HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of section 39 of the *Theatres Act 1928*, doth hereby amend the Regulations made on the 22nd day of March, 1933, as follows, that is to say:—

For Regulation 20 substitute the following:—

Advertisements for Approved Films.

20. Except as these Regulations otherwise specially provide, every advertisement—

- (1) In any case where the Censor approves a film for general exhibition shall contain a statement in the following words, namely:—“For General Exhibition.”
- (2) In any case where the Censor approves a film as, in his opinion, suitable only for exhibition before adult persons, shall, if such statement is required by these Regulations to be enclosed by a circle, contain a statement in the following words, namely:—“Not Suitable for General Exhibition.” or, where the use of a circle is not required as aforesaid, “Approved by the Censor as Not Suitable for General Exhibition.”
- (3) In any case where the Censor approves a film subject to such conditions as he imposes, shall contain a

statement setting out substantially such conditions in such form as is approved in writing by the Under-Secretary.

- (4) Where in the case of any advertisement having an area of not more than one hundred and fifty (150) square inches and the space available for that purpose does not permit of the inclusion of a triangle or circle (as the case may be) in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 21 hereof, the appropriate statement may be published in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto in bold letters not smaller than “6-point black” type immediately adjacent to the title of the film as appearing in such advertisement.

The decision of the Minister or of the person authorized by him to hear any appeal pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the principal Act shall for the purposes of this and the next succeeding regulation be regarded as the decision of the Censor.

For Regulation 21 substitute the following:—

Statements to be Clearly Visible and Enclosed by a Triangle or Circle.

21. Every such statement shall be clearly visible, and, except as these Regulations otherwise specially provide, shall be placed immediately adjacent to the title of the film as appearing in any advertisement, and be in block capitals of the appropriate size prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and—

- (a) where a film has been approved by the Censor for general exhibition shall be enclosed by a triangle;
- (b) where a film has been approved by the Censor as in his opinion suitable only for exhibition before adult persons shall be enclosed by a circle.

Provided that in the case of a group of advertisements relating to more than one theatre and having a total area of not more than one hundred (100) square inches, it shall be optional to publish a statement in the words and type prescribed in paragraph (4) of Regulation 20 hereof at the foot of such group by way of explanation of a symbol appearing in such advertisements opposite the title of each film.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS AND PLANTATION AT BAYLES.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 20th June, 1932, as a site for Public Gardens and Plantation in the Parish of Valloek at Bayles:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the native or other trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, trees, gates, fences, seats, or tennis courts in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any paper, glass, straw, manure, or any rubbish, nor throw stones or missiles of any kind to the danger of any person.

5. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve, excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose.

6. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle, horses, or sheep trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a cord or chain, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall dig or remove any sand, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.

11. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

12. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or disturb any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

13. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

14. No male person other than a boy under the age of seven (7) years shall enter or use any playground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any playground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of males.

15. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any trees, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES AT POINT LONSDALE KNOWN AS "STONEMAN RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portion of the Reserve for Public Purposes in the Borough of Queenscliffe, Parish of Paywit, as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked P.L. 15,9,32 with Lands Department, Correspondence C.81033, hereinafter referred to as the Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset daily, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on "The Reserve."
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or any other vegetation on "The Reserve," nor light fires, therein, nor burn any materials thereon.
4. No person shall climb or jump over any fences on, in, or upon or around "The Reserve," nor climb or be upon any of the walls or roof of any building or enclosure therein, stick bills or posters thereon, or cut names on or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy any said fence, seats, trees, buildings, or other improvements, or upon any rock or cliff therein.
5. No person shall put in or upon "The Reserve" any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, nor ride or drive any other horses or vehicles therein, without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.
6. No person shall camp in "The Reserve," nor erect therein any tent, building, or any booth or any other structure for any purposes whatsoever, nor offer for sale or for hire therein any article without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained, and such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand production thereof.
7. The owner of any horses, cattle, or other animals which are found wandering on any part of "The Reserve" shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations, and, in addition, such horses, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.
8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed on "The Reserve," shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plants, shrubs, or grass.
9. No person shall erect or place any bathing-box or boat-house on "The Reserve" without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and fees as may be deemed by the said Committee of Management to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
10. No person shall use or cause to be used any bathing-box or boat-house for residential purposes.
11. No person shall erect or place any bathing-box or boat-house on "The Reserve" unless such is erected, built, or constructed in accordance with plans and specifications, in respect of which the approval of the Committee of Management has previously been obtained.
12. Every person bathing from "The Reserve" shall be decently attired from neck to knee in a two-piece Canadian costume or a one-piece skirted costume or a one-piece costume with "V." The definition of "neck to knee" to read 2 inches below the pit of the neck to 4 inches above the knee.
13. No person shall bring into "The Reserve" or use any diving stand made of iron or any other metal or metals.
14. No person shall moor and/or use any boat on "The Reserve" without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
15. No cricket or football games or matches, sports, shows, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be held on "The Reserve" without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
16. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone or any hard substance or missile on "The Reserve," and no person shall play cricket, hockey, golf, or any similar game with a hard or solid ball or football on any portion of "The Reserve" where not specially set aside for such a purpose.
17. No assemblies for fêtes, concerts, public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place on "The Reserve" without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.
18. No person shall preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.
19. No person shall play or practise cricket, or any other game or engage in any organized sport in "The Reserve" on Sundays or on Anzac Day.
20. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to "The Reserve" on such days, not exceeding five in any one year, as "The Reserve" may be set apart for cricket or football games or matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—
For the admission of every adult person to "The Reserve," such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding Two shillings (2s.).
For the admission of any person or persons for the purposes of erecting tents, &c., and camping thereon, a sum not exceeding Three shillings (3s.) per day or night, or by the week the sum of Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each camping area as defined on the ground, excepting upon such days as "The Reserve" may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, and other amusements as hereinbefore prescribed.
21. No person shall play or perform in any band of music or take part in any entertainment of any kind without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.
22. No person shall use any sanitary convenience, bathers' dressing enclosures, or other buildings for any other purpose than that for which it was intended by the Committee of Management.
23. All persons using the conveniences, bathers' dressing enclosures, or sheds, buildings, or other facilities provided by the Committee of Management on "The Reserve" shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be deemed by such said Committee to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
24. No person shall discharge firearms in "The Reserve" nor commit any nuisance therein.
25. No person or persons shall deposit or cause to be deposited any waste paper, bottles, or any other litter in any part of "The Reserve," except in the receptacles provided for that purpose, nor deposit or cause to be deposited any dying or dead animal or fish of any kind within "The Reserve."
26. No person shall break any glass or bottles of any kind on "The Reserve," nor place any glass or bottles in the waters on "The Reserve," nor leave anything thereon which may injure any person.
27. No person shall bring into "The Reserve" any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain without the permission of the Committee of Management.
28. No male person other than a boy under the age of seven (7) years shall enter or use any playground, oval, place, room, or building, including sanitary conveniences set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any playground, oval, place, room, or building, including sanitary conveniences, set apart for use of males.
29. No person other than the players and officials connected with any game or sport shall intrude upon any area set apart by the Committee of Management for games or sports during the progress of such games or sports.
30. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

