NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE NETTING BOUNDARY NEAR THE MOUTH OF THE YARRA RIVER IN HOBSON'S BAY.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of October, 1907, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October, 1907, respecting netting in portion of Hobson's Bay, and in lieu thereof prohibiting the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in Hobson's Bay within or inside the area bounded as follows:—

Commencing at the north-east end of the Williamstown Breakwater Pier; thence by an imaginary line running in a northerly direction to the southernmost dolphin near the Prince's Pier, Port Melbourne; thence by an imaginary line running in a westerly direction to the junction of the small stone wall with the eastern training wall of the River Yarra.

NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen, a fishing boundary post will be erected at the last-mentioned point.

BY-LAW No. 3086.—RATES.—BARWON HEADS AND OCEAN GROVE URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE BELLARINE PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Barwon Heads and Ocean Grove Urban District within the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty-five shillings for the period hereinafter set out.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence for the period hereinafter set out.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period of six months beginning with the 1st day of January, 1934, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1934, and shall be payable on the 9th day of February, 1934, at the office of the said Commission, at Queenscliff.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

BY-LAW No. 3087.—RATES.—NEWSTEAD URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE NEWSTEAD WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

2. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Newstead Urban District within the Newstead Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Thirty shillings for the period hereinafter set out.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Five shillings for the period hereinafter set out.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period of six months beginning with the 1st day of January, 1934, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1934, and shall be payable on the 9th day of February, 1934, at the office of the said Commission at Castlemaine.

4. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF BUSH FIRE BRIGADES
COMMITTEE.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, by Order pursuant to section 6 of the *Bush Fire Brigades Act 1933*, direct that elections of persons to the Bush Fire Brigades Committee by the bush fire brigades shall be conducted in such manner as follows:—

1. In this Order—
 - “Act” means the *Bush Fire Brigades Act 1933* as amended by any Act.
 - “Minister” means the Minister of Forests.
 - “Committee” means the Bush Fire Brigades Committee.
 - “District” means bush fire district.
 - “Brigade” means registered bush fire brigade.
 - “Area” means that portion of the State of Victoria comprising any two districts which may be specified conjointly in section 6 of the Act for the election of a single representative on the Committee.
2. (a) Twenty-eight days at least before any election—
 - (i) the Minister shall cause the Returning Officer to be supplied with a list of the registered brigades situated in each district, together with the address of the secretary or other responsible officer of each brigade specified therein, which list shall be the roll of brigades entitled to vote at the ensuing election for such district; and
 - (ii) the Returning Officer shall notify the brigades entitled to vote as to the last day (hereinafter referred to as the “nomination day”) upon which nominations of persons proposed for election shall be received, and such day shall be not less than fourteen days before the election.

3. (a) Not later than twelve o'clock noon on nomination day any brigade the name of which appears on the roll may by letter addressed to the Returning Officer and signed by the President, Secretary, or Captain, after having been duly authorized by a majority of the members thereof present at a meeting of members called for such purpose and signed also by the person nominated in token of his consent to nomination, nominate a person for election to represent the area within which such brigade is situated.

(b) Any candidate may by letter addressed to the Returning Officer and received by the Returning Officer not later than twelve o'clock noon on nomination day withdraw from the election.

4. (a) Should only one person be nominated for any area, the Returning Officer shall report to the Minister the name of the person nominated.

(b) Should more than one person be nominated for any area, the Returning Officer shall cause ballot-papers to be prepared with the names of all the candidates inserted therein, and shall forthwith forward to each brigade within the area one such ballot-paper, and the President, Secretary, or Captain of each brigade, after having been duly authorized by a majority of the members thereof present at a meeting of members called for such purpose, shall mark the vote in the manner specified in the next succeeding paragraph of this Order, and shall then return the ballot-paper to the Returning Officer so as to reach him not later than four o'clock in the afternoon of the day of the election.

5. The voter shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on, as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference:

Provided that where there are only two candidates the requirements of this paragraph shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the voter's first preference only.

6. (a) The Returning Officer shall, in respect of such ballot-papers as have been received by him within the prescribed time, count the votes.

(b) The method of counting such votes and arriving at the result of the election shall, so far as it can be made applicable (*mutatis mutandis*), be in accordance with the provisions of the law for the time being prescribed for the election of members of the Legislative Assembly.

7. In any count of votes, the Minister shall decide which of two or more candidates having an equal number of votes is to be declared defeated, or give a casting vote in any final count, where two candidates have an equal number of votes.

8. After having ascertained the result of any election, the Returning Officer shall report the result to the Minister.

9. Ballot-papers relating to any election may be destroyed by the Returning Officer at any time after the expiration of one month following his report to the Minister.

10. The Returning Officer may, subject to the Minister, meet any contingency not provided for in this Order that may arise by taking such action in regard thereto as he deems reasonable or proper, and, in such cases, so far as it is possible so to do, he shall be guided by the practice followed at State parliamentary elections.

11. For the first elections of members of the Committee, the Minister may, with the object of expediting the conduct of such elections—

- (a) decide that the person authorized on behalf of any brigade to nominate a candidate or to vote shall be the President, Secretary, or Captain of such brigade, without calling a meeting of members to decide such nomination or vote; and
- (b) suspend or vary the operation of any of the provisions contained in paragraph 2 of this Order.

