HEATHERTON SANATORIUM BOARD.

BY-LAWS.—PART 2.

(Defining the Duties of the Board's Officers.)

ALL By-laws heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

DUTIES OF THE MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT.

(1) The Medical Superintendent shall be appointed by the Board, and shall be a medical practitioner registered in the State of Victoria.

He shall—

(2) Be in entire charge of patients and of all wards and buildings connected with the reception, care, and discharge of patients, and shall be responsible to the Board in all matters of a professional nature.

(3) Devote his whole time to the service of the Sanatorium, and shall not engage in private practice. He shall reside at the Sanatorium, and be required to work, professionally, under the State Director of Tuberculosis.

(4) Exercise supervision over all matters connected with the conveyance, admission, treatment, nursing, and discharge of patients.

(5) Visit, or cause to be visited by a competent medical officer, all wards at least once a day.

(6) Have the superintendence and control of the clinical work of the Sanatorium, and be responsible for the patients' discipline, and for all matters pertaining to hygiene and sanitation.

(7) Keep all necessary records of patients, and shall supply all prescribed or required statistical matter in his annual report.

(8) Give, or cause to be given, to relatives or guardians of patients all necessary information as to the condition of patients, and due notice of patients about to be discharged or dangerously ill, and immediate notice upon the death of a patient.

(9) See all patients as soon as practicable after arrival at the Sanatorium, obtain their histories, explain the rules of the institution and the basis of sanatorium treatment.

(10) Frame diet scales, where necessary, for the patients, and arrange for modification of the dietary in relation to such patients as require such modification.

(11) Visit the dining-room occasionally during the patients' meal time, with a view to ascertaining whether the meals are of good quality and comply with the required standard.

(12) Examine, correct, and submit to the Board all requisitions for drugs, instruments, medical stores, and equipment.

(13) Be responsible for the preparation and dispensing of all medicines, and take entire charge of all apparatus and stock in the dispensary, surgery, or laboratory.

(14) Have full discretion and power to admit or refuse to admit persons suffering from any diseases, and shall report the circumstances to the Board.

(15) Have full power to admit or refuse to admit the friends of any patient, as he may think fit, and may, at his discretion, forbid admission of visitors to wards at any time.

(16) If he deem it essential, temporarily close against visitors any ward or tent in which there is a patient in a critical condition, and restrict the number of visitors a patient may receive.

(17) When possible, attend all meetings of the Board.

(18) Confer, when necessary, with the Matron on all matters in their departments affecting the welfare of patients or the work of the Sanatorium.

(19) See each patient daily, and, when clinical condition is unfavorable, as often as may be necessary.

(20) Prescribe the daily routine for patients.

(21) See that copies of the rules are exhibited in prominent places, and that the attention of those concerned is drawn to them.

(22) Not make any post-mortem examination without the consent of the relatives of the deceased.

(23) Report to the Board any defects in wards, lavatories, and recreation hall, and be responsible for minor repairs therein. He shall have control of the male staff, in so far as is required for the carrying out of his duties.

(24) Be entitled to four weeks' leave annually.

DUTIES OF THE MATRON.

The Matron shall—

(1) Reside at the Sanatorium, and shall have control over all the nursing and domestic staff, and be responsible for their efficiency.

(2) Confer, where necessary, with the Medical Superintendent on all matters affecting the welfare of patients or the work of the Sanatorium.

(3) Engage, suspend, and dismiss all nurses (except the Senior Sister) and servants, and report all such engagements, suspensions, and dismissals to the Board.

(4) Visit, or cause to be visited by the Senior Sister, all wards, kitchen, laundry, and nursing and domestic quarters as often as possible, and all other offices and buildings as often

as is necessary, seeing that cleanliness and order are everywhere observed. The Senior Sister shall act as Deputy Matron. The Matron shall report to the House Committee any breach of discipline by the Senior Sister.

(5) The Matron shall control all food supplies, and shall see that the food for patients and staff is of good quality, properly cooked, and punctually and comfortably served, and that no waste exists. That accurate checks are made as to weight and quality of all food stores received.

(6) Arrange the daily routine of the female servants, and see that every servant's time is fully and properly occupied.

(7) Arrange the annual leave of absence of the nursing and domestic staff, and exercise her discretion in granting leave for special purposes.

(8) Apportion the duties of the staff generally, and be responsible for their efficient performance.

(9) Apportion the duties of sisters, nurses, and probationers, and be responsible for the proper and efficient performance of such duties, and also the duties imposed by the Medical Officer.

