act 1931* (No. 4000).

"Board" means the Charities Board of Victoria.

"Society or association" includes any unemployment relief committee approved in writing by the Charities Board of Victoria under sub-section (6) of section 7 of the *Unemployment Relief Act 1930* (No. 3866).

(2) The licence referred to in Part IV. of the Act shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the First Schedule hereto.

(3) Where the Minister grants any application for a licence referred to him by the Board under the provisions of section 30 of the Act, the said Board shall thereupon issue a licence as aforesaid to the applicant.

(4) Any licence issued to a society or association shall be conspicuously displayed at the administrative office of the society or association and shall be returned to the Board forthwith on the expiration thereof, or on demand in writing of the Secretary to the Board.

(5) Any licence issued to a person not being a member of the committee or other governing body of a society or association which is the holder of a licence shall:—

(a) on demand by any person from whom a collection is sought be presented for his inspection;

(b) on the expiration thereof or on demand in writing of the Secretary to the Board (as the case may be) be returned to the Board.

(6) Any written authority issued by a person or a society or association which is the holder of a licence shall:—

(a) on demand by any person from whom a collection is sought be presented for his inspection;

(b) on the expiration thereof or on demand in writing (as the case may be) be returned to such person or to such society or association.

(7) Any society, association, or person infringing or omitting to comply with the requirements of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each breach of such Regulations.

THE LAND ACT 1928.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the undermentioned reserved lands:—

- (a) The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 30th August, 1880, as a site for Recreation and Convenience of the People at Queenscliff, the two portions of which are known as "Princess Park" and "Citizens Park."
- (b) Such portion of the reserved Crown lands in the Parish of Paywit, at Queenscliff, as is indicated by red tint on plan marked Q.9.12.1931 with Lands Department Correspondence Ra.2587, and known as "Queenscliff Foreshore," but exclusive of any current permissive occupancies areas.

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction of these Rules and Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

The "Reserve" shall mean the Reserves hereinbefore specified, and each of them, or any part or parts thereof.

The "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

The "Committee" shall mean the Council of the Borough of Queenscliff or other the Committee of Management for the time being of the Reserve appointed pursuant to the above Act.

"Unauthorized person" shall mean any person other than a person for the time being duly authorized in writing by the Committee or the Board, or an officer of or a person or servant of a person employed by the Committee or the Board in or about any work in connexion with laying out, planting, improving, or maintaining the Reserve.

2. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.

3. No unauthorized person shall do any of the following acts, matters, or things on the Reserve:—

- (1) On any day on which the Reserve may be open to the public, enter the Reserve before the time hereinbefore appointed for the opening thereof, or enter the Reserve and remain therein after the time hereinbefore appointed for the closing thereof.
- (2) *Injuring Trees or Flowers.*—Cut, pluck, injure, or destroy the whole or any part of any tree, bush, or flower growing therein.
- (3) *Cutting Turf, &c.*—Dig, cut, or remove any sod, turf, loam, sand, gravel, or other substance thereon or therefrom.
- (4) *Causing Fire.*—Light any fire, or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being thereon.
- (5) *Leaving Rubbish.*—Deposit or leave thereon, or on any part thereof, any rubbish, bricks, manure, timber, or other substance or material whatsoever.
- (6) *Drying.*—Bleach or place out to dry any article or thing.
- (7) *Carpet Beating.*—Beat, shake, sweep, brush, or cleanse any carpet, rug, or mat, or any other fabric retaining dust or dirt.
- (8) *Interference with Birds or Game.*—Catch or trap any bird, or lay or place any trap for the taking of birds, or take birds' eggs or nest, or shoot or chase or disturb any game or other animal.
- (9) *Allowing Animals to Stray.*—Cause or suffer any horse, pony, mule, ass, bull, ox, cow, calf, heifer, steer, lamb, sheep, goat, hog, or sow belonging to him or in his charge to enter or go thereupon.
- (10) *Making Erection or Obstruction.*—Encamp thereon, or erect or place thereon any booth, tent, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing, chair, or seat (other than a camp stool or other portable seat), or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or make any enclosure of any part thereof.
- (11) *Defacing Notices, &c.*—Injure, deface, or remove any seat, notice, or notice board, post, chair, fence, railing, barrier, tree-guard, or other thing which may be from time to time erected or placed thereon by or by the authority of the Committee or Board.

