The Ballarat Sewerage District.

The following rates are hereby made under the provisions of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District:—

(1) Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a Special Rate of Threepence in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable properties within the said District, which are not seweraged properties.

(2) Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a sewerage rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said district.

(3) Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1933, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1933, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1933, at the office of the Authority, situate at the Water and Sewerage Offices, Ballarat.

(4) If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid special rate becomes during the year 1933 a "sewered property" there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the special rate for unsewered properties for the portion of the year it remained an unsewered property, and also a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a seweraged property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

(5) For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

(6) Such person or persons as The Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorised to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Stopping Places on Routes.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under 12 years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

Where in any Regulations heretofore made under the provisions of the Apprenticeship Acts for or with respect to any proclaimed trade there is contained a provision for the refund by the employer of the school fees paid by any apprentice or applicant for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction, such provisions shall be read and construed as if the following proviso were added thereto:—
 Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice, or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent, or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

 Making right through and operating the following machines:—Upper assembler, Consol laster, pounder, upper stapler, stitcher, tacker and trimmer.

**FURTHER AMENDMENT OF PAINTING, DECORATING,
 AND SIGNWRITING REGULATIONS (No. 2).**

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the *Apprenticeship Act 1927* (No. 3546), the Governor in Council did, on the 12th day of March, 1929, make Regulations entitled Painting, Decorating, and Signwriting Regulations (No. 2); And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Regulations: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, and of any other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Regulations as follows, that is to say:—

*Additions to Terms and Conditions of Indentures of
 Apprenticeship.*

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) of the Employer's Covenant contained in the Second Schedule to the General Regulations (No. 2) as incorporated by Regulation 5 of the Painting, Decorating, and Signwriting Regulations (No. 2), add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week, or month, he may, with the approval of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required under the provisions of this paragraph to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month:

And at the end of paragraph (3) of the Mutual Agreements, contained in the said schedule, as incorporated by the aforesaid Regulation 5, add the following proviso:—

Provided that where the apprentice is required, under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof, to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month, at the time so lost may, at the option of the apprentice, either be included in or excluded from the term of apprenticeship hereinbefore referred to.

The aforesaid provisos shall come into operation on and from the 2nd day of January, 1933.

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 284.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 284, for the purpose of amending By-law No. 280 of the said City.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

That By-law No. 280 of the said City be amended by striking out the whole of that portion of Part XIII. of the said by-law relating to signboards, and inserting the following clauses in lieu thereof:—

Signboards.

1. In this by-law the term signboard shall mean and include signboard, illuminated advertisement, hanging lamp, steel or iron pipe framed fixture.

2. A signboard may be erected on, or attached to, any building or verandah, provided that it be of material, design, and construction approved by the City Surveyor, and subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) Before erecting any signboard a permit or licence must be obtained from the City Surveyor.
- (b) No portion of any signboard shall be less than nine feet above the level of the footpath.
- (c) No portion of any signboard shall project over the carriage-way beyond the kerb alignment of the footpath.
- (d) A signboard shall not be erected across the roof of a verandah.
- (e) If a signboard is placed underneath, and attached to a verandah, it shall not exceed fourteen inches in vertical height, and may extend across the full width of the footpath, provided it is securely fastened to the building, and also to the verandah columns, or, if following the curvature of the verandah roof, it is securely fastened to the tie rod and rafter. If suspended by wrought iron rods from the roof framing of verandah, the vertical height shall not exceed fourteen inches, and the length shall not exceed ten feet.
- (f) If a signboard is placed on and along the front edge of the roof of the verandah, and parallel to the street kerb, it shall not exceed three feet in vertical height.
- (g) A signboard may be placed in the frieze panel on the front of the verandah below the gutter, and shall fit within the area occupied by such panel.
- (h) The end of a verandah, when not adjoining another verandah, may be used for advertising purposes, and may be filled in to approval of Surveyor with angle iron bearers, covered with small fluted galvanized corrugated iron, but no portion of same shall be less than nine feet above the level of the footpath.
- (i) No signboard shall exceed three feet in vertical height, unless it be fixed flat against the wall, or upon the roof of the main building, and a plan showing all detail shall be furnished when application for a permit is made.
- (j) If projected from a building where no verandah exists, a signboard shall not exceed fourteen inches in vertical height, and shall not extend more than four feet over any public street from the building line of such street.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the Municipal District of South Melbourne, that is to say:—
