PROTECTION CERTIFICATE.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Order in Council of the 28th day of March, 1933, and published in the *Gazette* of the 5th April following, declaring certain State highways under the *Country Roads Act 1928*, by the deletion of the words "thence northerly and westerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 109A, Parish of Wharparilla," appearing in lines 28 and 29 on page 2 of the said Order.

ORDER APPROVING OF A NEW DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD
IN THE SHIRE OF OTWAY.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the new Roadknights Creek road in the Shire of Otway should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared maps plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said new road is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said new road: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said new road: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

A Young Farmers' Club Certificate shall be granted to candidates who carry out the theoretical and practical work as prescribed below:—

- (1) Attend all lectures and demonstrations at a Young Farmers' Club School of Instruction.
- (2) Submit a satisfactory thesis on some phase of Young Farmers' Club work, either (a) on its philosophical basis, or (b) on individual research.
- (3) Submit a written account of the activities of the club controlled by him covering a continuous period of two years.
- (4) Receive a report from an inspector of schools that the club has been satisfactorily controlled for two years.

NOTES.

(a) The securing of the Young Farmers' Club Certificate will be accepted as equivalent to passing in—

- (i) Inorganic Chemistry (Grade I.—theoretical and practical), or Geology (Grade I.), or any other subject in the Technical Schools course prescribed for classification in Honours under Regulation XI.K; or
- (ii) One University subject for classification in Honours.

(b) A more comprehensive thesis may be accepted as equivalent to passing the examination in education for classification in Honours (vide Regulation XI.K.—(A.3.b, B.3.c)).

(2) Persons who perform work in return therefor shall, on and from 3rd July, 1933, be granted sustenance in accordance with the following scale, but so that the total amount of the income received by a family unit and the value of the sustenance granted shall in no case exceed Two pounds seventeen shillings in any one week—

BY-LAW No. 73.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* and under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* to amend By-law No. 60 with respect to the fees prescribed for the granting and renewal of licences and to amend By-law No. 71 with respect to the prescribing of residential areas, erection of motor garages, sheds, and outbuildings, and erection of external walls.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* and the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon hereby order as follows:—

1. Clause 4, sub-clause (a) of By-law No. 60 of the said city shall be amended by deleting the figures "£5 5s." shown therein and substituting therefor the figures "£3 3s."

2. Schedule D of By-law No. 71 of the said city (page 52) shall be amended by deleting the words "North alignment of Keilor-road between Bulla-road and McCulloch-street to a depth of 150 feet and north alignment of Keilor-road from Birdwood-street to Hoffmans-road (so far as these areas are situate within the said municipal district)", and substituting therefor "North alignment of Keilor-road between Bulla-road and Hoffmans-road to a depth of 150 feet or to such lesser depth as may be situate within the boundaries of the said municipal district."

3. Part III. (outbuildings), clause 18, sub-clause (b) of By-law No. 71 of the said city shall be amended as follows:—

(a) after the word "and" in the third line of the said sub-clause (b) insert the word "or";

(b) delete the word "houses" in the fourth line of the said sub-clause (b) and substitute the word "house."

4. Part VII., clause 5, line 15 (page 26), of By-law No. 71 of the said city shall be amended by—

(a) deleting therefrom the figures and word "12 feet" and substituting the figures and word "20 feet."

5. Part X., clause 1, line 17 (page 35), shall be amended by deleting therefrom the figures and word "10 feet" and substituting the figures and word "20 feet."

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Essendon.

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

BY-LAW No. 34.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and all other powers thereto it enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden have, by Resolution of the Council of the said Shire, passed on the 7th day of April, 1933, and confirmed on the 5th day of May, 1933, duly made a By-law, to be numbered 34, of the Shire of Hampden, under sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and Parts I. and V. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act (in force in the said Shire by virtue of a By-law of the said Shire numbered thirty-three) for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said sections and parts, namely:—

(a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.

(b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.

(c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings, or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds thereof in re-imbursing the expenses of

pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

(d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of the officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

(e) Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

(f) Regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings, and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.

(g) Regulating the erection of tents.

(h) Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke vents, or stove pipes.

(i) Prescribing the minimum area, and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house, or any shop, or any dwelling-house and shop combined, may hereafter be erected.

(j) Providing that every dwelling-house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land.

(k) Providing with respect to buildings hereafter erected for—

(1) Regulating or limiting the height of buildings.

(2) Means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fire in buildings.

(3) The ventilation and lighting of buildings.

(4) Exits from and stairways in buildings other than private dwelling-houses.

(5) The minimum size of any dwelling rooms.

(6) The minimum area to be covered by any dwelling-house, or any dwelling-house and shop combined.

(l) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council.

(m) Regulating sewerage and drainage.

(n) Regulating lighting with gas or otherwise.

(o) Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district, and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases.

(p) Prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of any such residential area, the use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in this By-law.

(q) Requiring that vacant land within any area within the municipal district set forth in this By-law, and declared thereby to be a populous or residential area, shall be enclosed with a substantial fence constructed of such material and in such manner as is hereinafter prescribed by this By-law.

(r) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

(s) Deposit of building materials and excavations.

(t) Generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.