(12) *Bill Posting.*—Post or paint any bill, placard, or notice thereon, or on any fence, erection, or tree thereon.

(13) *Carving Names, &c.*—Paint, write, carve, cut, or in any manner inscribe letters, figures, or marks upon, or otherwise disfigure any rock or tree, or any wall, fence, or other structure or erection in the Reserve.

(14) *Reasts of Draught or Burden not to be Brought into Ground.*—Ride, drive, or bring, or cause or suffer to be ridden, driven, or brought into the Reserve any beast of draught or burden.

(15) *Prohibition of Vehicles, except Perambulators and Wheeled Chairs.*—Drive or wheel, or cause or suffer to be driven or wheeled into the Reserve any barrow, truck, or machine, or any vehicle other than a wheeled chair drawn or propelled by hand, or a perambulator or a chaise drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the conveyance of a child or children or an invalid: Provided that this and the preceding rule shall not be deemed to prohibit the riding or driving of any horse, pony, ass, or mule, or the driving or wheeling of any bicycle, tricycle, or any similar machine or of any other vehicle in any part of the Reserve which is for the time being appointed or intended or adapted to be used as a horse ride, bicycle track, or carriage road, subject to such conditions as the Council may from time to time prescribe, and may be indicated by notice or notices affixed or set up in a conspicuous place at or near the several entrances to the Reserve.

(16) *Brawling, &c.*—Brawl, fight, use indecent language, or act in an indecent, disorderly, or offensive manner, or exhibit any indecent or infamous book, picture, or representation to the obstruction, annoyance, or danger of any person resorting to the Reserve.

(17) *Firearms.*—Fire or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any missile.

(18) *Climbing.*—Climb any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or any tree, or any barrier, railing, or post in the Reserve, or be on any wall, roof, or parapet of any building or erection therein.

(19) *Selling, &c., without Licence.*—Sell or let or ply for hire with any article, animal, and/or cart or distribute any bill or like thing, or place any chair or seat for hire.

(20) *Collection of Money.*—Solicit or gather money or other thing.

(21) *Wading or Bathing—Pollution of Water—Fishing—Disturbing Fowl.*—Bathe, wade, or wash, or wash clothes or other articles in any lake, pond, stream, or other ornamental water in the Reserve, or foul or pollute any such water, or take, injure, or destroy, or wilfully disturb any fish in such water, or wilfully disturb or worry or ill-treat any fowl in any such water or elsewhere in the Reserve.

(22) *Dogs.*—Cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person, and from worrying or disturbing any beast, and from entering any ornamental water, and from injuring or destroying, worrying, or disturbing any fowl in the Reserve.

(23) *Smoking and Nuisances.*—Smoke tobacco or any like substance in any building in the Reserve where, by a notice or notices affixed or set up in some conspicuous position, the Committee may prohibit smoking in such building, nor commit any acts of indecency, behave in an offensive manner, or commit any nuisance in any sanitary convenience.

(24) No person shall use the sanitary conveniences, or any part of such conveniences, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portion of such conveniences as are specially constructed for such purpose; and no person shall unrobe or robe in such conveniences for the purposes of sea bathing.

(25) *Betting.*—Frequent or use the Reserve for the purposes of betting or wagering, or of agreeing to make any bet or wager.

(26) *Playing Games.*—Play, practise, or engage in any game or sport on Sunday or Anzac Day, except as hereinafter provided, play or take part in any game of football, quoits, hockey, cricket, or any other game which by reason of the rules or manner of playing, or for the prevention of damage, danger, or discomfort to any person in the Reserve may necessi-

tate at any time during the continuance of the game the exclusive use by the player or players of any space in the Reserve: Provided that where, by a notice or notices which shall be affixed or set up in some conspicuous position in the Reserve, and at or near to each of the principal entrances thereto, the Committee may from time to time set apart for the playing of any such game or games as may be specified in such notice or notices, this rule shall not be taken to prohibit any person from playing or taking part in any game or games which may be played in such space or spaces and in accordance with the following Regulations:—

(i) *Interference with other Players.*—Every person resorting to any such space for the purpose of playing or taking part in any such game shall, in making preparation for the playing of such game, and in the manner of playing, use reasonable and proper care to prevent undue interference with the reasonable and proper use of such space by any other person engaged in making preparation for playing or in playing therein, or thereafter resorting to such space for the purpose of making preparation for playing or of playing therein.

