NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE BAG LIMIT FOR BLACKFISH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the thirty-first day of August, 1927, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the seventh day of September, 1927, respecting the "Bag Limit for Blackfish," and in lieu thereof providing that no person shall, during the open season for blackfish, take or have in his possession on or during any one day, more than ten (10) such fish, provided that such restriction shall not apply as regards blackfish in streams flowing north from the Great Dividing Range.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE USE OF LONG LINES IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of July, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of July, 1930, regarding the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay, and prohibiting the use of long lines and the method of fishing known as "Long Lining" in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays) during the whole of each year, provided that in the waters west of an imaginary line running in a south-easterly direction from the mouth of Little River to Indented Head, near St. Leonards, the use of long lines for taking ling shall be permitted from the first day of April in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following, both days inclusive, subject to the following conditions:—

1. Raw beef shall be the only bait used.
2. Not more than 800 hooks shall be used at the same time by any one person.
3. The snoods to which the hooks are fastened shall be attached to the long line at intervals of not more than twelve feet.
4. Each hook used shall not exceed the size known as 3/0.

BY-LAW No. 2918.—RATE.—WATERWORKS DISTRICT OF THE LONDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1928, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 9th May, 1933, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of 10th May, 1933, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Lodon United Waterworks Trust, except within any Urban District thereof:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the offices of the Commission at Boort and Pyramid Hill, and at the office of the municipality of East Lodon at Serpentine—a rate of Eight pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Four pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

(3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Two pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1933, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1933, and shall be payable on the 14th day of July, 1933, at the office of the said Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made in accordance with the provisions of the Water Act, and adopted by the said Commission on the 12th day of June, 1933, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST (URBAN DISTRICT).

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1933.

THE Ballan Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1928, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Ballan Urban District:—

On such lands and tenements—a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Forty-five pounds. One shilling in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Forty-five pounds but not exceeding Seventy pounds, and Fivepence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Seventy pounds.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than One pound ten shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1933, and shall be payable in two instalments, the first instalment due and payable on the 1st day of April, and the second instalment on the 1st day of October, 1933, at the office of the said Trust.

Made under the "Public Authorities Marks Act 1930."

MELBOURNE and Metropolitan Board of Works (declared by Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of February 1931, page 674, to be an Authority for the purposes of the *Public Authorities Marks Act 1930* pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the said *Public Authorities Marks Act 1930* and by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1928* and the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928* and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-law that is to say—

1. The stamp or mark hereby prescribed and adopted by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter shortly referred to as "the Board") under the authority of the *Public Authorities Marks Act 1930* (hereinafter shortly referred to as "the said Act") shall be the letters M M B W (meaning Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works) for indicating that any articles materials or things referred to in the said Act and in this By-law are duly tested stamped marked or authorized by the Board.

2. The said stamp or mark shall be sealed stamped marked or impressed or be affixed by tag or label by the Board alone by its Officers duly authorized for the purpose upon the articles materials or things to which the said Act applies set forth in the Schedule hereto.

3. The articles materials or things set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be tested stamped marked or authorized by the Board before use.

4. None of the said articles materials or things enumerated in the Schedule shall be provided fixed or used for or in connexion with any works as defined by the said Act or for or in connexion with the use of the commodity or service supplied by any of such works unless the same are duly stamped or marked with the said stamp or mark of the Board.

5. The use of the said stamp or mark by any person other than a duly authorized Officer of the Board is prohibited.

6. The sale or supply by any person to any other person of any of the above-mentioned articles materials or things which—

(a) are stamped or marked otherwise than as hereby prescribed or

(b) are not duly tested stamped marked or authorized as hereby prescribed is hereby prohibited.

7. The fees for testing and for stamping or marking any such articles materials or things shall be those set opposite to the same respectively.

8. Any person guilty of any contravention of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50 in respect of any one such contravention provided however that nothing in this clause contained shall affect the liability of any such person to be prosecuted and punished under any other Act or at Common Law but he shall not be liable to be punished twice for the same offence.

RAILWAY CLASSIFICATION BOARD FEES REGULATION.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of July, 1933.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in the exercise of the powers conferred in that behalf by section 197 of the Railways Act 1928, make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

On and from the 15th February, 1931, the fees to be paid to an elected member of the Railways Classification Board who is an officer or employee in the Railway Service while the member is, in the judgment of the Commissioners, engaged in carrying out the duties of his office as a member, the amount of the salary or wages payable to him in respect of his office in the Railway Service, or a fee of One pound seven shillings per day, whichever is the greater.

- 3rd year—At the rate of 23s. per week.
- 4th year—At the rate of 31s. 2d. per week.
- 5th year—At the rate of 41s. 3d. per week.
- 6th year—At the rate of 56s. 10d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years:—

- 1st year—At the rate of 17s. 5d. per week.
- 2nd year—At the rate of 23s. per week.
- 3rd year—At the rate of 31s. 2d. per week.
- 4th year—At the rate of 41s. 3d. per week.
- 5th year—At the rate of 56s. 10d. per week.”

