### STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL.

ORDER OF 30TH MARCH, 1933, RELATING TO CERTAIN MATTERS ARISING OUT OF AWARDS NOS. 2 AND 3.

For the purpose of determining the basic rate applicable to any employee, a shift worked on a Sunday shall be treated as one shift only.

### A WARD No 3,

### Clause 1.

The basic rate payable to an employee normally working on a basis of twelve shifts a fortnight who, owing to the occurrence of a stop-work meeting, works less than twelve shifts in a particular fortnight, is 11s. 6d. per day.

### Clause 1.

The daily rate of pay for a carpenter normally working on a basis of twelve shifts a fortnight is the sum payable for the number of hours ascertained by dividing by six the number of hours carpenters were working per week at the time of the award, viz., 44, or such other number of hours as may hereafter be determined.

### Clause 1.

The work performed by R. McGrae and H. E. Hill at Eastern Area, and J. Keady at Dudley Area respectively, is that of a pumper.
