## CHILDREN'S WELFARE ACT 1928.

## SOUTH CHANNEL.—PORT PHILLIP.

(Alterations to Demarcation.)

**Note.**—All bearings are true, and all depths are in reference to low water datum.

## INTENDED REMOVAL OF THE PORTSEA LIGHT BUOY.

**W**ITH respect to the South Channel, mariners and others are hereby notified that, consequent on the construction of the pile light on Nicholson Knoll—details of which were given in Notice to Mariners No. 2 of 1932, dated 3rd March, and on the increased depths to 33 feet brought about by dredging the shoal waters eastward therefrom to the line of leading lights, the Portsea light buoy, moored 077 deg. 3,000 feet from this pile light, will, on or about the 15th June, 1932, be removed.

*Directions.—Navigation of Deep-draught Vessels.*

(a) Inwards.—Mariners having entered the Heads should steer to pass about 1,000 feet northward of the pile light on Nicholson Knoll, gradually bringing it into line with the Point Lonsdale lighthouse, and proceeding with the two in line astern on a 098 deg. course until the line of leading lights is reached in the vicinity of No. 4 buoy, when proceeding through the channel as directed.

(b) Outwards.—Mariners bound for sea may leave the South Channel leading line about half a mile seaward of No. 4 buoy and proceed for 2 miles on a 278 deg. course with the pile light on Nicholson Knoll in line with Point Lonsdale lighthouse ahead until about 1 mile from this pile structure, when port, gradually passing about 1,000 feet to the north, and proceed to the heads as directed.

**Caution.**—Vessels whose draught necessitates the use of the South Channel should not, owing to shoal water, pass nearer than 1 cable northward nor 2 cables southward of the pile light on Nicholson Knoll.

## SOUTH CHANNEL DREDGED CUT.

*Intended Establishment of an Additional Light Buoy.*

On or about the 15th June, 1932, No. 11 black can buoy will be replaced by a spherical light-buoy with a framework structure 13 feet high, painted black and numbered 11, showing an occulting white light every three seconds, thus:—

Light,  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec.; eclipse, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  sec.

## No. 1 BLACK BUOY (CAGE), SOUTH CHANNEL.

*Alteration of Position.*

This buoy is now placed on the southern end of the shoal bank in 28 feet water,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  cables S.E. from its former moorage. The buoy is clear 970 feet northward from the leading line in a position bearing 052 deg. 4,600 feet from the pile light on Nicholson Knoll, and at 135 deg. 9,110 feet from No. 2 beacon on Pope's Eye Annulus.

## WEST CHANNEL.—PORT PHILLIP.

*Rear Light of Leading Line.—Alteration of Position.*

Referring to Notice to Mariners No. 7 of 1930, dated 16th June, mariners and others are hereby notified that, on or about the 15th June, 1932, the light at present shown from the timbered ridges of the southern shore will be shown 743 feet further back on the present leading line.

**Position.**—In a conspicuous cutting on the hilltop, 3,903 feet back from the high-water mark 204 deg. 23 min. 16,740 feet from the front line on Pope's Eye bank in latitude 38 deg. 19 min. 06 sec. S. longitude 144 deg. 40 min. 44 sec. E., per departmental geodesy.

**Elevation.**—157 feet about high water.**Structure.**—Red and black brick structure, 14 feet high.**Visibility.**—Twenty (20) miles.

Other characteristics will remain unaltered.

**Name of Light.**—This light is to be known henceforth as the Monash light.

## QUEENSLIFF PIER HEADLIGHTS.

On and after 1st June next, the pier headlights on the new and old jetties will be changed from fixed green to flashing green and fixed red to flashing red respectively.

In each case the light period will be 3 seconds, followed by an eclipse of 2 seconds.

**I**T is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation varying the Proclamations made the seventeenth day of April, 1924, and the eighth day of June, 1927, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of April, 1924, and fifteenth day of June, 1927, respectively, regarding prohibition of fishing in certain waters, by deleting from such Proclamations all reference to the Lang Lang River, and in lieu thereof prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters for the periods mentioned:—

1. From the Lang Lang River and its tributaries between the Yannathan Butter Factory bridge and the mouth of such river.—From 1st May to 31st August in each year, both days inclusive.

2. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries (except O'Mahony's and Pheasant Creeks) above or upstream from the Yannathan Butter Factory bridge, including what is known as the Lang Lang straight cut.—From 1st May to 15th December in each year, both days inclusive.

## WICKER AND BABY CARRIAGE BOARD.

## VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order dated the seventeenth day of November, 1931, appointed the Wicker and Baby Carriage Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) Manufacturing—
- (i) baby carriages, or dolls' carriages, or parts thereof;
  - (ii) reed tex, hy-tex, or similar materials;
  - (iii) any goods made of wicker, bamboo, cane, reed tex, hy-tex, or similar materials.
- (b) Assembling or putting together any parts of baby carriages or dolls' carriages.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), doth hereby vary the said Order so that in substitution for the powers conferred thereby the said Wicker and Baby Carriage Board shall be given power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) Manufacturing—
- (i) baby carriages, or dolls' carriages, or parts thereof (other than wheels);
  - (ii) reed tex, hy-tex, or similar materials;
  - (iii) any goods made of wicker, bamboo, cane, reed tex, hy-tex, or similar materials.
- (b) Assembling or putting together any parts of baby carriages or dolls' carriages.

## REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BARWON HEADS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon petitions signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlers) keeping shops within the locality of each particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for fancy goods' shops, grocers' shops, and tobacconists' shops in the Township of Barwon Heads within the Shire of South Barwon, to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until the hour of Nine o'clock.

## BOROUGH OF PORT FAIRY.

## By-Law No. 12.

A By-law of the Borough of Port Fairy, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 12, for or with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes or appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
  - (1) for the granting or renewal of a licence;
  - (2) for the transfer of a licence;
- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Borough of Port Fairy order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

"Council" shall mean the Council of the Borough of Port Fairy.

"Licence" shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

"Licensee" shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

"Municipality" shall mean the municipality of the Borough of Port Fairy.

"Petrol Pump" shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

"Portable petrol pump" shall mean a portable pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footway, and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

"Regulations" shall mean the regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump to be placed in, on or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the Borough of Port Fairy, used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule of this By-law. Every licence shall be in the form of the Second Schedule of this By-law.

3. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force or effect.

(a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump, other than a portable pump, in or on any footway a licence fee of One pound one shilling per annum.

(b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purposes of selling or supplying motor spirit, a licence fee of One pound one shilling per annum.

(c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee is based on the number of months unexpired may be made by the Council.

4. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

5. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire, the Council may, upon application being made to it, in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

6. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

7. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made, is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

8. No licence shall be transferred, save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application in writing to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence in writing signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay the Council a transfer fee of ten shillings.

9. Immediately on the approval of the Council of any transfer of licence being given, the policy of insurance hereinafter referred to taken out by the transferee, shall be transferred to the transferee or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

10. Every licence under the provisions of this By-law shall before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself and thereafter at all times during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof, keep himself insured in some insurance company to be approved by the Council against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump in the sum of £500 at the least. The insurance policy any every receipt for the annual premium in respect thereof shall forthwith on the issue thereof respectively be lodged with the Council and retained by it.

11. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

12. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired, and has not been renewed, or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* shall, within seven days after such expiry or cancellation, remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in, on, or under the footway.

13. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Port Fairy.

15. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, to maintain in as safe and efficient condition and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law, all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on and under footways, for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.
