## THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 8.

*Regulations of the Ballarat Water Commissioners.*

**I**N pursuance of the *Water Act 1923*, and of every other right, title, or power in any wise enabling it in that behalf the corporation styled the Ballarat Water Commissioners doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Visitors will be allowed access to the water reserves only between the hours of sunrise and sunset of each day.

2. Public conveyances or vehicles used for hire will be permitted to enter the reserves known as Kirk's, Beale's, Wilson's, and Moorabool for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, but must retire to such stand or portion of the reserve as may be set apart for such conveyances, or as may be pointed out by the caretaker or other employees of the Commissioners, and in no case and under no pretext will the owner or persons in charge of such vehicles be permitted to ply for hire from any other stand or place within the reserves.

3. Private or public vehicles conveying visitors will be permitted to enter or pass through such portions of the water reserves as the Commissioners may from time to time approve, but drivers of such vehicles and visitors will be held personally responsible for the proper closing and fastening of any gate or gates opened or passed through by them.

4. No person shall light any fire in any part of the water reserves except in such places as are specially provided for the purpose, and in the event of injury or damage being done to the works, buildings, fences, plantations, trees, shrubs, timber, grass, or other property of the Commissioners by or through the lighting of any fire wherever lit, or whether such fire be lit on any such place or elsewhere upon any lands belonging to the Commissioners, the person or persons lighting the same will be held responsible for all damage so caused.

5. No person shall, without the express authority of the Commissioners, enter or remain in or upon any part of the water reserves on which pine plantations are established, nor in any established hardwood plantation, and any person so doing shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 on conviction before a Court of competent jurisdiction, and shall also be liable to a further penalty of £5 per day for each and every day during which such offender shall continue or repeat such trespass after being warned.

6. No person shall light any fire upon any road adjoining any part of the water reserves upon which any plantation of trees of any kind shall be established. In the event of injury or damage being done to any plantation or any trees through the lighting of any fire upon any such road or in the vicinity of any such plantation the person or persons lighting such fires will be held liable for all damage caused by it, and such damages shall be recoverable by the Commissioners from any such offender in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

7. No person shall wash utensils, cloths, or clothes, or throw any live or dead animal, stones, sticks, empty bottles, tins, rubbish, refuse, debris, or anything of any kind whatsoever in or into any of the reservoirs, aqueducts, channels, creeks, or other water supply works belonging to or under the control of the Commissioners.

8. No person shall commit a nuisance or deposit offensive matter on the reserves, or do any act or thing whereby the water is or may be defiled, polluted, obstructed, or otherwise interfered with.

9. No person shall swim, walk, wade, or stand in the water in the reservoirs, or in the aqueducts, races, channels, or other works in connexion with the water supply.

10. No person shall enter or stand upon or within the lines of high water of any of the reservoirs, or shall stand, walk, or run up or down the outer or inner slopes of the dams or reservoir embankments.

11. No person shall angle for fish in or upon or about any of the reserves or reservoirs or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any fish therefrom without first obtaining a licence from the Commissioners in such form and subject to such regulations as the Commissioners shall adopt and have approved by the Governor in Council.

12. No person shall shoot or snare wildfowl or carry fire-arms in or upon or about any of the reserves or reservoirs or waters under the control of the Commissioners, or remove any wildfowl therefrom.

13. All dogs found upon lands reserved for water supply purposes shall be liable to be destroyed.

14. No person shall remove any timber, firewood, trees, shrubs, grass, stone, gravel, sand, earth, or other material from the lands vested in or under the control of the Commissioners, or erect any dwelling, tent, booth, or other structure thereon, or sell any refreshments or other commodities within the reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Commissioners.

15. No person shall enter or remain in any of the reserves, or upon any of the lands under the control of the Commissioners, who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

16. Each and every person who enters upon the lands vested in the Commissioners does so at his or her own risk.

17. The Ballarat Water Commissioners will not hold themselves responsible for any accident arising from any cause whatsoever that may occur or happen to any visitor to the water reserves and works.

