REGULATIONS No. 2, made by the Architects Registration Board of Victoria, pursuant to and under the authority conferred by section 20 of the Architects Act 1928, for amending Regulations No. 1, made by the Architects Registration Board of Victoria, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 19th June, 1923, and gazetted on the 20th June, 1923, in the manner following, that is to say:—

(d) A second vacancy for nomination shall be filled in the following manner:—All the ballot-papers shall be re-arranged under the name of the respective candidates in accordance with the first preference indicated thereon, except that each ballot-paper on which a first preference for the elected candidate is indicated shall be placed in the parcel of the candidate next in order of the voter's preference. If a candidate then has an absolute majority of votes he shall be declared as nominated, but if no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall proceed as provided in the last preceding subclause until one candidate has received an absolute majority of votes, except that the candidate to be excluded shall be the candidate who has received the fewest of the votes counted to a candidate in pursuance of this sub-clause.

(e) "Continuing candidate" means a candidate not already declared nominated or excluded from the count, and an "absolute majority" means a greater number than one-half of the whole number of ballot-papers other than informal ballot-papers.

(f) If on a count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be

other than informal ballot-papers.

(f) If on a count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be excluded the returning officer shall decide which shall be excluded, and if on the final count for filling any vacancy two candidates have an equal number of votes the returning officer shall decide by his casting vote which candidate shall be nominated, but otherwise he shall not vote at the election, and the casting vote of the returning officer shall be included in reckoning an absolute majority of votes.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1932.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks of the provisions of the Water Act 1938:—

1. That the water rate for the year 1932 on all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Borough of Horsham for the year 1931-1932. with a minimum of One (1) pound upon all tenements valued at or under £20 (Twenty pounds) and upon which a building is created, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 237 of the above-mentioned Act.

2. All water supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Ninepence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), and for water supplied for railway purposes, which shall be at the rate of Ninepence per One thousand (1,000) gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount payable under the assessed rate as specified in clause 1 hereof.

4. All rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1932, at the office of the Trust, Wilsonstreet, Horsham, where payments will be received during office hours.

Such officers as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said charges.
