NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE BAG LIMIT
FOR BLACKFISH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the thirty-first day of August, 1927, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the seventh day of September, 1927, respecting the "Bag Limit for Blackfish," and in lieu thereof providing that no person shall, during the open season for blackfish, take or have in his possession on or during any one day, more than ten (10) such fish, provided that such restriction shall not apply as regards blackfish in streams flowing north from the Great Dividing Range.

SHIRE OF RIPON WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1932-33.

THE Council of the Shire of Ripon, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1923*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Shire of Ripon Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twenty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October, 1932, and shall be payable on the 30th day of June, 1933, at the office of the said Council, Shire Offices, Beaufort.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

On every house, tenement, or public building being outside the boundaries of the Township of Beaufort, and which is supplied with water from the pipe line from Mount Cole to Beaufort, by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall such charge be less than the minimum sum of Sixty shillings. The Council shall let for hire water meters, the rental for which shall be at the rate of Seven shillings per annum for ½-in. meters. Such rental shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water.

Qualifying Examination and the Merit Certificate, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION IV.—PUPILS' CERTIFICATES.

A.—The Merit Certificate.

1. The Merit Certificate.—Merit Certificates shall be awarded in either of the following ways, as shall be determined by the Director:—

(a) The Merit Certificate shall be awarded to a candidate who has completed satisfactorily a course of study extending over not less than two years prescribed for Grades VII. and VIII. in elementary schools, or equivalent, and who is recommended by the head teacher of the school in which he is enrolled, provided that such recommendation is confirmed by an inspector of schools. Any year of the course of study prescribed for district high schools, higher elementary schools, central schools, central classes, junior technical schools, or schools of domestic arts, shall be deemed equivalent to one year's work in the elementary school.

(b) The Merit Certificate shall be awarded to a candidate who passes, under such conditions as may be prescribed by the Director, a satisfactory examination in the course of study for Grade VIII., or equivalent.

NOTE.—Every pupil of Grade VII. who has been not less than nine months in that grade shall be presented as a candidate for the Merit Certificate. In exceptional circumstances, the district inspector of schools may allow candidates who have been less than nine months in Grade VIII. to sit for the examination for the Merit Certificate.

2. The Merit Certificate shall be awarded to candidates from registered schools who pass a satisfactory examination in the following subjects:—English (including reading, poetry, spelling, writing, composition, grammar), elementary mathematics, history, geography, elementary science, drawing, and occupations, as prescribed for Grade VIII., or equivalent.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PORTIONS OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISHES OF MOORABBIN AND MORDIALLOC, KNOWN AS "MENTONE AND MORDIALLOC BEACH PARK."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, power is hereby given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations or to rescind any rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulation in respect of those portions of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parishes of Moorabbin and Mordialloc known as the "Mentone and Mordialloc Beach Park," hereinafter called the Park.

REGULATION.

No person without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management, shall:—

- (a) Cause or suffer any dog belonging to him, or in his charge, to enter or remain in the Park unless such dog be or continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee; or
- (b) Bring into the Park any dog for swimming or training after the hour of Ten a.m. on any day:

- (c) Any dog found in the Park except as provided in this Regulation shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the officers and/or servants of the Committee, and the owner, or any person having the custody of any dog so found, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation, and shall also make compensation for any damage done to the property of the Committee by such dog.

This Park has been placed under the control of the Council of the City of Mordialloc as a Committee of Management.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against this Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR BATHING PLACE AT KYNETON.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 30th March, 1874, as a site for Bathing Place in Township of Kyneton.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve and Swimming Pool shall be open to the public from daylight till dusk from 1st January to 30th April, and from 1st November to 31st December, in each year, under such conditions as may be fixed by the Committee of Management.
2. No person or persons suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the Swimming Pool.
3. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the Swimming Pool or in the immediate vicinity thereof.
4. No person shall use soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in the Swimming Pool may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.
5. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the Reserve.
6. No person shall, by writing or otherwise, deface the fencing or any property within the Reserve.
7. No person shall enter the Swimming Pool unless decently clothed in a suitable bathing costume.
8. Children shall not be permitted to enter the Swimming Pool except under adequate supervision.
9. Mixed bathing shall be permitted at all times during which the Swimming Pool is open.
10. No person shall bring any animal within the boundary fence of the Reserve unless the animal is tethered by a chain or cord.
11. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to 10.30 a.m., and during the other hours at such fees (not exceeding Threepence per adult, and One penny per child) as the Committee of Management may think fit, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, carnivals, matches, &c., on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
12. Camping in any part of the Reserve shall not be permitted.
13. Any person committing a nuisance on any portion of the Reserve shall render himself liable to prosecution.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Any person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by any such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

- (b) any matter liable to putrefaction, or to cause offensive smells, or
- (c) any other matter whatsoever which shall or may pollute any of the said rivers, creeks, or watercourses.

4. If there is discharged from any premises so as to flow or fall directly or indirectly into any of the said rivers, creeks, or watercourses—

- (a) any offensive solid or liquid matter, or
- (b) any matter liable to putrefaction, or to cause offensive smells, or

(c) any other matter whatsoever which shall or may pollute any of the said rivers, creeks, or water-courses, the occupier of such premises shall be liable to the penalty provided by clause 5 of this By-law.

5. Any person who is guilty of any violation of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

6. This By-law shall apply to all the said rivers, creeks, and watercourses and to each and every portion of each of the said rivers, creeks, and watercourses.