18. If any person commit a breach of any of the above Regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

19. From and after the date of the approval by the Governor in Council of the foregoing Regulations, the Regulations comprised in By-law No. 6, made and adopted by the said corporation styled the Ballarat Water Commissioners on the thirteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and five, and approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-eighth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and five, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1923*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-LAW No. 40.

1. On all lands and tenements within the Donald Urban District, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the £1 of the municipal valuation for the time being of the Shire of Donald, provided that in no one case shall the amount of the rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than thirty shillings, and in respect of land on which there is no building be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

2. 3. Supplies of water not specified herein must be paid for at such a rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment for such rate must be made to the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

4. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1934, and are payable in advance on the first day of January, 1934. The charges for the payment of water by measure shall be payable quarterly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

## Victorian Dried Fruits Board Election.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE USE OF LONG LINES IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal, as from the tenth day of December, 1933, the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of July, 1930, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirtieth day of July, 1930, regarding the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay, and prohibit as from the said tenth day of December, 1933, the use of long lines and the method of fishing known as "Long Lining" in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays) during the whole of each year, provided that in the waters west of imaginary lines running in a south-easterly direction from the mouth of Little River to Indented Head, near St. Leonards, thence to the West Channel Pile Light, and thence south-westerly to Point Nepean, the use of long lines for taking ling shall be permitted from the first day of April in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following, both days inclusive, subject to the following conditions:—

1. Raw beef shall be the only bait used.
2. The line to be used shall be that known as five ply bagging or sewing twine.
3. Not more than 800 hooks shall be used at the same time by any one person, provided that where two or more persons are employed in the one boat, not more than 1,600 hooks shall be used at the same time by such persons.
4. The snoods to which hooks are fastened shall be attached to the long line at intervals of not more than 12 feet.
5. Each hook used shall not exceed the size known as 3/0.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR THE SUPPLY OF GRAVEL IN THE PARISH OF COMMERALGHIP, SHIRE OF LEIGH.

THE Council of the Shire of Leigh, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 6th June, 1933 (the appointment being notified in *Government Gazette* of 28th June, 1933), as a site for the Supply of Gravel in the Parish of Commeralghip, Shire of Leigh, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof,

and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* :—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of One shilling and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of the stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and the certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

This Reserve has been placed under the control of the Shire of Leigh as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE KNOWN AS "MADDINGLEY PARK," BACCHUS MARSH.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations, and to rescind Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved for Recreative purposes at Maddingley, and known as Maddingley Park, in lieu of all previous Regulations, which are hereby rescinded:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding twenty (20) in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for football, cricket, shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve.
2. The Committee of Management shall have power to let the Reserve for the purposes of holding sports, matches, entertainments, or performances on such terms and conditions as may be considered reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the charge therefor shall not exceed the sum of Ten pounds per day.
3. No person, except the Committee of Management or employees of the said Committee on duty, shall enter the Reserve when a charge for admission is made without first paying the fee charged.
4. No person shall damage any building, or the furniture or fittings thereof, in the Reserve, or interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange or banana peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein; nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
5. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds or animals therein, or take, injure, or destroy any bird's nest or bird's egg, either in the Reserve or in or on any water therein, or bathe in any such water, unless by the authority of the Committee of Management.
6. No person shall sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any article of food or drink or other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement, without the written permission of the Committee of Management.
7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or laid out for the plantation of young trees or shrubs or flowers. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any conservatory, or any special area of land set apart for the propagation of plants, and no person shall remove any pot plants, shrubs, or flowers from any portion of the Reserve whatsoever.
8. No person shall engage in any organized sport in the Reserve on Sundays, nor on Christmas Day or Anzac Day.
9. No person shall engage in training, or take part in any organized game, amusement, or entertainment within the Reserve, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall bet publicly, or carry on the trade, business or calling or occupation of a bookmaker in any portion

of the Reserve, without the permission of the Committee of Management. Every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

11. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall ride or drive any horse or vehicle, or motor car, or motor bicycle of any kind in or through the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management.
  12. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency in the Reserve, or the buildings or structures therein, and any person found in a state of intoxication, or otherwise offending against this Regulation, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding that such person shall have a ticket for admission thereto, and shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.
  13. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.
  14. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on or in any structures or erections in the Reserve.
  15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.
  16. No horses or cattle shall be allowed in the Reserve without the authority of the Committee of Management, and the owner thereof shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done.
  17. No person shall, in the Reserve, wilfully obstruct, disturb, or interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.
  18. The Committee of Management may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars and vehicles, and for the tethering of horses, and no cars or vehicles or horses shall be parked or tethered on any portion of the Reserve other than in the portions set apart for the purpose. A charge not exceeding One shilling per day may be made for the admission of any vehicle to the Reserve on such days only as a charge is being made for admission, as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.
  19. The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.
  20. Persons hiring or renting any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, horse races, sports, or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of a guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

### AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE MELBOURNE HOSPITAL.

PURSUANT to section 65 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act* 1928, made by the committee and confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose on the eleventh day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and by the annual general meeting of contributors held on the twenty-third day of August, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and published in the *Government Gazette*, No. 194, on the 25th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, existing By-laws 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 94 are deleted and the following new By-laws inserted in lieu thereof.

7. Reserved.

#### Enrolment and Certificate of Life Governors.

8. Every Life Governor upon election shall forthwith be enrolled as such in the books of the Hospital, and shall be entitled to a certificate stating that he has been so elected.

#### HONORARY LIFE GOVERNORS.

8. (a) Any person who by honorary services shall have, in the opinion of the committee, conferred a material benefit on the Hospital by the collection of money or otherwise, or who shall be nominated by any organization or body of persons which has, in the opinion of the committee, conferred such a benefit on the Hospital may be elected as Honorary Life Governor by the committee. Provided no such organization or body of persons shall be entitled to nominate more than three persons as Honorary Life Governors during any period of twelve months.

8 (b) Every Honorary Life Governor upon election shall be forthwith enrolled as such on the books of the Hospital and shall be entitled to a certificate stating that he has been so elected.

#### HONORARY LIFE MEMBERS.

8. (c) An Honorary Life Member shall be any person who is an Honorary Life Governor at the date of coming into operation of these amendments to the By-laws, viz., the first day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, or being eligible under the By-laws, is elected an Honorary Life Member at a general meeting of contributors.

8. (d) Any person who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the Hospital other than by contributing thereto may be elected an Honorary Life Member at any general meeting on the recommendation of the committee.

#### ENDOWMENT OF BEDS.

##### Persons Entitled to Endow Beds.

9. The following persons shall be entitled to endow a bed in the Hospital in perpetuity:—

- Every person and every body of persons who shall have contributed to the Hospital a sum of not less than Five hundred pounds in one donation, and
- The executors and trustees of any will under which the Hospital shall receive a sum of not less than Five hundred pounds in one donation.

##### Privileges of Endower of Bed.

10. Persons who endow a bed shall be entitled to cause to be placed on the wall at the head of such bed a brass tablet containing such inscription as the committee shall in its uncontrolled discretion think fit, which tablet, when placed as aforesaid, shall not be removed from its position unless with the consent of the committee.

#### VOTES AND PRIVILEGES OF LIFE GOVERNORS.

11. Reserved. *Of Contributors of £500.*

12. Every Life Governor who shall have contributed on his own behalf a sum of not less than Five hundred pounds in one donation shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings, and to recommend four in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year, as well as to the privileges given under By-laws Nos. 9 and 10.

##### Of Nominee of Executors, &c.

13. Every Life Governor who is the nominee of the executors or trustees under any will who have allocated to the Hospital out of any moneys of the testator not specifically directed to be paid to the Hospital under the will—

- A sum of not less than Five hundred pounds in one donation shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings, as well as to the privileges granted under By-law No. 12.
- A sum of not less than One hundred pounds in one donation shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings and to recommend one in-patient and four out-patients in every year.