(10) Keep a "Discipline Book," wherein shall be recorded any gross misconduct of any servant of the Sanatorium, or any infraction of any important regulation or rule, or any neglect of duty by any person whatsoever, and shall lay the same on table at each meeting of the House Committee, and shall call attention to all fresh entries therein.

(11) Shall receive from the Medical Officer on the patient's admission notification of their financial statement. Shall receive patients' maintenance payments, give official receipt for them, and see that proper accounts are kept.

(12) Wear a distinctive dress, and shall see that the nurses and probationers shall wear the style of dress prescribed by the Board.

(13) Employ nurses and probationers when not attending on patients in doing such other work as she may consider appropriate.

(14) Not permit any nurse or probationer to absent herself from duty unless she is satisfied that such absence is not detrimental to the interests of the Sanatorium or the patients.

(15) Keep a stock book recording receipt and issue of all stores.

(16) Be responsible for the proper care of furniture, kitchen and dining ware, and appliances.

(17) Be responsible for the proper care of bedding and stores, and shall give the necessary directions for maintaining linen, clothing, and other articles in a state of good repair, and shall see that all articles are legibly marked.

(18) Take steps to have all washing checked on forwarding to the laundry, and re-checked on return.

(19) Whenever any patient requires the presence of a spiritual adviser, take the necessary steps to have the request complied with.

(20) Take such steps as may be necessary to ensure that, on the discharge or death of a patient, the bed linen shall be replaced with clean articles.

(21) Whenever a patient is in a critical state, communicate with the relatives by the speediest means available.

(22) On the death of a patient, immediately inform the Medical Superintendent of such occurrence, and communicate with the relatives by the speediest means available.

(23) Treat the patients with kindness, and be responsible for similar qualities on the part of the nursing staff, and take the necessary steps to prevent or reprove any neglect or unkindness.

(24) Guard, as far as possible, against irregularities of conduct on the part of the nurses, such as late hours, absence without leave, levity, &c., and she shall, by the maintenance of a wholesome discipline, endeavour to impress her subordinates with a high sense of the responsibilities devolving upon them.

(25) Visit the wards occasionally at night, and take steps to maintain good order and hygienic cleanliness in wards and all other buildings under her supervision. And shall report any misconduct on the part of any patient to the Medical Superintendent or his deputy.

(26) Prevent by every means in her power the introduction of liquors and provisions to the patients not authorized by the Medical Superintendent.

(27) Take such steps as may be necessary to ensure that every patient on arrival shall have a bath, and that the clothing is fumigated, packed, marked, and stored, and that any valuables are handed to the Matron for safe custody.

(28) Take care that no fee or reward be accepted by a nurse from patients or their friends.

(29) See that strict economy is observed in the management of the wards, particularly in the use of fuel, and that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with.

(30) Be entitled to four (4) weeks' leave annually.

(31) Be supplied with a sum, not exceeding Twenty pounds at a time, for purchase and petty cash. She shall keep a book showing how and when such money was disbursed.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

The Secretary shall—

(1) Convene and attend the meetings of the Board, and act as Secretary thereto, and furnish all information in his power on any subject under discussion, and be responsible for the correct record of all proceedings thereat.

(2) Keep books and accounts in the manner and style prescribed by the Board, and be responsible for their safety and custody.

(3) Conduct the secretarial correspondence and other clerical business of the Sanatorium, and shall file all letters received, and keep copies of all letters despatched on the business of the Sanatorium.

(4) Receive all moneys paid and enter in the cash book, and pay same into the Board's banking account.

(5) Be supplied with sums not exceeding £10 at a time to meet petty expenses, and shall keep a petty cash book showing how and when such money has been disbursed.

(6) Furnish reports in such form and at such periods as the Board may prescribe.

(7) Order such supplies as the Board direct him, and see that all such supplies are of the quality and description ordered.

(8) Carefully examine all bills, make up accounts and initial them as correct, and present them to the Board.

(9) Prepare balance-sheet and annual report on the work of the Sanatorium up to and including 30th June.

(10) Generally attend to all secretarial work.

(11) Obtain a guarantee policy in some recognized society for the sum of £500.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1933.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Trust shall pay for the year 1933 in respect of water supplied by the Trust.

Rating By-law for the Year 1933.

THE Talbot Shire Council, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, do hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Talbot Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the first day of January, 1933, and shall be payable in equal moieties on the first day of January, 1933, and the first July, 1933, at the office of the said Council.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

Water supplied to Government Departments shall be by measure at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons, or by agreement.

Private water-troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

For water supplied for irrigation by pipe service for market gardens, orchards, and lucerne plots, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the annual assessment of the land:—

For one half-inch service—£2 per acre; minimum, One pound (£1).

