PROTECTION CERTIFICATE.

In the Court of Petty Sessions at Manangatang, in the Midland Bailiwick.—In the matter of an application by ALBERT WELLINGTON BUTTERWORTH, of Manangatang, for a Protection Certificate.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamations referred to in Schedule "A" hereunder respecting boats and nets on certain waters, and in lieu thereof prohibiting in respect of the waters described in Schedule "B" hereunder any person from doing any or all of the following things at any time throughout any year:—

Taking a boat with nets on board or attached thereto on to the said waters; permitting a net to remain on or attached to any boat on such waters; or allowing any boat with nets on board to be upon the said waters.
