STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 3000.—RATES.—DINGEE URBAN DIVISION WITHIN THE DINGEE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1928, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Dingee Urban Division within the Dingee Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Forty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Ten shillings per year.

No person shall introduce into the State of Victoria from the State of New South Wales any cattle or swine unless all the requirements of these Regulations have been complied with and until a declaration in the form of Schedule A hereunder (which shall be produced at the time of such introduction) is made by the owner of such cattle or swine or by his agent duly authorized in that behalf.

HOMOEOPATHIC HOSPITAL, MELBOURNE.

The following by-laws have been made by the Committee of the Homoeopathic Hospital and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors specially convened for that purpose on Wednesday, 30th August, 1933.

INTRODUCTORY.

1. All By-Laws made prior to the date of making these By-Laws shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, save existing rights.

2. The following shall be the device of the Common Seal of the Hospital until the same shall be altered by the Committee from time to time.



3. The Common Seal of the Corporation shall be kept at the Hospital, in a box having two different locks: one key shall be kept by the Treasurer and the other by some officer appointed by the Committee for that purpose.

The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed instrument or writing, except by order of the Committee at a meeting at which five members at least are present at the time of making such order and for which meeting notice to make such order has been given. The affixing shall be witnessed by the President, Vice-President or Treasurer.

4. "Contributor" means:—

- (a) A person who pursuant to these by-laws shall be elected a life governor thereof on the ground that he has conferred a signal benefit on this Institution other than by contributing thereto or who pursuant to by-laws of the Institution was a life governor thereof at the commencement of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1928.
- (b) A person who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to this Institution at least twenty pounds in one donation or such less sum as entitles him pursuant to these by-laws to be elected a life member or life governor thereof;
- (c) A person who at any time within the twelve months next preceding the date of any meeting or election or any other date in respect of, which the question of his being a contributor arises has on his own behalf contributed to this Institution at least One pound in one donation or produces evidence to the committee that he has on his own behalf contributed to the Institution at least One pound in donations of a less amount.
- (d) A person nominated as a contributor by any corporation company or firm which at any time within the twelve months aforesaid has contributed to this Institution at least One pound in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation company or firm.

- (e) A person nominated as a contributor by any corporation company or firm which at any time has contributed at least Twenty pounds to the Institution in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation company or firm or such less sum as would pursuant to the by-laws of the Institution entitle any person contributing the same to be elected a life governor thereof.
- (f) A person nominated as a contributor by the employes of any corporation company firm or employer who at any time have contributed at least Twenty pounds to the Institution in one donation or who have at any time within the twelve months aforesaid contributed to the Institution at least One pound whether in one sum or in donations of a less amount; or
- (g) A person nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any Will who have allocated at least Twenty pounds to the Institution in one donation out of any moneys of the testator not specifically directed to be paid to the Institution under the Will.

Each contributor shall be entitled to one vote only (either personally or by attorney appointed under by-law No. 19) at all meetings of contributors.

"Committee" means the Committee of Management of the Institution which may be described as the Board of Management.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females unless the contrary is expressly provided.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

5. (a) A Life Governor shall be any person who is a Life Governor at the date of the coming into operation of these By-Laws or, being eligible under the Hospitals and Charities Act 1928 and under these By-Laws is elected a Life Governor by the Committee.
- (b) Every Life Governor upon election shall forthwith be enrolled as such in the books of the Hospital and shall be entitled to a Certificate stating that he has been so elected.
- (c) Every Life Governor shall be entitled to recommend two in-patients in every year while he shall remain a Life Governor.
- (d) Any Life Governor may resign by notice in writing sent by post in a prepaid letter or delivered to the Secretary.

HONORARY LIFE GOVERNORS.

6. (a) Any person who by Honorary services shall have in the opinion of the Committee conferred a material benefit on the Hospital by the collection of money or otherwise or who shall be nominated by any organisation or any association of persons which has in the opinion of the Committee conferred such a benefit on the Hospital may be elected an Honorary Life Governor at any meeting of the Committee.

Provided that no such organisation or association of persons shall be entitled to nominate more than three persons as Honorary Life Governors during the period of twelve months in any calendar year.