For two half-inch services—£3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For one threequarter-inch service—£3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For two threequarter-inch services—£4 per acre; minimum, Two pounds (£2).

For water supplied for irrigation purposes from open race the charges shall be as follow:—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ acre—Two pounds (£2).

$\frac{3}{4}$ acre—Three pounds (£3).

1 acre—Four pounds (£4).

$1\frac{1}{2}$ acres—Six pounds (£6).

2 acres—Seven pounds six shillings and sixpence (£7 6s. 6d.).

each succeeding half acre—One pound thirteen shillings and sixpence (£1 13s. 6d.).

The minimum charge shall be One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For water supplied for stock purposes to occupiers of properties adjoining race frontages, a minimum charge of Three pounds (£3), or by agreement.

The charge for water supplied by measure or by agreement shall be payable on demand.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1933.

THE Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Apollo Bay Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty-five shillings (45s.), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1933, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1933, at the office of the said Trust.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government Departments, show grounds, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure at One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 15,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "The Trust") in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make the By-law following for its waterworks district:—

Connections with Trust's Mains.

1. Except with the consent of the Trust, one service pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement shall be permitted, and not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may, in special cases, consent to two or more houses or tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house or tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such service.

2. No private service shall be extended, except with the consent of the Trust.

3. Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe to connect with and tap the pipes of the Trust, he shall be informed on behalf of the Trust whether it is or is not desired

that such tapping should be made by an officer of the Trust, and if it be so desired such person shall not tap any such pipe but shall provide for and bear the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequence of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the Trust the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule at such rates as shall from time to time be fixed by the Trust.

4. All service pipes laid in the ground on private property shall be laid at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface. The portions of the service pipe laid along or across any public street, lane or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 24 inches below the surface of the ground.

5. Connexions with the Trust's mains shall (except where otherwise directed) be made with proper stop-cock ferrules to which, for iron services, a W.I. quarter bend or a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. For houses rated at £20 per annum and under, the bore of such service pipe shall not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, and for houses rated at over £20 per annum and under £70 per annum, the size of such service pipe shall not exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ inch. For houses rated at over £70 per annum the size of such service pipe shall not exceed 1 inch unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the Trust.

6. The maximum tapping allowed (except by special permit of the Trust) for each size of main shall be as follows:—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch and 2-inch pipes, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch tapping, with approved clip.

For 3-inch and 4-inch pipes, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch tapping.

For 5-inch and 6-inch pipes, 1-inch tapping.

For 8-inch pipes, $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch tapping.

For 9-inch pipes, $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch tapping.

For over 9-inch pipes, 2-inch tapping.

7. A high pressure screw down stop-cock properly secured and protected with an approved box and cover shall be fixed on each water service between the main and building line.

Materials for Private Services, &c.

8. Lead piping of the following weights:—

For piping $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter, weight 6 lb. per yard.

For piping $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter, weight 9 lb. per yard.

For piping 1-inch diameter, weight $14\frac{1}{2}$ lb. per yard.

For piping $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter, weight 22 lb. per yard.

For piping $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter, weight 30 lb. per yard. and galvanized wrought-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services.

9. The quality of the material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(a) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service pipes and mains) bends, reducing couplings, plugs, and the like, shall be of best galvanized wrought-iron or other material approved of by the Trust.

(b) All pipes and pieces shall be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, clear in bore and properly coated throughout, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

(c) All ends of pipes, bends, and the like shall be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, or fittings.

(d) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, cocks, and fittings, shall be sound and free from all defects, and of strength to bear with safety the maximum hydrostatic pressure to which they may be subject, and if required by the Trust shall be tested.

10. No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock valve, closet cistern, service box, waste-not regulator, bath-tap, or valve or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.

11. No person shall use any stop or bib-cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of the best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

12. All connexions between lead and iron pipes shall be made with brass union couplings.

13. All joints connecting lead pipes shall be "wiped joints," and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence of the plumber who, by himself or his workman, shall break these regulations.

14. No person, whether licensed as hereinafter set out or not, shall, without the written consent of the Trust, connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

15. No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball valve, and the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner open to inspection and in a position approved by the Trust.

16. No person shall construct or use any urinal or water closet fitting not approved by the Trust, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet cistern or service box fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a urinal or water closet. Urinals shall be provided with 2-gallon and closets with 3-gallon cisterns.

17. All baths, sinks, lavatory and other basins, closets and urinals served from the Trust's mains shall be of approved sanitary construction, and mounted to the satisfaction of the Trust.

18. No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons, except with the permission of the Trust. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted, except where the supply is by measure.

19. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically, and for preventing overflow.