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or

owned by him and on the adjacent half-widths of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purposes to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbour or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the Council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbour or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin:

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the seventeenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

CARISBROOK PUBLIC PARK.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC RESERVE IN THE TOWN AND PARISH OF CARISBROOK, KNOWN AS THE "CARISBROOK PUBLIC PARK."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 3rd October, 1932, as site for Public Park, and of such portion of the Reserves along the Tullaroop Creek as are indicated by blue colour on plan C.2/12/32 with the Lands Department, Correspondence Rs.4255, all these areas being situated in the Town and Parish of Carisbrook, and known as "Carisbrook Public Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons shall be admitted to the Reserve free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the Reserve on any such days, not including sixteen in any one year, as the Committee of Management shall determine, shall be as follows:—For admission of each person to the Reserve during sports, fêtes, carnivals, or shows, such sum as the Committee of Management shall determine not exceeding Two shillings, provided always that the Committee of Management shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.
3. Every person paying for admission to the Reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
4. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
5. No person shall in any way damage the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.
6. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, bridges, crossings, fencing, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw any stones therein.
7. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the written permission of the Committee of Management, and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the Reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to the law. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.
8. No person shall erect any building in the Reserve, or any booth, or any other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without first obtaining the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

9. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased, or shall, or may be, in possession of a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, or making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing during sports.
- (d) Being found in any part of the Reserve, and not producing on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management, or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve, yet not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of fêtes, sports, carnivals, or shows may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

11. No persons except workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

12. No person coming direct from any dirty work shall enter the swimming hole before washing himself.

13. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the swimming hole.

14. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the swimming hole, or the immediate vicinity thereof.

15. No person shall use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the swimming hole may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

16. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the swimming hole.

17. No person shall enter the swimming hole unless decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume.

18. Children shall not be permitted to enter the swimming hole except under adequate supervision.

19. The swimming hole may be set apart at stated hours for the use of males, females, or children respectively. Mixed bathing may be permitted on such days, and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may at any time determine.

20. The swimming hole shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twelve in any one year, as the swimming hole may be set apart for carnivals, matches, &c., on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult thereto.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE HARD HILLS GRAVEL RESERVE AT GOWAR.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 24th October, 1932, as a Site for the Supply of Gravel, in the Parishes of Gowar and St. Arnaud.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones, or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such earth, stone, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half year.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Kara Kara with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE SHOW GROUNDS RESERVE
AT WANGARATA.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Reserve for Agricultural and Horticultural purposes for the use of the Ovens and Murray Agricultural and Horticultural Association, now known as the Wangaratta Agricultural and Pastoral Society, in the Municipal District of Wangaratta.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Offer any article of food or drink, or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve.
- (f) Climb, jump, get on or over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture, or fittings, gates, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve.
- (g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs, or plants, or pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve.
- (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse, or rubbish whatever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything therein that might injure any person.
- (i) Light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management.
- (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- (l) Spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- (m) Erect any building, tent, or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.
- (n) Bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee of Management.
- (o) Do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.

3. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee of Management may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.

5. The Committee of Management shall have power to hold agricultural or other shows, football, cricket, or other matches, sports, fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, or holiday amusements in the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.

6. The Committee of Management shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding football, cricket, or other matches, fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, or sports, or for playing football, cricket, lacrosse, hockey, or other athletic games, or for athletic training or other physical recreation subject to payment of such fees, and on

such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.

7. No club, association, or person shall hold, or take part in any organized entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport, or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized by the said Committee to play in the Reserve at such time.

9. No person except the Committee of Management or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.

10. No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such Committee, not exceeding Two shillings, in respect of any such car or cycle for the use of such parking area on such days only as a charge for admission is being made, as hereinafter provided for.

11. No person shall take, or put, or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve, any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or being the owner or having the possession, care, custody, control, or supervision thereof, shall suffer or allow such horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals to be in, or graze, or wander upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

12. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and, in addition, the Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes hereof, cattle shall mean "cattle" as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

13. All animals and all poultry entering the Reserve must be under proper control, and the owner of any animal or poultry that causes damage within the Reserve shall be responsible therefor.

14. No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be detached or unharnessed therefrom, or left without a person in charge thereof.

15. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management, or by any member of the Police Force, or by any bailiff of Crown lands.

16. No person except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

17. The maximum fee which may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for the purpose of agricultural or other shows, cricket, or football matches, fêtes, sports, carnivals, or holiday amusements shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

18. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall upon demand produce and, if required, surrender such ticket to any gate-keeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.

19. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any shows, cricket, or football matches, fêtes, sports carnivals, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit with the Committee of Management any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, which the Committee of Management may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may repair or make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of

money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

20. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee of Management, or by the club, association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being to keep order shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