- (b) Every Honorary Life Governor upon election shall be forthwith enrolled as such in the books of the Hospital and shall be entitled to a Certificate stating that he has been so elected. He shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a Life Governor except those of voting at any General Meeting or at any election or of being elected to any office which can be filled only by a contributor.

- (c) Every Honorary Life Governor shall be entitled to recommend two in-patients in each year while he shall remain an Honorary Life Governor.

- (d) Any Life Governor may resign by notice in writing sent by post in a prepaid letter or delivered to the Secretary.

OBJECTS.

7. The objects of the Hospital are to afford gratuitous medical and surgical aid to sick persons in destitute circumstances, and to others upon such terms of payment as shall from time to time be determined by the Committee.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

8. There shall be a Committee consisting of (a) a President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Treasurer (who shall be contributors) elected annually; and (b) twelve contributors, four retiring by rotation each year, but who shall be eligible for re-election. The members of the Committee to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election.

9. (1) If any member of the Committee—

(a) dies;

(b) resigns by writing under his hand addressed to the Chairman of the Committee;

(c) becomes bankrupt or insolvent or compounds with his creditors or makes a deed of arrangement for the benefit of his creditors;

(d) ceases to be a contributor to such institution;

(e) is convicted of any treason felony or misdemeanour; or

(f) is without the permission of the Committee absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Committee,

his office shall thereupon become vacant.

- (2) In the event of any casual vacancy in the Committee the remaining members of the Committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution. Such contributor so appointed may continue to be a member of the Committee until immediately before the next annual meeting for the election of the Committee when he shall retire therefrom as one of those persons who are required to go out of office.

- (3) In the event of any vacancy in the office of President Vice-President or other elective officer (other than a vacancy caused by his retirement at the expiration of his term of office) the Committee may temporarily appoint to such office some person qualified to hold the same; and the person so appointed may continue in office until immediately before the next annual general meeting aforesaid.

10. (a) The Committee shall meet monthly at such times and places as the members shall from time to time appoint and four members present shall form a quorum.

(b) Special Meetings of the Committee may be held at the Hospital or some convenient place in Melbourne and may be convened on the requisition of the President one of the Vice-Presidents or Treasurer or any two members of the Committee; and notice shall be given of the business to be transacted at such meeting at which no other business shall be considered.

- (c) Should a quorum not be present within twenty minutes of the time appointed for holding any meeting of the Committee the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day and hour of the following week.

11. The Committee may from time to time appoint sub-committees to take charge of particular departments of the Hospital, and may appoint any members of the Honorary Staff although not members of the Committee to act on any such sub-committee. Two members of any sub-committee shall form a quorum.

12. The Committee shall direct the business of the Hospital shall provide all requisites for its use and shall appoint and discharge all officers and servants except the Honorary Auditors and shall also elect Life Governors and Honorary Life Governors.

13. The Committee may subject to these By-Laws and the provisions of The Hospitals and Charities Act 1928 by resolution at any meeting make alter or rescind Rules for the management and regulation of the Hospital in every department provided notice has been given to the members of the Committee prior to such meeting. No motion to rescind a resolution of the Committee shall be submitted to a meeting of the Committee within two months after such resolution has been passed.

14. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the Hospital or be concerned or participate in any-wise in any contract with the Committee or in the profit thereof or of any work to be done under the authority of the same shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such Committee provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership or association consisting of more than twenty persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership or association; but no member of the Committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the Committee in which he shall, directly or indirectly, have any pecuniary interest.

MEDICAL STAFF.

15. The Honorary Medical Staff shall consist of such legally qualified medical practitioners as the Committee may from time to time determine; they shall be elected by the Committee and shall retain office for such time as the Committee shall determine.

There shall also be a Resident Medical Staff consisting of legally qualified medical practitioners, who shall hold office for such term as the Committee shall determine.

16. Regulations defining the duties of the Medical Staff shall be made by the Committee and a copy of such Regulations shall be signed by every Medical Officer on his appointment. No member of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be absent from the Hospital for more than fourteen consecutive days without leave from the Committee.

