By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 17 of the *Dairy Products Act 1933* (No. 4204) doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. The Regulations under the abovementioned Act made on the fifth day of June, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as the "said Regulations"), are hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) In Regulation 1 the definition "disposed of" is deleted.
- (b) Regulations 11 and 12 are deleted.
- (c) At the end of Regulation 13 there shall be inserted the words "or any other person authorized by the Board."
- (d) For Regulation 20 there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"20. (1) Every manufacturer shall on or before the 10th day of each month make and furnish to the Board in respect of the month immediately preceding a return relating to dairy products in Form No. 1 or Form No. 1A (as the case may require) in the Schedule or in such other form as is determined by the Board.

(2) Every agent shall on or before the 10th day of each month make and furnish to the Board in respect of the month immediately preceding a return relating to dairy products in Form No. 2 or Form No. 2A (as the case may require) in the Schedule or in such other form as is determined by the Board.

(3) Dealers, when requested by the Board so to do, shall furnish returns of dairy products in accordance with Form No. 3 or Form No. 3A (as the case may require) contained in the Schedule hereto or in such other form as is determined by the Board.

(4) Every tinner shall on or before the 10th day of each month make and furnish to the Board in respect of the month immediately preceding a return relating to dairy products in Form No. 4 or Form No. 4A (as the case may require) in the Schedule or in such other form as is determined by the Board.

(5) Every processor shall on or before the 10th day of each month make and furnish to the Board in respect of the month immediately preceding a return relating to dairy products in Form No. 5 or Form No. 5A (as the case may require) in the Schedule or in such other form as is determined by the Board.

(6) Any person who fails, neglects, or refuses to make any return required to be made by these Regulations, or who wilfully makes any false statement or knowingly gives any misleading particulars in any such return, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than fifty pounds."

2. After Regulation 22 of the said Regulations there shall be added the following Regulation:—

"23. The Board may by notice in writing require any manufacturer to make a return in writing setting out the names of all persons to whom such manufacturer has during the period stated in such notice sold any dairy products and the quantity sold to each person named, in the case of his intra-state trade or commerce within Victoria, his interstate trade or commerce, and his overseas trade or commerce."

REGULATION No. 14.

Footpath Crossings.

A Regulation of the City of Heidelberg made under the *Local Government Act 1928*, by virtue of a By-law No. 35 of the above-named City, and numbered 14, fixing the width, inclination, and depression of crossings, and materials of which same are to be constructed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg do hereby order and direct:—

1. That Regulation No. 13 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. That crossing over footways shall be flush with the footway for one-third of the width of the footway, and shall then fall with a gradual inclination to the invert of the channel, and from there continue towards the roadway on an upward gradient for a distance equal to the width of existing channel, and having the same inclination to the invert as the existing channel.

3. Crossings shall be constructed the full width of the gateway, but in no case less than 9 feet wide.

4. All crossings must be constructed of concrete 6 inches deep in the case of crossings to be used by commercial vehicles, and 4 inches deep for other vehicles.

5. Concrete shall consist of one part of Portland cement (93 lbs. to be taken as a measure for 1 cubic foot) to 2 parts by measure of clean sand, and 4 parts of 1½ approved metal, free from dirt or other impurities. Concrete to be laid on 2 inches of sand or ashes.

6. Where required by the engineer, concrete shall be reinforced with ½-in. diameter mild steel bars at 9-in. centres both ways.

7. Where kerbing has been cut away to permit the construction of a crossing, new return kerbing shall be constructed on each side of the crossing to the same specification as existing kerbing. Kerbing shall be returned on a radius of not less than 18 inches, and tapered so that top meets rising gradient of crossing in a manner least likely to cause inconvenience to pedestrians and to the engineer's approval.

8. Crossings shall be graded with metal or bituminous metal (according to the construction of the existing road) from the outer edge of concrete to the crown of the road.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clauses, if in the opinion of the engineer it be impracticable to grade a crossing from the footpath to the invert of the channel, he may require the person applying for permission to construct the crossing to supply him with a plan and specification of a reinforced concrete or pipe culvert, showing clearly the depth of invert below the footpath at the fence line, below the top of the kerb and below the crown of the road, plan shall also show the longitudinal gradients and the proposed waterway. Should the engineer consider the proposal satisfactory, he may approve of the culvert crossing with or without alterations to the plans and specifications.

The Resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council on the 10th day of October, 1934, and confirmed on the 20th day of November, 1934.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

By-LAW No. 94.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered ninety-four, for prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 52 is hereby repealed.

2. No person being the owner or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence, and not being land herein-after excepted from the operation of this By-law unless such cattle are securely tethered in such a manner as not to be able to reach any of the boundaries of such land.

3.
