- No. 4212. "An Act to continue the Operation of certain Provisions of the Financial Emergency Acts, and of the Provisions of the Pensions Reduction Acts."  
No. 4213. "An Act to continue the Treasury Overdrafts Acts."

## THE TERRITORY OF NEW GUINEA, DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE MAINTENANCE ACTS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that in The Territory of New Guinea (the same being a territory in respect of which a mandate is being exercised by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia) there is, in force legislation containing provisions substantially similar to the provisions contained in Part V. of the *Maintenance Act 1928* of the Parliament of Victoria (as amended by the *Maintenance Act 1933* of the said Parliament), do now, under the powers conferred by the Maintenance Acts of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive

Council of the said State, hereby declare The Territory of New Guinea to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Maintenance Acts.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1934.

THE Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a Rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of One shilling and threepence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Shepparton Urban District.

All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

NETTING PERMITTED IN LAKE BOORT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation permit the use of nets for the purposes of taking fish in Lake Boort during the whole of each year, subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) The only nets to be used are set or mesh nets not exceeding 300 yards in length.
- (2) No person may use at the same time more than 300 yards of set or mesh net.

1. Regulation 8 of the Carpentry and Joinery Regulations (No. 2), as amended by Order of the Governor in Council made on the eighteenth day of August, 1931, shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the 20th day of July, 1934.

2. Such decision shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

“8. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall commence on the 20th day of July, 1934, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Act and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

- 1st year—at the rate of 19s. 0d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 23d. 9d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 33s. 3d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 42s. 9d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 57s. 0d. per week.”

5. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BY-LAW No. 58.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 58, for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and structures to be used as motor garages.
- (b) Repealing portions of building By-law 49 heretofore in force in the municipality inconsistent with or repugnant to the provisions of this By-law.
- (c) Imposing penalties for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law 49 (Buildings).

*Recital.*

Clause 8 of Part VI. of By-law 49 (distance of buildings from boundaries—motor garages), and the words “including motor garages” in the First Schedule to By-law 49, made by the Council on the 19th day of January, 1927, are hereby repealed, and the following provisions shall be read in lieu thereof:—

*Operation.*

This By-law shall, except where otherwise specified or indicated, apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell, and shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

*Private Motor Garages.*

1. No person shall erect or construct or cause to be erected or constructed any motor garage except in compliance with such of the provisions of this By-law as are applicable to the particular case.

2. Every motor garage within the areas prescribed as residential areas by By-law 52 and By-law 57 shall be distant not less than 4 feet from the side and rear boundaries of the land upon which it is erected, and in the case of a corner allotment not less than 25 feet from either of the streets which bound such allotment. Provided that a garage may be built at a less distance than 4 feet from a side or rear boundary if it is erected not less than 4 feet from a dwelling on the same allotment of land and 8 feet from any dwelling on any adjoining allotment and the wall adjacent to or abutting on any boundary is of approved fire-resisting material, and is provided with a parapet if required by the Council.

3. No motor garage within the areas prescribed as residential areas by By-law 52 and By-law 57 shall project beyond the front alignment of the dwelling to which it is appurtenant. Provided that where the space between the walls of an existing dwelling and the side boundary of the allotment is not sufficient to permit a vehicular drive-way from the front to the rear of the allotment, or where there is no means of access to the allotment at the rear thereof, or where steeply sloping land or any other special condition renders the erection of a garage at the rear or side of a dwelling impracticable—a motor garage may, with the approval of the Council by resolution, be built wholly or in part in front of the front alignment of the dwelling to which it is appurtenant. Any such garage shall not exceed 200 square feet in area, and shall be built in brick, stone, or concrete, and if so required by the Council the site of such garage shall be excavated to such level and provided with such retaining walls as may be directed by the surveyor.

4. Every motor garage on land fronting to or abutting upon any of the streets or roads or portions of streets or roads set out in the schedule to By-law 53 shall have walls of brick, stone, or concrete, except in any case where a dwelling existing at the date of the coming into force of this By-law is of timber, in which case a garage appurtenant thereto may be erected of approved material.

5. Where a garage is attached to or forms part of the structure of any dwelling, the provisions of By-law 49 with regard to distances of dwellings from boundaries and from other buildings shall be applicable to the garage as part of the dwelling.

6. No garage shall be constructed beneath a dwelling unless such dwelling and such garage are built of brick, stone, or concrete, and such garage is fire-isolated from the dwelling and ventilated in approved manner, and the materials and construction of such garage are such as to comply with the provisions of By-law 49 as if the garage were portion of the dwelling.