The Council of the Borough of Queenscliffe has been appointed a Committee of Management with full power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC BOTANICAL GARDENS AT BEECHWORTH.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the section specified. And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Council of the Municipal District of Beechworth and to their successors in respect of the Reserve in the Parish of Beechworth for Public Botanical Gardens. Now therefore the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Beechworth do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve for Public Botanical Gardens in lieu of all previous Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year, the days set aside to include twenty (20) days from sunrise to midnight for the purpose of holding night entertainments) as the Reserve may be set aside for sports, amusements, pictures, or croquet matches, on any of which occasions such sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.), may be charged and taken for the admittance of each adult person to the Reserve.
2. The Trustees may allow any club, association, or person to hold or conduct entertainments, musical performances, pastimes or other gatherings of a like nature in the Reserve, and to charge for admission thereto. Provided, however, that such club, association, or person shall during its or his hire or occupancy of the Reserve be subject to any direction made or given by the Trustees.
3. The Trustees may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purposes of any lawful game or sports and from time to time grant any club, association, or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Trustees may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of grounds so set apart.
4. No person shall damage in any way the turf or croquet lawn within the Reserve.
5. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during the progress of a match or game, nor walk on the croquet lawn at any time unless he be a member of the club or a person entitled to use same, with the consent of the Trustees.
6. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
8. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills, or cut names on fences, seats, or trees, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, trees, or shrubs in the Reserve, nor leave any glass, paper, or rubbish of any kind therein.
9. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
10. The Trustees shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupiers of the Reserve (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law in force for the time being relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
11. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or booth, or any other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

12. Persons renting or hiring any enclosure or building on the occasion of any sports, entertainment, holiday amusement, or moving pictures may be required to deposit any sum which the Trustees may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of a guarantee that due care shall be taken of such building or enclosure; and the Trustees in their absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such building or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good any such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees.

13. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of any young trees or shrubs.

14. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission or of membership of any of the clubs playing croquet in the Reserve or any part thereof, with the consent of the Trustees:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being in an intoxicated condition.
- (c) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (d) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting language.
- (e) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (f) Wilfully interfering with or disturbing any entertainment, performance, pictures, games, or amusements to the annoyance and detriment or discomfort of any person or persons engaged in such entertainment, performances, pictures, games, or amusements.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of such Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in a bank draft or bank cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. *Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, State or Commonwealth Treasury bonds or Government debentures, or references to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits.* Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days of acceptance of tenders to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either by bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Savings Bank deposit book, or bank deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, cash deposit, or Victorian or Commonwealth Government bonds or debentures, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within seven days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for Firewood at ————" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. Under these contracts firewood may be ordered by Commonwealth Government Departments and head teachers of State schools within the areas prescribed, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks and wattle, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be of the diameters as specified in the respective schedules. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.

4. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

5. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the Elizabeth-street (Melbourne) Post Office.

6. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width specified in the schedule, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord; and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply.

7. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery. If after the delivery of the firewood has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the firewood so rejected or returned.

8. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department concerned his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable where the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion as to the quality between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

10. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 4.

11. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or the officer authorized to accept delivery will have the power to reject such wood as is deemed of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must supply firewood of satisfactory quality and description in its stead, failing which supplies will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 4.

12. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 4. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 4 (BUTCHERS, COUNTRY).

NOTE.—(a) This Determination on the 16th June, 1933, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677)* and the Order in Council thereunder; such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorparryal and Peak Ridings of the Shire of Corio.

(b) On the 16th day of March, 1914, the power given to the Country Shop Assistants Board to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in or in connexion with a butcher's shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," was conferred exclusively on this Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677)*, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 16th June, 1933, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.—

Times of Beginning.	Times of Ending.
8 a.m.	1 p.m. on the day on which the half holiday is usually observed.
6 a.m.	6 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

Any of the above times may be varied by mutual consent, but in no case shall the total spread of hours be increased.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rate shall be paid for all work done :—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause 3 } Time and a half.
- (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause 3 in excess of 48 hours in any week }

- (5) MEAL INTERVALS.—(a) One hour shall be allowed for a meal between noon and 2 p.m.
- (b) Where an employee is required to commence duty before 7.30 a.m., one hour shall be allowed for breakfast.

(6) PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.—All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay :—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Anzac Day, and one Picnic Day in each year.

(7) ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted six days' holiday in each year on full pay.

(8) SICK LEAVE.—All employees necessarily absent on account of sickness shall be allowed six days' sick leave each year on full pay providing satisfactory evidence is produced to the management or employer within 24 hours of the usual hour for commencing work.

(9) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except in a case where an employee is inefficient or has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(10) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