##### Of Nominee of Company, &c.

14. Every Life Governor who is the nominee—  
(a) of any corporation, company, or firm, or

(b) of the employees of any corporation, company, firm, or employer, shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings and to recommend two in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

15. Every Life Governor who has on his own behalf contributed—

*Of Contributors who Give £200.*

(a) A sum of not less than Two hundred pounds shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings and to recommend four in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

*Of Contributors who Give £100.*

(b) A sum of not less than One hundred pounds shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings and to recommend two in-patients and twelve out-patients in every year.

*Of Other Life Governors.*

16. Every Life Governor to whom neither votes nor privileges are specifically granted under any of the preceding By-laws shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings and to recommend four out-patients in every year.

**PRIVILEGES OF HONORARY LIFE GOVERNORS.**

16. (a) Every Honorary Life Governor shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a Life Governor, except those of voting at any general meeting or at any election, or of being elected to any office which can be filled only by a contributor.

**VOTES AND PRIVILEGES OF HONORARY LIFE MEMBERS.**

16. (b) Every Honorary Life Member shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings and to recommend one in-patient and five out-patients in every year.

*Other Honorary Medical Officers—Qualifications, Mode of Appointment, and Tenure of Office.*

94. There may also be appointed the following Honorary Medical Officers:—

- (1) Assistant Pathologists, of whom one may be appointed Director of the Histological Laboratory, one may be appointed Director of the Bacteriology Laboratory, and one may be appointed Director of the Chemical Laboratory.
- (2) Junior Assistant Pathologists.
- (3) Assistant Anaesthetists.
- (4) Assistant Medical Electricians.
- (5) Assistant Radiologists.
- (6) Assistant Medical Officers for Venereal Diseases.
- (7) Assistant Psychiatrist.
- (8) Assistant Orthopaedists.
- (9) An assistant to each medical officer in charge of a special department.
- (10) Clinical assistants to each physician to out-patients, to each surgeon to out-patients, to each medical officer in charge of a special department, to each specialist, and to the assistant medical officers for venereal diseases.
- (11) Associate Assistants.

There may also be appointed—

- (12) Honorary Dentists.

The Honorary Medical Officers under this By-law shall be registered medical practitioners under the *Medical Act 1928*. The Honorary Dentists shall be registered dentists under the *Medical Act 1928*. All officers under this By-law except Associate Assistants shall be appointed, and may be re-appointed, and may be removed from office by the committee after report from the Advisory Board. The Associate Assistants shall be appointed, and may be re-appointed, and may be removed from office by the committee after report from the Hospital Advisory Committee, and shall hold office for one year. The Assistant Pathologists shall hold office for the same term of years as the Physicians and Surgeons, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. The Junior Assistant Pathologists shall hold office for one year, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. The remaining officers under this By-law shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-appointment. No officers under this By-law shall hold office after attaining the age of sixty years.

*Hospital Advisory Committee.*

94. (a) The Hospital Advisory Committee shall consist of eight members, four being members of and chosen by the committee, and four being the Senior In-patient and Out-patient Surgeons and the Senior In-patient and Out-patient Physicians. The members of the Hospital Advisory Committee shall be chosen annually and shall hold office till their successors are appointed. Any casual vacancy may be filled for the remainder of the annual term by the said Hospital Advisory Committee. The Hospital Advisory Committee shall elect a chairman from among the members chosen by the committee. The chairman shall have a vote, and, if necessary, a casting vote. The quorum for the Hospital Advisory Committee shall be five.

94. (b) There may be one associate assistant for each physician to in-patients and one for each surgeon to in-patients, and when such physician or surgeon requests the appointment of an associate assistant such physician or surgeon shall recommend to the Medical Staff a nominee or nominees, and the Medical Staff may recommend such nominee or nominees to the Hospital Advisory Committee, who may make a recommendation thereon to the committee.

94. (c) In considering any such recommendation the Hospital Advisory Committee shall co-opt for the occasion the physician or surgeon who has made the recommendation, and he shall have a vote.

94. (d) When requested to do so by the committee, the Hospital Advisory Committee may make recommendations with regard to the appointment of any paid medical officers, and for the consideration of any such request the committee may appoint such additional members of the Hospital Advisory Committee as the committee may deem necessary. 3913