7. A garage may not be erected on any vacant allotment of land within 75 feet of the building line of the street or road to which such allotment has frontage.

8. No motor garage shall exceed one story in height, unless erected of approved fire-proof materials and in approved manner.

9. The floors of all motor garages shall be constructed of approved incombustible material.

10. Motor garages exceeding 300 square feet in ground area or with walls exceeding 10 feet in height shall have walls of brick, stone, or concrete, and shall comply with all the provisions of By-law 49 with regard to materials and construction and distances of buildings from boundaries. Except with the sanction of the Council, by resolution, no garage shall exceed 450 square feet in ground area.

11. Motor garages in areas other than those prescribed as residential areas by By-law 52 and By-law 57 shall have walls of brick, stone, or concrete, shall comply with all the provisions of By-law 49 with regard to materials and construction and distance of buildings from boundaries, and shall be provided with parapet walls if so required by the Council.

12. A garage shall not be built conjointly or combined with or attached to any workshop, shed, or other outbuilding unless the combined area of such building does not exceed 400 square feet, and such building as a whole is otherwise in accordance with this By-law.

13. Motor garages intended for the purpose of conducting the business of making, repairing, maintaining, or housing a number of motor vehicles shall comply with all the provisions of By-law 49 pertaining to shops.

14. In respect of motor garages, the following fees shall be payable under clause 8 of Part IV. of By-law 49:—

(c) Motor garages over three squares in area, per square or part of a square . . . . .	2. 0

15. Penalties.—Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after written notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence.

16. The Council, by resolution, may from time to time either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case, dispense with any of the requirements of this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 59.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 59 for:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings to be used as flats.
- (b) Repealing portions of building By-law 49 heretofore in force in the municipality inconsistent with or repugnant to the provisions of this By-law.
- (c) Imposing penalties for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law 49 (Buildings).

*Recital.*

Section 4 of Part XVII. of By-law 49 (residential flats), made by the Council on the 19th day of January, 1927, is hereby repealed, and the following provisions shall be read in lieu thereof:—

*Operation.*

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell, and shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

*Definitions.*

In this By-law, unless repugnant to or inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Approved" means approved by the surveyor.

"Flat" means a suite of rooms used or intended or adapted for use as a separate habitation, and comprised in a building containing one or more similar suites.

"Kitchenette" means a small room wherein food is cooked or prepared.

"Surveyor" means the building surveyor or other officer for the time being authorized to discharge the duties of building surveyor of the municipality.

*Flats.*

1. No person shall commence to erect, construct, or alter, or cause to be erected, constructed, or altered any building to be used or occupied as flats, except subject to the following special conditions, in addition to all the other provisions of By-law 49 which are not superseded by such special conditions.

2. Notice to be Given.—Twenty-one (21) days' notice of intention to erect, add to, or alter any building adapted or intended to be used as flats, or to adapt any building to be used as flats shall be submitted in writing to the building surveyor, together with properly prepared specifications and plans comprising ground plan, elevations, and sections of the proposed work or structure, and block plan of the land upon which it is proposed to erect, add to, alter, or adapt such building, showing the boundaries and dimensions of the land, the dimensions of the proposed building structure, addition, alteration, or adaptation, and the position thereof in relation to, and the distance thereof from the boundaries of the land, and any other building or buildings on the same or any adjoining allotment. All such specifications and plans shall be in duplicate. The plans shall be properly drawn in ink and to scale.

3. The wall of every such building hereafter to be erected or constructed shall throughout be constructed of brick, stone, or concrete, or such other fire-resisting material as may be approved.

4. Such buildings shall front the street or road to which the land has frontage shall not be erected except on allotments of land having in the case of a two-flat building a minimum frontage of 55 feet to some street or road, and a minimum area of 7,500 square feet in the case of a three-flat building a minimum frontage of 77 feet to some street or road, and a minimum area of 9,500 square feet, with an additional 2,000 square feet for each additional flat. In no case shall there be more than three flats on any floor, or more than nine flats on any allotment. No building comprising flats shall be erected on land having a less frontage to some street or road than 33 feet for each flat on the ground floor.

5. There shall be reserved to every block or group of flats for the exclusive use of the occupants thereof an area of open land equivalent to one-half of the total area of the allotment upon portion of which such building stands, and no alteration or addition shall be hereafter made which would reduce such open space to a less area.