17. The Committee at a special meeting called for the purpose may by a majority of two-thirds then present suspend or dismiss any members of the Honorary or Resident Medical Staff.

18. If any member of the Honorary or Resident Medical Staff shall be elected by the contributors as a member of the Committee he shall ipso facto cease to be a member of the Honorary or Resident Medical Staff. Provided, however that this by-law shall not apply to any person who may be a member of the Honorary Medical Staff and also a member of the Committee at the time these by-laws shall come into operation.

ABSENCE OF A CONTRIBUTOR.

19. Any contributor being absent from the State of Victoria may by power of attorney appoint some person to exercise all the privileges to which he would be entitled if personally present; but such power of attorney shall be deposited with the Committee for record at least seven days before the same can be used in the exercise of such privileges.

PATIENTS.

20. Any sick person may be admitted free as in-patient or as out-patient if the Medical Officer in charge shall consider that such person is likely to receive benefit by treatment in the Hospital and if he appear to the Committee to be a proper object of charity or on payment of such weekly sum as shall be fixed by the Committee. No person shall be admitted without examination. In any case of urgency the Superintendent shall have power to act for the Committee.

21. Whenever the applications for admission are more than can be accommodated in the Hospital those cases only will be admitted which in the opinion of the Committee upon the recommendation of one member of the Medical Staff are the most urgent.

22. No lunatic or person suffering from any contagious or incurable disease or chronic epilepsy or pregnant woman for purposes of confinement shall be deemed as proper case for admission.

ACCOUNTS.

23. The accounts for the Hospital shall close on the 30th June in each year, and a statement of receipts and expenditure shall be prepared and audited prior to the Annual Meeting.

24. All sums received on account of the Hospital shall be paid into such Bank as the Committee may from time to time appoint to one or other of the following accounts as the case may be, viz.:—

Homoeopathic Hospital Maintenance Fund,
Homoeopathic Hospital Building Fund,
Homoeopathic Hospital Endowment Fund,

and such other accounts as the Committee may determine.

25. All bequests to the Hospital shall, except as herein-after mentioned, and subject to any conditions under which such bequests are made, be paid to the Endowment Fund, and shall be invested in such manner as the Committee shall direct; the interest may be available for the maintenance of the Hospital provided that bequests under £100 and not subject to any conditions shall be credited to the Maintenance Account if and when so directed by the Government.

In addition to any other lawful investment the funds of the Hospital may be invested by depositing the same from time to time at interest for any fixed period in any Bank incorporated in England or the Commonwealth of Australia and carrying on business in the Commonwealth of Australia.

MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS.

26. The Annual Meeting of Contributors shall be held on some day between the 1st day of July and the 31st day of August in each year as may be determined by the Committee when the President Vice-Presidents Treasurer two Auditors and one-third of the Committee shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election and the Committee shall submit a General Report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with the Treasurers' Financial Statement for the past year duly audited and any other business to be transacted. If no quorum be present within half an hour of the time named the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day and hour of the following week. Should there not then be a quorum present, the retiring officers and members of the Committee shall continue in office till the next Annual Meeting.

All candidates for election shall be nominated in writing; such nomination together with nominee's written consent to act if elected to be delivered to the Secretary not less than seven days before the date of the Annual Meeting; and if more than the required number of candidates be nominated an election shall take place in accordance with the provisions of The Hospitals and Charities Act 1928 and any regulations for the time being made thereunder.

27. Special Meetings may be convened by the Committee or by requisition signed by ten contributors. No business other than that specified in the requisition shall be transacted. Such meeting shall be called by the Secretary within ten days from the time of depositing the requisition with him at the Hospital; and in the event of any neglect or refusal to call the meeting within the aforesaid ten days then the President one of the Vice-Presidents or any ten contributors shall have the power to convene such meeting.

28. All meetings of contributors shall be convened by advertisement setting forth the business to be transacted thereat inserted twice at least in some daily paper published in Melbourne; the first of such advertisements shall be inserted not less than seven or more than fourteen days before the time appointed for holding such meeting. Ten contributors shall form a quorum at all meetings of contributors.