(ii) *Overcrowding Playground.*—A person resorting to any such space for the purposes of playing or taking part in any such game shall not begin to play at any time when such space has already been occupied by such a number of players and in such a manner as to render any addition to the number of players incompatible with the safe and convenient use of such space by players already in occupation.

(27) *Trample on Plant or Flower Beds.*—Walk or run over, or stand, sit, or lie upon any part of any flower bed, or any shrub, underwood, gorse, furze, fern, or plant, or any ground in course of cultivation as a flower bed or for the reception or growth of any shrub, underwood, gorse, furze, fern, or plant.

(28) *Obstruction of Officers—Disturbance or Interruption.*—Obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or obstruct, disturb, or interrupt any officer of the Committee or the Board in the proper execution of his duty, or any person or servant of any person employed by the Committee or the Board in the proper execution of any work in connexion with laying out, planting, improvement, or maintenance of the Reserve.

(29) *General Clause.*—Do, aid in, or abet any act or thing which may not in these Regulations be specifically mentioned, and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the Reserve, or to interfere with the use thereof by the public for the purposes of exercise or recreation.

(30) *Broken Glass.*—Break up or destroy any glass or glass or stone bottles in the Reserve, deposit or leave any glass or any bottles in the waters on the foreshore.

4. *Acts Forbidden on Portions set apart for Games.*—Where, by a notice or notices which shall be conspicuously exhibited on the Reserve, the Committee shall from time to time set apart any portion of the Reserve for any game or athletic sport, or generally for the assemblage of persons for any lawful purpose, no person shall, on any portion of the Reserve so set apart as aforesaid—

(a) *Driving.*—Drive, ride, or pass over the ground with any vehicle or upon horseback.

(b) *Driving to Public Danger.*—Drive or ride among or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled for any of the purposes aforesaid.

(c) *Games.*—Take part in any such game or assemblage as aforesaid, except at such time and under such Regulations as are herein contained and such conditions as the Committee may from time to time prescribe as being reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

(d) *Obstruction of Games.*—Obstruct, interfere with, or annoy any person who is taking part or has made preparation to take part in or is lawfully present at any gathering for any of the purposes aforesaid.

(e) *Movable Erection.*—Place any chair, seat, hand-stand, or other movable erection on such portion of the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

(f) *Addresses any Disorderly Meeting.*—Deliver or take part in the delivery of any address whatsoever, or remain with any assemblage of persons after having been informed by a justice of the peace and an officer of the Committee or the Board that they anticipate

that the continuance of such an address or assemblage would lead to scenes of disorder, and having been requested by them to desist and to leave the assemblage.

(g) *Trespassing on Sports and Playgrounds, &c.*—Enter, be, or trespass upon any playground, tennis court, or any enclosed or roped-off running track during the progress of any game, match, sport, or amusement, or during the progress of any practise of any game, match, sport, or amusement therein, unless he be a player or competitor or an official connected with such game, match, sport, or amusement.

(h) *Sports and Recreation.*—Be entitled to play or take part in any organized game or sport, or practise thereat in any portion of the Reserve so set apart, except in the case of tennis on the tennis court specially laid down—(a) unless he be a member of the picnic or social organizations or clubs that have been granted permission in writing to play or practise, the case may be, by the Committee of Management; and/or (b) unless he can produce on demand a ticket of membership of such club, or a letter signed by the secretary of such club, certifying that he is a member.

5. *Use of Grounds set apart.*—The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the said Reserve, including any buildings, for the purposes of any lawful games, dancing, bands of music, sports, or any amusement, and from time to time grant any picnic or social organization, club, or association of clubs, the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as are deemed consistent always with these Regulations, and may further set aside any portion of the said Reserve, including any buildings erected thereon, for the purposes of unrobing and robing by open sea-water bathers consistent always with these Regulations, conditionally that the charge for the use thereof by each person for the dual act of unrobing and robing shall not exceed Three (3) pence.

6. *Improper Intrusion.*—A male person other than a boy under the age of seven (7) years shall not enter or use any playground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of females; and a female person shall not enter or use any playground, place, room, or building set apart for males.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for every offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
