## BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1933.

THE Boort Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Boort Urban District.

special agreement with the said Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.