29. At all meetings of contributors or of the Committee the President or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents or in their absence the Treasurer shall take the Chair but in the absence of all these officers the meeting shall choose its own Chairman. In the event of equality of votes the President or Chairman for the time being shall have an additional or casting vote. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy. All questions (except the election of members of the Committee or other elective officers) shall be decided by show of hands, but any two contributors present in person or by attorney may demand a poll which shall be immediately taken in such manner as may be directed by the Chairman and the result as declared by the Chairman shall be final and conclusive. In case of equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote. Notwithstanding anything in this by-law contained the Committee shall have power to appoint any person, whether a contributor or not, to act as Chairman at any Annual Meeting of contributors.

BY-LAWS OF THE COLAC DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

INTRODUCTORY.

1. All By-laws in force prior to the date of the coming into force of these By-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

These By-laws shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*.

DEFINITIONS.

2. In these By-laws the word "contributor" shall have the same meaning as in the Act.

The words "the Act" shall mean the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1928* or any amendment thereto, and Regulations made by the Governor in Council under these Acts.

The word "Hospital" shall mean "The Colac District Hospital."

OBJECTS.

3. The objects of the Hospital shall be—

- (a) To afford relief, including maintenance and the treatment or cure of, or attention to, any disease or ailment, or any injury consequent on any accident, medical and surgical attendance, medicine, nursing assistance, support or aid of any kind or in any form to such persons as are entitled thereto under the Act.
- (b) To provide for carrying out investigation into all ailments, diseases, injuries, or other matters affecting the human body.

SEAL.

4. The common seal of the corporation shall be safely kept under lock and key by the Secretary in his office at the Hospital, and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the Committee at a meeting at which seven members at least are present at the time of making the order.

CONSTITUTION.

5. The incorporated institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and the members of the Committee hereinafter referred to, Honorary Treasurer, Governors, and contributors.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

6. A Life Governor shall be any person who is a Life Governor at the date of the coming into operation of these By-laws, or who, being eligible under the By-laws, is elected a Life Governor by the Committee.

Any person may be elected a Life Governor—

- (a) who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the Hospital other than by contributing thereto;
- (b) who at any time on his own behalf contributed to the funds of the Hospital a sum of not less than £20 in one donation;

(c) who is nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company, or firm which has at any time contributed to the Hospital a sum of not less than £20 in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation or firm;

(d) who is nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company, or firm or employer who at any time have contributed a sum of not less than £20 in one donation;

(e) who is nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any will who at any time have allocated a sum of not less than £20 to the Hospital out of any money of the testator not directed to be paid to the Hospital under the will.

Provided that such contribution as aforesaid has been made without any right of relief having accrued or accruing in respect thereof to any person, corporation, company, firm, executor, or trustee making the same, or to any person nominated in respect of the same.

Every Life Governor upon election shall forthwith be enrolled as such in the books of the institution, and shall be entitled to a certificate stating that he has been so enrolled.

7. No person shall hold or be eligible for any honorary office (except those of honorary medical officer or honorary dentist), nor have any vote, nor exercise any privilege connected with the institution, unless his subscription shall have been paid at least seven clear days previously.

MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS.

8. All annual meetings of contributors shall be advertised by the Secretary at least fourteen days and all special meetings at least seven days before the day on which such meeting is to be held, in a newspaper circulating in Colac.

9. The annual general meeting of contributors shall be held on such day, between the first day of July and the thirty-first day of August in each year, as shall be fixed by the Committee, for the following purposes:—

- (a) To confirm the minutes of the previous annual meeting and special meetings, if any, no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.
- (b) To receive the report of the Committee and audited accounts of receipts and expenditure for the year to the 30th June preceding.
- (c) For the election of President, two Vice-Presidents, Honorary Treasurer, and Auditors for the ensuing year.
- (d) For the election of members of the Committee for the ensuing year in place of those retiring.
- (e) For the transaction of any business of which seven days' notice has been given.

