Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 4 (BUTCHERS, COUNTRY).

Note.—(a) This Determination on the 16th June, 1933, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder; such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warmambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorpanyal and Peak Ridings of the Shire of Corio.

(b) On the 16th day of March, 1914, the power given to the Country Shop Assistants Board to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in or in connexion with a butcher's shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," was conferred exclusively on this Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods," has made the following Determination, namely:---

(1) That on the 16th June, 1933, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (7) Annual Holidays.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted six days' holiday in each year on full pay.
- (8) Sight Leave.—All employees necessarily absent on account of sickness shall be allowed six days' sick leave each year on full pay providing satisfactory evidence is produced to the management or employer within 24 hours of the usual hour for commencing work.
- (9) Termination of Employment.—Except in a case where an employee is inefficient or has been guilty of a misdemeanout, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.
- (10) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

#### DETERMINATION OF THE CARTERS AND DRIVERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 17th June, 1933, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board which since the 18th June, 1929, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed—

(1) in carting or driving, or in accompanying a carter or driver, and assisting him in carting, driving, loading, unloading, or delivering in connexion with or incidental to some trade or business, but not including persons employed at such work in connexion with a trade which may be or is the subject of a determination of any of the following Boards, viz.:—

Bread Carters Board,

Chaffeutters Board,

Coal and Coke Board,

Quarry Board,

Shops Board, No. 3 (Butchers),

Shops Board, No. 4 (Butchers-Country),

Shops Board, No. 5 (Butchers-Provincial),

Shops Board. No. 7 (Country Shop Assistants),

Shops Board, No. 12 (Fuel and Fodder),

Shops Board, No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder-Country),

Shops Board, No. 15 (Grocers);

- (2) in or in connexion with any stable in which are stabled the horses used in his trade or business by any person subject to the Determination of the said Carters and Drivers Board;
- (3) in driving horse-drawn passenger vehicles hired or plying for hire;
- (4) in the business of a livery stable keeper or in a stable where cabs or cab horses are kept,

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 17th June, 1933, the Determination of the Court of Industrial Appeals, which came into force on the 8th January, 1932, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(3)</sup> WEEKLY WAGE.—All milk carters and milk carters' assistants (other than bulk milk carters and their assistants employed' outside the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928), shall, subject to the provisions of clause (4), be paid the weekly wage fixed in clause (2) for the class of work performed, irrespective of the number of hours worked.

<sup>(5)</sup> ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.—The number of hours (including time occupied in attending to horses, vehicles, motor vehicles, or cars) which shall constitute an ordinary week's work shall be as follows:—

<sup>(4)</sup> CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT FOR MILK CARTERS AND MILK CARTERS' ASSISTANTS (OTHER THAN BULK MILK CARTERS AND THEIR ASSISTANTS EMPLOYED OUTSIDE THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT AS DEFINED IN THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1928).—(a) Any employee to become entitled to payment of the weekly wage prescribed by this Determination is to be available, ready, and willing to perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the day and during the hours usually worked by that class of employee.

<sup>(</sup>b) One week's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement shall be determined. Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, carclessness in the performance of his duties, or, if after receiving one week's notice, he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

<sup>(</sup>c) An employee ready and willing to work for the whole week and not dismissed during the week for any reason set out in sub-clause (b) of this clause shall be entitled to a full week's wage.

<sup>(</sup>d) Should any employee be dismissed during the course of a week, any wages due to him under this Determination shall be paid to him forthwith.
