## DETERMINATION OF THE STOREMEN, PACKERS, AND SORTERS BOARD.

This Determination on the 30th November, 1934, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Order in Council made thereunder extending such Metropolitan District, such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included in the said Metropolitan District: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrambool: the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; the town of Newtown and Chilwell: and such portion of the area vested in or under the control of the State Electricity Commission as is within a radius of one mile and a half of the Yallourn Post Office.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which now has the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid—

(a) to any person employed-

(i) as a Storeman, Packer, or Sorter,(ii) in assisting a Storeman, Packer, or Sorter,

(iii) as an assembler, collector, or checker of goods in course of receipt or despatch,

(b) to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at wiping eggs in any place where eggs are stored, sorted or packed for trade or sale,

but not including any person subject to the jurisdiction of any of the following Boards:-Millet Broom Board

(5) TEMPORARY WORK IN BOND OF FREE STORES OR ESTABLISHMENTS ENGAGED IN THE GENERAL BULK STORAGE BUSINESS.— Temporary employees, i.e., persons employed in Bond or Free Stores or Establishments engaged in the general bulk storage business for less than four weeks, shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 2d. per hour, and such employees shall be guaranteed not less than two hours' work at

(7) HOURS OF WORK IN BREAD-MAKING ESTABLISHMENTS.—The number of hours to be worked in Bread-making Establishments on each night between 9 p.m. and 7.30 a.m. shall not exceed-

(8) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done—

(a) by persons employed in Bread-making Establishments—

(9) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS-

(a) Bond or Free Stores or Establishments engaged in the General Bulk Storage Business—

(i) 6s. per hour shall be paid for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday, and (ii) for all work done on all other statutory or gazetted public holidays observed by the Customs Authority, weekly employees shall be paid at the rate of double time in addition to their weekly wage and temporary employees shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(b) Any Other Place

Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Anzac Day (in industries named in the Second Schedule to the Anzac Day Act 1928), King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the days so substituted.

(10) Time Rate.—Any person (other than (a) those in potato or onion stores, bond or free stores or establishments engaged in the general bulk storage business, on wharfs, or in wharf sheds, customs railways sheds or fumigating sheds, or (b) juvenile workers engaged exclusively at egg wiping) employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination be paid—

(a) in any week in which two or more
Public Holidays occur
(b) in any other week At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.

At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum. (11) RESTRICTION AS TO FEMALES LIFTING HEAVY WEIGHTS.—The maximum weight to be lifted by any female over 18 years of

employed in an Egg Store, shall be thirty pounds. (12) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT. -- Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or

(13) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 150 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices for wholly or partly packing or sorting any articles for which wages rates are fixed, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

#### ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS APPLICABLE ONLY TO-

(A) FEMALES EMPLOYED AT WIPING, PACKING, SORTING, OR TESTING EGGS.

- (14) REST PERIODS.—A rest period of ten minutes in the forenoon and ten minutes in the afternoon shall be given all female workers without any deduction from wages
  - (15) TEA MONEY.—Females required to work overtime shall receive 1s, tea money on each occasion of working overtime.
  - (B) Persons Employed in Bond or Free Stores or Establishments Engaged in the General Bulk Storage Business.

(16) MEAL HOURS .- Meal hours shall be as follows :--

Dinner: One hour between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

Tea: 5 p.m. to 6 p.m.
Each employer shall fix the meal hour, which shall not be altered without seven days' notice to the employees.

- (17) Meal Hour Rates.—All meal hours if worked shall, except as otherwise provided, be paid for at double rates, such rates to be continued until such time as the meal hour has been allowed, provided that should work not continue after 6 p.m. meal hour rate shall not apply.
- (18) MEAL ALLOWANCE.—Employees called upon to work overtime after 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday or 1 p.m. on Saturday shall receive a meal allowance of 2s.
- (19) Holidays.—Weekly employees shall be entitled to all statutory or gazetted public holidays observed by the Customs Authority without any deduction from the weekly pay.
- (20) Carrying Heavy Goods.—Temporary employees when receiving and carrying continuously for one hour or more bagged stuff, case goods, or other packages exceeding 180 lb. in weight shall be paid 6d. per hour above the ordinary rates, provided that when carrying 10-bushel bags of bran, both temporary employees and weekly employees shall be paid 9½d. per hour above the ordinary rates.
- (C) PERSONS EMPLOYED IN ELECTRICAL ENERGY UNDERTAKINGS. (21) Annual Holidays.—Persons employed in Electrical Energy Undertakings in all parts of Victoria to which this Determination applies, other than at Yallourn, shall be granted two weeks' holiday each year on full pay.
