SHIRE OF BENALLA.

BY-LAW No. 32.

A By-law of the Shire of Benalla made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and the Health Acts, for suppressing nuisances and for regulating or prohibiting the keeping of poultry in the opinion of the Council offensive or injurious to health.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and the Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Central Riding of the Shire of Benalla, and unless exempted by the Council, shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, "domestic bird" shall mean and include turkey, goose, duck, fowl, and pigeon. "Property" shall include any tenement or land in separate occupation. "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

5. No person shall keep, or cause or permit to be kept, any domestic birds on any property without the written permission of the council. Before granting such permission, the Council shall satisfy itself that the accommodation provided for the housing of same is not offensive or injurious to health.

6. No person shall keep, or cause or permit to be kept, any domestic birds except in yards or runs, provided that such yards or runs shall be securely fenced with fowl-proof fences, and shall be kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state. Every such yard or run shall be a clear 40 feet from any dwelling-house, and the Council may, upon reasonable notice to the occupier of any property on which is situated, such yard or run, require such occupier to remove or alter such yard or run so that no part thereof shall be within 40 feet of any dwelling-house as aforesaid, provided that in the case of any particular premises where the Council or its officers is of the opinion that it is impracticable to conform with the provisions of this clause, the Council may, subject to such conditions as the Council may impose, permit the erection of a fowl-house at a less distance than 40 feet from any dwelling, if the Council or its officers are satisfied that it will not be a nuisance or cause any offence.

7. No person shall keep more than 50 fowls (exclusive of chickens), or more than 10 ducks, or more than 10 geese on or in any land or place. Provided that the Council may from time to time for such period of time as it may think fit, consent, in writing, to the keeping of more than 50 fowls (exclusive of chickens), or more than 10 ducks, or more than 10 geese, on or in any place in any case where, in the opinion of the Council, such keeping shall not be likely to be a nuisance or offensive or injurious to health.

8. No person shall allow any fowls, ducks, or geese to wander in any street, road, or public place.

9. No house, shelter, or erection for the keeping of any domestic birds referred to in the last preceding clause shall be erected or placed within 40 feet of any dwelling-house.

10. The occupier of any property on which any domestic bird is kept or housed shall cause the place of keeping to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition.

11. Any domestic bird which shall develop any contagious or infectious disease shall be forthwith destroyed, or caused to be destroyed, by the person keeping the same, or causing or permitting the same to be kept.

12. The occupier of any property upon which any domestic bird is kept shall at all reasonable times afford free access to every part thereof respectively to the medical officer of health or health inspector of the Council, or both of them, or to any persons appointed by the Council to act under this By-law.

13. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
