Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE LEATHER-GOODS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 6th July, 1934, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder; such portions of the city of Sapdringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing—

- (a) Articles made of leather or a substitute for leather, such as-
 - Bags, braces, cases, cricket balls, pads, or other sporting goods, garters, pocketbook covers, portmanteaux, purses, trunks, wallets;
- (b) Machine belting;
- (c) Any other kind of leather goods-

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boot Board, the Rubber Trade Board, or the Saddlery and Harness Board," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 6th July, 1934, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) Hours.—(a) Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for males and forty-five hours for females.
(b) The regular hours of work shall be not earlier than 7 a.m. and not later than 6 p.m. on five days of the week, and not earlier than 7 a.m. and not later than 1.p.m. on Saturday or other day on which a half-holiday is kept; not more than nine and three-quarter hours (except as provided in clause 4) shall be worked in any one day in each week.

(4) Overtime.—All time worked on any day before or after the regular working hours shall be paid for at not less than the rate of time and a quarter for the first three hours and double time thereafter.

Piece-workers employed before or after the regular working hours shall be paid for the first three hours 6½d. per hour extra thereafter 2s. 2½d. per hour in addition to piece-work rates.

(5) Sundays and Public Holldays.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; out if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable on the day so substituted.

(6) PIECE-WORK.—That the lowest piece-work prices or rates to be paid to persons for doing work of the kinds specified in the schedule provided shall be the prices or rates fixed by such schedule in respect of such work.

(7) That in this Determination the terms "deduction" and "deductions" shall mean that if the work described under such heading be done by the employer, then the employer may deduct the amount specified opposite such work from the piece-work price fixed for making the article.

N.B.—All paste shall be mixed for workmen engaged at piece-work rates.

(8) The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 150 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), that for all work not specified in the Schedule of piece-work rate