6. Any such building shall not be erected in any unsewered area or in any street less than 40 feet wide. Any such building shall not exceed two stories in height in any street less than 50 feet wide, and shall in no part of the municipality exceed three stories in height.

7. A basement shall be deemed the equivalent of a storey.

8. The distance of such buildings shall be not less than 30 feet from the building line of the street or road to which the land has frontage, nor less than 7 feet from any other boundary in the case of a two-storey building, or 10 feet in the case of a three-storey building.

9. For the purposes of this By-law distances from boundaries shall be measured horizontally from the point of greatest projection of the building to the nearest point of the boundary.

10. Every flat or suite of rooms shall be in itself a complete dwelling, shall have a separate means of entrance or exit to the open air for the use of the occupants thereof, shall have a minimum area of 750 square feet, shall be provided with all necessary lavatory, sanitary, kitchen, and other accommodation, and shall have no dwelling room, except a kitchenette of less area than 60 square feet.

11. Every flat shall be so constructed that at least 80 per cent. of its outer wall area shall be open to light and air in such manner as is approved by the Council in each particular case.

12. Every flat or suite of rooms shall be self-contained and capable of separate occupation, shall have ceilings of fire-resisting material, and shall be sound-insulated and fire isolated in approved manner.

13. Every main entry stairway shall have a minimum "go" of 11 inches, a maximum "rise" of 7 inches, and be constructed in reinforced concrete, stone, or slate. Subsidiary or back stairways shall have a minimum "go" of 10 inches and a maximum "rise" of 7½ inches, and shall be constructed in approved material.

14. Floors of bathrooms, lavatories, and sanitary conveniences shall be of approved impervious material, and stairways, kitchens, bathrooms, lavatories, and sanitary conveniences shall have dados of tile, or of combinations of cement and plaster, or of other approved material with vitreous surface.

15. Laundries, garages, fuel-sheds, incinerators, and boiler-rooms may be detached from the main building, and in such cases one laundry shall be provided for every three flats.

16. Garages beneath flats shall be of approved fire-proof construction throughout.

17. All outbuildings of whatever kind or nature shall be built in brick or other approved fire-resisting material.

18. After receipt of notification that his intention to erect or alter has been approved by the Council or building surveyor, the owner or builder shall within fourteen days comply with the provisions of clause 8 of Part IV. of By-law 49, and commence work on such building.

19. Penalties.—Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings, and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after written notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence.

20. The Council, by resolution, may from time to time, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case, dispense with any of the requirements of this By-law.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 221, to amend By-law No. 136 for appointing stands in public places in the City of Melbourne for the sale of foodstuffs and flowers and for licensing and regulating street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in such goods.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall as from the time of its coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 136, intituled "A By-law for appointing stands in public places in the City of Melbourne for the sale of foodstuffs and flowers and for licensing and regulating street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in such goods," and any By-law amending the same.

2. Clause 2 of the said By-law No. 136 is hereby repealed, and the following clause shall be deemed to be inserted and read in lieu thereof:—

"2. (1) No person shall take up or occupy or sell or attempt to sell or assist in selling foodstuffs and/or flowers from any such stand or from any position on any such stand unless licensed to do so as hereinafter provided.

(2) No street hawker or itinerant trader shall use any street, road or public place within the area which is bounded as follows:—Commencing at the south-west corner of the intersection of Spencer and Flinders streets; thence at right angles across Flinders-street and along the west side of Spencer-street to the north side of Latrobe-street; thence along the north side of Latrobe-street to a point on the north side of Victoria-street where the north side of Latrobe-street and the east side of Spring-street would intersect if prolonged; thence at right angles across Victoria-street and along the east side of Spring-street to the south side of Flinders-street directly opposite; thence along the south side of Flinders-street to the east side of Swanston-street; thence along the east side of Swanston-street to the north-east corner of Prince's-bridge; thence at right angles across Swanston-street to the north-west corner of Prince's bridge;

thence along the west side of Swanston-street to the south side of Flinders-street; thence along the south side of Flinders-street to the commencing point, for the purpose of selling, offering, or exposing for sale therein any foodstuffs and/or flowers between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 o'clock midnight on any day not being a Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday, or at any time on Sundays, Christmas Day, or Good Friday, provided that this prohibition shall not prevent any hawk or itinerant trader who is licensed as hereinafter provided to sell or assist in selling foodstuffs and/or flowers from any such stand situated within the said area from selling or assisting in selling foodstuffs and/or flowers pursuant to such licence."
