IN honour of the birthday of His Majesty King George V., His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor (Sir William Irvine) will hold a Levée at Parliament House, Spring-street, Melbourne, at a quarter to One p.m. on Friday, the 3rd June, 1932.

Private entrée cards will admit recipients to the south door of the Spring-street entrance at Parliament House at half-past Twelve p.m. All others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at a quarter to One p.m.

In accordance with the custom followed at Levées held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the Service and all public bodies group themselves together as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so.

On the occasion of the celebration of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levée should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting their names in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

A By-law of the Borough of Wangaratta, regulating the use of streets within the Borough of Wangaratta by street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs or flowers, and prohibiting any such persons during particular hours from using certain streets or portions of streets within the said borough and numbered 34.

No person for the purpose of selling or offering or exposing for sale flowers, fruit, vegetables, fish, flesh food, or any other foodstuffs shall linger or loiter in or upon any of the streets within the said borough, but every such person using any of the said streets for any such purpose shall keep moving along such street, on the side situate on his left hand at a reasonable walking pace, and shall not use any such street more than once in the same hour.

2. No person for the purpose of selling or offering or exposing for sale flowers, fruit, vegetables, fish, flesh food, or any other foodstuffs shall occupy any fixed stand in or upon any of the streets within the said borough.

3. No person shall carry on the business of a hawker or itinerant trader dealing in foodstuffs or flowers between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday, and between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. on Friday in each week in or upon the undermentioned streets within such borough, namely—

Ford-street, Ely-street, Reid-street, Faithful-street, Chisholm-street, Murphy-street, Baker-street,

or in or upon the undermentioned portions of the undermentioned streets within such borough, namely—

Templeton-street, between Ovens and Baker streets.

Rowan-street, between Reid and Baker streets.

Docker-street, between Ford and Baker streets.

Ovens-street, between Ford-street and the Ovens River.

4. No child (as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*) shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader, nor be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any street, road, or public place within the said Borough of Wangaratta.

5. Any person who by wilful act or default contrary thereto shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction for every first offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