10. If required by the Committee, or upon the requisition, in writing, of six members thereof, or of ten or more contributors, the Secretary shall call a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of such meeting to be specified in the requisition. And no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that specified, and every such meeting shall be convened by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in Colac at least seven days before the day of meeting, with intelligible reference to its object.

11. At every meeting the President, or, in his absence, the senior Vice-President in attendance, shall preside as chairman, but if none of these office-bearers is present the contributors present shall choose one of their number to be chairman at that meeting.

12. No person shall be nominated as a member of the Committee unless a written nomination of such person to such office, signed by at least two contributors, and also a written consent of such person to act in such office, has been delivered to the Secretary at least seven days before the date of the annual meeting.

13. At all meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within half an hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned till the following week at the same day, hour, and place.

14. At all meetings of contributors, all questions except questions involving a contested election shall be decided by a show of hands unless before or on the declaration of the result a division is demanded by any contributor, in which event it shall be decided by a division. A declaration by the chairman that any resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or otherwise, and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive of the facts, provided, however, that where at least ten contributors so demand at the meeting any resolution confirming a By-law shall be decided by poll as hereinafter provided.

15. Votes of contributors given through the post shall, on a show of hands, division, or poll, be counted in the same manner as if they had been given in person.

16. At all meetings of contributors the chairman shall, in the event of there being an equality of votes on any question, have a casting vote only.

17. Contributors shall on all occasions be entitled to one vote only.

18. Where, at any meeting of contributors, a poll is duly demanded on a resolution confirming a By-law, the chairman of such meeting shall adjourn the meeting to admit of the poll being taken to a day to be fixed by him, but not less than five nor more than ten days after the day of adjournment. On the day preceding that fixed for the adjourned meeting, a poll of all contributors on the resolution in respect of which the poll was demanded shall be taken. Notice of the poll, specifying the By-law or By-laws to be confirmed, and the day, place, and time of polling, shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in Colac not less than three days before the polling day. The result of such poll shall be announced by the chairman at the adjourned meeting, and shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.

Where, under By-laws, any election has to be decided by poll, such poll shall be taken on a day to be fixed by the Committee. Notice of the day so fixed, of the time and place of polling, and of the office or offices to be filled, and the names of the candidates duly nominated, shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in Colac not less than three days before the day so fixed.

Upon a poll being taken each contributor may give his vote either in person or through the post. The poll shall be kept open from Eight o'clock in the morning until Seven o'clock in the evening on the polling day, and the votes of contributors who vote in person shall be recorded at any time between these hours. Votes recorded by post shall reach the polling office appointed as aforesaid, or the Secretary, before the closing time of the poll. The Committee shall make provision for the conduct of the poll and the proper counting of the votes.

19. A minute-book shall be kept in which shall be kept recorded minutes of all meetings. Such minutes if purporting to be signed by the chairman of the meetings at which the proceedings were held or by the chairman of the next succeeding meeting, shall be evidence of the proceedings, and such meetings shall be deemed to have been duly held and convened, and the resolutions recorded in the minutes duly passed or otherwise as recorded.

MANAGEMENT.

20. The Committee shall consist of eighteen contributors, comprising the President, the two Vice-presidents, and the Honorary Treasurer ex-officio, and fourteen elected members. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer respectively shall hold office for one year, and shall retire on the day of the annual general meeting next succeeding their election, but may be re-elected.

21. The Committee shall be elected and retire in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

22. No paid officer of the institution shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

23. The Committee shall direct the general business of the Hospital, arrange all contracts connected therewith, and direct payment of the same; they shall appoint and discharge all officers and servants of the institution except as hereinafter provided.

24. The advertisement calling the annual general meeting shall state the names of the members of the Committee who will retire at such meeting, and the number of vacancies to be filled, and that nominations for the offices of President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Auditors and of members of the Committee require to be delivered to the Secretary on or before a day named.

25. Where, on or before the day so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates have not been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, the chairman at the annual general meeting shall declare the persons so nominated duly elected to the offices for which they have been nominated.

26. Where, on or before the date so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates have been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, a poll shall be taken. Such poll shall be held before the day of the annual general meeting, and the results of such poll shall be announced by the chairman at such meeting, and the persons elected by such poll shall be deemed to have been elected at the annual general meeting.

MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE.

27. The Committee shall meet on the second Monday of each month at the Board room of the Hospital. The maximum number of legally qualified medical practitioners who may be members of such Committee shall not exceed one-sixth part of the members of the Committee, or the integral number nearest to such one-sixth part.

28. The Committee shall be empowered to frame such regulations as they may deem necessary for the proper management of the institution, provided that such regulations are not *ultra vires* the By-laws of the institution or the provisions of the Act.

29. Special meetings of the Committee may be convened by the President or any four members. Notice shall be given to members of such meeting, specifying the general nature of the business to be transacted, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

30. Written notice of each monthly meeting shall be served on each member of the Committee at least three days prior to such meeting by delivering it to him or by sending it by post in a prepaid letter addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode.

31. No less than six of the members shall form a quorum at any meeting of Committee. No business shall be transacted unless a quorum is present, and if within half an hour of the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned.

32. The President, or, in his absence, the senior Vice-President in attendance, shall preside at all meetings of the Committee, but if none of these office-bearers is present the members shall choose one of their number to be chairman.

33. All questions arising at any meeting of the Committee shall be decided by a show of hands, or, if demanded by any members, by a division. Each member, including the chairman, shall have one vote. In the event of the numbers being equal, the chairman shall in addition have a casting vote. No member of the Committee shall vote or participate in debate on any question in which he shall have any pecuniary interest.

34. Proper minutes shall be kept of the proceedings of all meetings of Committee.

35. No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or rescinded for one calendar month after such resolution has been passed, except at a special meeting of the Committee called for the purpose or by an absolute majority of the whole Committee.

36. The Committee shall prepare and lay before the contributors at each annual general meeting a general report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with a balance-sheet, duly audited, exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure for the twelve months ended on the 30th day of June next preceding the day of such meeting.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

37. The Committee shall at its first meeting after the annual meeting of the contributors appoint from among themselves a House Committee of three members, two to form a quorum. The House Committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting. The office of any member of the House Committee shall become vacant on his ceasing to be a member of the Committee.

38. *Duties of House Committee.*—The House Committee shall—

- (a) visit the Hospital at least once each month;
- (b) inspect the various parts of the hospital;
- (c) examine the condition of the furniture, beds, and bedding in the Hospital;
- (d) satisfy themselves that all articles for human consumption in the hospital are sound and wholesome, and that all food given to patients and staff is properly cooked and served out in a suitable manner;
- (e) hear and investigate all complaints upon any matter relating to the Hospital;
- (f) make suggestions for the further good management and discipline of the Hospital, and for the comfort of the patients;
- (g) perform such other functions as the Committee may from time to time determine;
- (h) report in writing to the next monthly meeting of the Committee the result of their inspection and examination and otherwise regarding their work.

FINANCE COMMITTEE.

39. A Finance Committee consisting of the Treasurer and four other members shall be elected by and from the Committee at its first meeting after the annual general meeting of contributors. The Finance Committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting. Three members shall form a quorum.

40. *Duties of Finance Committee.*—The Finance Committee shall—

- (a) visit the Hospital once in each week;
- (b) examine the admission form of each patient admitted and fix the amount payable by each patient by way of fee towards the cost of maintenance of the institution;
- (c) examine a statement prepared by the Secretary of all outstanding patients' fees and make recommendations to the Committee whether—
 - (i) the outstanding fees should be written off, and why;
 - (ii) further action should be taken and by what means;
- (d) examine the Secretary's cash-book and other books of accounts and compare the same with the bank pass-book;

- (c) give all needful instructions to the Secretary and/or collectors with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations;
- (f) examine the abstract of accounts prepared by the Treasurer for presentation to the Committee at its monthly meeting, satisfy itself that all services in relation thereto have been duly executed, and that all vouchers connected with the abstract have been correctly acquitted or certified;
- (g) see that the vouchers in connexion with previous payments passed by the Committee have been properly receipted;
- (h) examine the returns prepared for the Charities Board of Victoria and other Government Departments and the annual statement of accounts;
- (i) perform such other duties as may be allotted by the Committee.