Licensing of Plumbers.

20. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, meter, or fitting connecting with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, meter, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

21. Each licence shall be for the period ending 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such manner the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of Ten shillings, and for each renewal Ten shillings.

22. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to water supply, and with the Water Acts so far as they apply to town supplies. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

23. Each licensed plumber before commencing any new work, extensions, tapping, repairs, or renewing any water service, shall obtain the consent of the Trust, and when lodging his application for such consent, shall pay to the secretary of the Trust the sum of Five shillings. No licensed plumber, after the completion of any such work, extensions, tapping, repairs, or renewing any water service, shall refill any excavations in connexion therewith until such work, extensions, tapping, repairs, or renewing any water service has been inspected and approved by an officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose. After such inspection and approval as aforesaid every such licensed plumber shall refill all such excavations and level the surface in a manner to be approved by the said Trust or its duly authorized officer.

Meters.

24. The Trust may if it thinks fit, either generally or in any particular case or cases, require a meter or meters to be affixed and used in connexion with the water supply to any tenement or tenements.

25. Where the Trust requires either generally or in any particular case or cases a meter or meters to be affixed and used the following provisions shall apply, but not otherwise:—

- (a) No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons and each $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than ten, fifteen, and thirty gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexions above ground, in a conveniently accessible position, and properly protected. Wherever washers are necessary for meter connexion coupling-leather washers shall in all cases be used.

26. If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by a duly-authorized officer of the Trust, as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, on the basis of subsequent consumption after repairing, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service pipe and charge upon estimates from the registering thereof. Every meter removed through being out of order must be repaired, adjusted, and submitted for test, and refixed with the least possible delay by a licensed plumber employed for this purpose. For any unnecessary delay in refixing the meter, such licensed plumber shall be guilty of an offence.

27. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter—Six shillings.

For $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter—Seven shillings.

For 1-inch meter—Eight shillings.

For any meter of larger size than 1 inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, the first payment to be made as from the date of installation to the end of the then current half-year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

28. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Trust, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Trust; a fee of Five shillings shall be charged for each test.

29. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and together with such notice shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him, but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

Waste or Misuse of Water.

30. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall permit or suffer the same to run to waste.

31. No person receiving water from the Trust shall, without the written permission of the Trust, take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person.

32. No person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied or from any drinking tap, trough or private or public service pipe.

33. No person other than an employee of the municipal council shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs.

34. Any tap installed in a place to which the general public has access shall be of the spring release type or else operated by a special key which shall be held in the custody of a person duly authorized by the Trust.

35. The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust, and no person, unless duly authorized, shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply.

36. No person shall use or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing or fire-fighting purposes except during the hours between Six o'clock a.m. and Ten o'clock a.m., and during the hours between Six o'clock p.m. and Ten o'clock p.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, or during the hours between Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year.

37. No person shall use water in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter).

38. No person shall use any water on, nor allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, nor at any time other than between the hours of Six (6) o'clock a.m., and Ten (10) o'clock a.m., and during the hours between Six (6) o'clock p.m., and Ten (10) o'clock p.m., during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, or during the hours between Seven (7) o'clock a.m., and Eight (8) p.m. during the other months of the year.

39. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under this By-law.

40. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this By-law; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

Miscellaneous.

41. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the chairman of the Trust, the secretary or the engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

42. In the construction of this By-law the word "Person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the meaning which in the Water Acts is assigned to any word, shall be the meaning of the same word where occurring in this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject matter and context.

43. Any person who does or causes to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, shall be guilty of an offence and for every such offence the offender shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

44. All By-laws relating to water supply previously made by the Trust are hereby repealed.

The foregoing By-law relating to water supply was made by The Shepparton Urban Waterworks on the evening of Tuesday, the thirteenth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF FITZROY, CARLTON, AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS, AND LINCOLN, ARGYLE, CURTAIN, MACARTHUR, MURCHISON, DARLING, AND UNIVERSITY SQUARES, AND FOR THE PRESERVATION OF GOOD ORDER AND DECENCY THEREIN.

WHEREAS by the Crown grants issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Fitzroy, Carlton, and Flagstaff Gardens and Lincoln, Argyle, Curtain, Macarthur, Murchison, Darling, and University Squares, it is provided and declared that the lands thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a public garden or a public square, as the case may be, and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the government of the Colony of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the Regulation following for the care, protection, and management of the said gardens and squares, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said gardens and squares:—

No person shall interfere with the animals or birds in any of the said gardens or squares.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act 1923*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been

warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the trustees; or by any member of the Police Force; does not desist from so offending, may, be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice of the peace, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