 - (c) organs of digestion;
 - (d) kidneys and ureter.
3. Dissect joints of a rabbit—
 - (a) ball and socket joint;
 - (b) hinge joint;
 - (c) study of muscles and their attachment.
4. Dissect the eye of an ox. Draw a diagram, and name the parts.
5. Draw a diagram of a sheep's brain which has been cut transversely.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LANDS RESERVED FOR PUBLIC GARDEN AND OTHER PURPOSES OF RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF WEDDERBURNE KNOWN AS "MARKET SQUARE EXTENSION" (ALLOTMENT 16, SECTION B, PARISH OF WEDDERBURNE).

THE Council of the Shire of Korong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the lands temporarily reserved for Public Garden and other purposes of Recreation in the Town of Wedderburne known as "Market Square Extension" having framed the following Regulations for the care,

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

CITY OF COBURG.

BY-LAW No. 51.

A By-law of the City of Coburg made under the provisions of Part VII., Division (1), of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered fifty-one, for regulating traffic on streets in the City of Coburg.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Coburg order as follows:—

Clause 1. No person not being a member of the Police Force or an officer or employee of the Council or other authorized public body, shall in any manner regulate, direct, or interfere with the traffic in any street or public place, or attempt so to do by signal, direction, or otherwise. Nor shall any such person, unless authorized, in writing, signed by the owner or driver of any vehicle which has been, or is proposed to be, left by the owner or driver thereof in any street or public place, assume the charge or custody of such vehicle, or remove the same from the position in which it has been left. Any person who signs such authority in writing shall be deemed to be the driver of the vehicle within the meaning of this By-law.

Clause 2. Any person who upon any parking area, or upon any street, without authority shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant, or other officer appointed by the Council to receive fees from drivers for parking motor cars, or who shall in any way assume the duties of a parking attendant or such other officer as aforesaid, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any parking area attendant, or other officer as aforesaid, in the execution of his duty under this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Clause 3. This By-law shall have force throughout the whole of the City of Coburg.

Clause 4. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 3rd day of May, 1933, and confirmed the 31st day of May, 1933.

CITY OF COBURG.

BY-LAW No. 52.

A By-law of the City of Coburg made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and section 10 of Act No. 3167, and numbered fifty-two, for prohibiting the temporary herding of cattle within certain areas within the Municipal District of the City of Coburg, and declaring such areas to be populous and residential areas.

ALL that area within the following boundaries:—

1. That the following areas within the Municipal District of the City of Coburg are hereby declared to be populous and residential areas, viz.:—The whole of the municipal district of the City of Coburg, save and except the areas described below:—

(a) All that area included within the following boundaries: Commencing at the north-east corner of Johnson-street and Moreland-road; thence northerly along Johnson-street to Brentwood-avenue; thence westerly along Brentwood-avenue to the Moonee Ponds Creek; thence in a general northerly direction following along the course of the creek to the intersection of the east boundary of the Pascoe Vale railway with the creek; thence along the east boundary of the railway line to O'Hea-street; thence easterly along O'Hea-street to Anderson-street; thence southerly along Anderson-street to Bell-street; thence westerly along Bell-street to Mitchell-parade; thence southerly along Mitchell-parade to Reynard's-road; thence easterly along Reynard's-road to Coonan's-road; thence south-westerly and southerly along Coonan's-road to Moreland-road; thence westerly along Moreland-road to the starting point at the north-east corner of Johnson-street and Moreland-road.

BY-LAW No. 30, MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE *Health Act 1928*.

A By-law for securing the cleanliness and general sanitary condition of Camps and Camping Sites within the Shire of Winchelsea.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928*, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea do hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be read and taken in conjunction with the "Camping Regulations 1928" of the Department of Public Health.

2. Every camp shall be provided with closet accommodation at the ratio of one closet for every eight persons, also separate accommodation for sexes.

3. Each closet shall consist of a flyproof receptacle for a suitable pan, except as in the next clause provided.

4. Where a camp is situated outside a pan-service area, a properly constructed trench may be substituted for a pan. Such trench shall not be more than three feet long nor more than one foot wide.

5. All closets must have overhead protection from the weather, and shall also have a suitable screen erected to provide for privacy and decency.

6. Provided that where land within a township or in the vicinity thereof is used as a camping site, the owner or trustees of such land shall erect thereon sufficient closets built according to the General Sanitary Regulations 1931. And if such site is within an area in which a pan service is provided, it shall be the duty of the owner or trustees to arrange with the sanitary contractor to provide the necessary service and to pay the necessary fees for such service.

7. All refuse and garbage produced at a camp or camp site shall, if such site is within an area provided with a house refuse service, be temporarily stored in covered receptacles, and arrangements made with the refuse contractor for its removal. If the camp site is not within such service, the refuse must be buried or burnt daily.

8. Upon the termination of any camp, the occupier or owner of the site shall cover all night-soil and refuse trenches with at least nine inches of clean earth.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Winchelsea.
