Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE DENTAL MECHANICS BOARD.

This Determination on the 1st July, 1934, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder; such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included in the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1923 (No. 3677), the Wages Board which since the 5th November, 1924, has had the power "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

(a) a Dentist's Mechanic;
(b) making any article to be fitted in the human mouth;
(c) a Dentist's Attendant"—

has made the following determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st July, 1934, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

OVERTIME.

- That the following rate shall be paid for all work done:

 (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause (3) ... (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause (3) in excess of the number of hours as fixed for a week's work...
- (5) Casual Labour.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than half the hours fixed for an ordinary week's work) shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (6) All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without ideduction of pay:—The days observed as New Year's Day; Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
- (7) SPECIAL RATES.—Every weekly wage employee employed on a Sunday or any holiday provided for herein shall be paid for that day at the rate of time and a half in addition to his or her weekly wage.