In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the Finance Committee the signature of some member thereof should be appended, with the date of examination.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF THE PRIVATE AND INTERMEDIATE WARDS.

41. A sub-committee for the management of the intermediate and private sections of the hospital, consisting of the President, the Treasurer, one other lay member, and two legally qualified medical practitioners, shall be elected by and from the Committee at its first meeting after the annual meeting of contributors. In the event of the number of legally qualified medical practitioners appointed to the Committee being less than two, the Committee shall select the required number of persons from among the medical practitioners resident in Colac and admitting patients to the intermediate and private wards of the Hospital. The President of the Hospital shall be chairman of the sub-committee, but in his absence from any meeting the sub-committee may appoint a chairman for such meeting from among their number, but a decision of such sub-committee shall not be deemed to have been effectually taken unless it is agreed to by an absolute majority of the sub-committee.

42. The sub-committee may make rules not inconsistent with regulations of the Committee, the By-laws, and/or the Act to govern its procedure.

43. The sub-committee shall—

- (a) manage the intermediate and private sections of the Hospital in accordance with the general directions contained in the instructions of the Committee relating to the accommodation of intermediate and private patients;
- (b) cause to be kept separate records and accounts in the form and on the basis prescribed by the Committee;
- (c) determine—
 - (i) any matter of a technical or professional nature arising in conduct and management, and
 - (ii) the diet standard of the intermediate and private section of the Hospital. Provided that any matter affecting services common to the public as well as to the intermediate and private section of the Hospital will be decided by the Committee after consultation with the sub-committee;
- (d) subject to approval by the Committee, select suitable personnel for appointment to the staff establishment for employment in the private and intermediate section of the Hospital;
- (e) present to the Committee at each monthly meeting a brief report of the results of management, any aspects arising therefrom, and a financial statement in a form prescribed by the Committee.

OTHER SUB-COMMITTEES.

44. The Committee may appoint such other sub-committees as they consider necessary from among their own members, and may delegate to such sub-committees such of their powers as they consider necessary.

FINANCE.

45. Secretary shall receive all money, issue receipts, deposit daily in bank all moneys on hand; and the Treasurer shall be responsible that this is done.

46. All accounts shall be paid by cheque, and no payments shall be made unless authorized by the Committee.

47. No cheque shall be issued unless authorized by the Committee.

48. Cheques shall be drawn by the Secretary, and signed by the Treasurer, and countersigned by the President and Secretary, or such persons authorized by the Committee.

ALLOCATION OF FUNDS RECEIVED.

49. *Endowment Fund.*—(1) An endowment fund may be established, and allocations of funds thereto shall be made as provided by the Act and/or Regulations thereunder.

(2) All moneys to the credit of the fund from time to time shall be invested by the Committee at their discretion in any of the modes authorized by law for investment of trust funds, or on fixed deposit in any of the Associated Banks, or in the purchase of freehold property in the name of the Corporation; and the Treasurer shall receive the income therefrom, and appropriate the same for the purposes of the institution, on the authority of the Committee.

(3) Contributors to this fund shall be entitled to all the privileges in respect of their contributions as if the same had been made to the ordinary annual revenue of the institution.

50. Accumulated credits to the maintenance account shall not be applied for endowment purposes, but may be transferred to reserve fund from time to time as the Committee directs.

51. All amounts placed in the reserve fund may be invested by the Treasurer from time to time as the Committee directs, and any income arising from such investments shall be paid to the credit of maintenance or reserve funds at the discretion of the Committee, provided that the Committee may at any time for maintenance, building, or equipment purposes, authorize the disposal of the whole or any part of the reserve fund investments.

AUDITORS.

52. Two auditors shall be elected at the annual meeting each year, and remuneration, if any, to be paid to them shall be fixed then. The auditors shall have access to the books and accounts of the institution at all times, and shall, if they consider it necessary, report direct to the Committee.

The auditors shall, during July in each year, examine the Treasurer's annual financial statement, compare it with all books, and accounts and documents relating thereto, and lists of contributions and donations; they may make any special report thereon which they consider necessary to the annual meeting.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

53. All patients (when able to do so) shall supply the particulars required on the prescribed admission form, and shall sign the appropriate declaration thereon.

