Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE PLUMBERS BOARD.

Notes.—(1) This Determination, on the 17th June, 1932, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) Plumbing and Gasfitting were proclaimed on the 10th October, 1928, as Apprenticeship Trades under the Apprenticeship Act 1928 for the Metropolitan District.

Full particulars of the Apprenticeship Regulations for these trades may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, 61 Spring-street, Melbourne (price 3d.).

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

(a) employed either inside or outside a factory or workroom in the process, trade, or business of a plumber or gasfitter;
 (b) wheresoever employed in any plumbing work (including electrical or gas fittings) in connexion with the erection or repairing of buildings."

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 17th June, 1932, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