54. The Committee, or a sub-committee duly appointed for the purpose, or an officer of the institution authorized to act on their behalf, will determine the admission of patients.

55. Except in accident or emergency, all patients to be admitted on the recommendation of a medical officer, or other medical practitioner.

FEES.

56. Fees for accommodation, maintenance, and nursing attention in the institution, and for service to out-patients, shall be such as are fixed by the Committee from time to time.

VISITORS.

57. Friends may be allowed to visit patients at such hours as are fixed by the Committee.

Except where otherwise determined by an authorized officer, a visiting fee of Sixpence per visit shall be paid by each adult visitor.

MEDICAL STAFF.

58. The honorary medical staff shall consist of not more than six legally qualified medical practitioners resident in and practising in the Town of Colac, provided that in the event of the annual daily average number of occupied beds in the public section of the Hospital reaching 50, the number of the honorary medical staff may be increased to seven.

59. The members of the honorary medical staff shall be appointed by the Committee at its first meeting held after these By-laws come into force, and from time to time as vacancies arise, and the members of the honorary medical staff so appointed shall hold office for five years, or until terminated—

- (1) by the resignation of the honorary medical officer concerned, or on his attaining the age of 65 years;
- (2) by a resolution of two-thirds of the Committee present at a special meeting convened for the purpose, of which fourteen days' notice, in writing, shall be given to each member of the Committee, and to the honorary medical officer concerned. The honorary medical officer concerned shall have the right, upon application to the President of the Hospital, to be informed, in writing, of the reasons for which the termination of the appointment is proposed, and such honorary medical officer shall also have the right to attend the said special meeting.

The members of the honorary medical staff shall be eligible for re-appointment.

60. The honorary medical staff of the Hospital shall have all rights of treating patients admitted to the public wards of the Hospital, and shall be the only medical practitioners who shall have such rights.

61. Any legally qualified medical practitioner shall have full rights of treating patients admitted to the private and intermediate sections of the Hospital, whether he is a member of the honorary medical staff or not.

HONORARY DENTAL STAFF.

62. The honorary dental staff shall consist of not more than three legally qualified dentists resident in and practising in the Town of Colac.

63. The honorary dental staff shall be appointed by the Committee at its first meeting held after these By-laws come into force, and from time to time as vacancies arise, and the members of the honorary dental staff so appointed shall hold office for five years, or until terminated—

- (1) by the resignation of the honorary dentist concerned, or on his attaining the age of 65 years;
- (2) by a resolution of two-thirds of the Committee present at a special meeting convened for the purpose, of which fourteen days' notice, in writing, shall be given to each member of the Committee, and to the honorary dental officer concerned. The honorary dental officer concerned shall have the right, upon application to the President of the Hospital, to be informed, in writing, of the reasons for which the termination of the appointment is proposed, and such honorary dental officer shall also have the right to attend the said special meeting.

The members of the honorary dental staff shall be eligible for re-appointment.

MEETINGS.

64. All meetings in connexion with the Hospital, except meetings of sub-committees appointed for special purposes, shall be open to contributors, and to the press; but no person present at Committee meetings who is not a member of the Committee shall be permitted to interfere or take part in the proceedings, provided the Committee may consider, *in camera*, any matter which they so desire.

ALTERATION OR AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

65. No new By-laws shall be made, nor any of the By-laws rescinded, altered, or amended, except with the concurrence of a majority of the contributors voting at a special meeting convened for the purpose, or at the annual general meeting. One month's notice of intention to move such alteration, rescission, or amendment shall be given to the Committee, except if such rescission, alteration, or amendment shall be proposed by the Committee, in which case the Committee shall give fourteen days' notice, by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in Colac, of their intention to move such rescission, alteration, or amendment.

2. By-law No. 72, page 13, Division E, clause 33, shall be amended by the addition of the following sub-clause, to be intitled "(d)":—

(d) beg or solicit alms, either verbally or by the use of written sign, notice, or placard.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Essendon.
