UNIVERSITY ACT 1933.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V., intituled the *University Act 1933*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Saturday, the fifteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, as the day upon which the *University Act 1933* shall come into operation in the State of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

LICENSING OF ELECTRICAL MECHANICS
REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING FORMS OF ELECTRICAL MECHANICS'
LICENCES.

WHEREAS by section 19 of the *State Electricity Commission of Victoria Act 1928*, as amended by section 11 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1934*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Commission may, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make Regulations for or with respect to the examination and licensing of electrical mechanics, and the annual renewal of such licences and prescribing forms of licences. And whereas the State Electricity Commission of Victoria has, with the approval of the Governor in Council, made Regulations for or with respect to the examination and licensing of electrical mechanics and the annual renewal of such licences and cited as the Licensing of Electrical Mechanics Regulations 1934, which Regulations were published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of November, 1934: Now therefore the Commission, in pursuance of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (4) of the said section 19 of the said Act, hereby makes the following Regulations for or with respect to prescribing the forms of electrical mechanics' licences, and submits the same for approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that is to say:—

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Licensing of Electrical Mechanics Regulations (Forms of Licences) Regulations 1934, and shall be read and construed as one with the Licensing of Electrical Mechanics Regulations 1934, and may be cited together with those Regulations as the "Licensing of Electrical Mechanics Regulations 1934."

Form of Licence.

2. An electrical mechanic's licence issued by the Commission under the Licensing of Electrical Mechanics Regulations 1934 for an electrical mechanic of any grade shall be in the form respectively set out in the schedule hereto for that grade with such variations as the circumstances may require.

Form of Renewal of Licence.

3. A renewal of any licence shall be in the same form as the original licence, and shall bear the word "Renewal" printed diagonally across the front.

This licence entitles of to carry out or engage in electrical wiring work of every description throughout the State of Victoria.

This licence is issued subject to the provisions of the Licensing of Electrical Mechanics Regulations 1934, by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, on the day of 1934, and expires on the thirty-first day of December, 1934.

The following extracts from the Licensing of Electrical Mechanics Regulations 1934 are quoted for convenience of reference:—

Regulation—

24. Every licence shall be and remain the property of the Commission.

26. The holder of a licence of any grade shall deliver such licence to the Commission before he will be granted a licence of another grade.

27. In addition to and notwithstanding any penalty which may be inflicted under these Regulations or otherwise, if the holder of a licence under these Regulations of any grade—

- (a) has procured such licence by making or causing to be made or produced any false and fraudulent declaration, certificate or representation, either in writing or otherwise; or
- (b) has been convicted of a breach or breaches of these Regulations or of the Wiring Regulations or of a criminal offence which breach breaches or offence is or are of such a nature as to render it, in the opinion of the Commission, undesirable that he should continue to hold such licence—

the Commission may cancel or suspend such licence or, at its discretion, may issue to him in its place a licence of another grade.

29. Every electrical mechanic who changes his address shall immediately notify the Commission in writing of his new address.

32. Any electrical mechanic who—

- (a) fails to deliver to the Commission as required under these Regulations any licence; or
- (b) fails to produce his licence as required by Regulation 30 of these Regulations; or
- (c) fails to notify any change of address as required by Regulation 29 of these Regulations—

shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. Every person who, being the holder of a licence of a particular grade, carries out or engages in electrical wiring work of a kind or in a manner otherwise than in conformity with the authority conferred by such licence, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

THE Dental Board of Victoria with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council does hereby make the following regulations under the provisions of section 43 (1) (c) and (d) of the *Medical Act 1928*, Part II., with respect to the keeping of the Dentists' Register, and the registration in the register:—

1. (a) The Dentists' Register shall contain in addition to the contents required by sections 44, 48, and 59 of the *Medical Act 1928*, Part II., the following further contents in a separate column under the heading of "Further Particulars," viz., such further dental qualifications, dental degrees, dental diplomas, and dental certificates as the Dental Board shall from time to time authorise the Registrar of the Board to insert in the Register in connection with the registration of any particular dentist.

(b) The Registrar of the Dental Board on being so authorised by the Board shall insert in the Register in the column headed "Further Particulars," and in connection with the registration of the particular dentist referred to, the said additional qualifications, degrees, diplomas, and certificates.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria held on the fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

- (i) In regulation 12 (b), (c), (d), (e) (including the diagram of label contained in that clause), and (h), and in regulations 14 (a), 28 (b), 43 and 44, for the word "wireman" wheresoever it appears there shall be substituted the words "electrical mechanic".
- (ii) In regulation 12 (b) for the word "wiremen" there shall be substituted the words "electrical mechanics".
- (iii) In regulation 12 (c) for the words "under the Licensing of Wiremen Rules for the time being in force under the Act" there shall be substituted the words "granted or renewed under regulations for the time being in force made under section 11 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1934".

(iv) In regulation 43 for the words "under the Licensing of Electric Wiremen Rules" there shall be substituted the words "granted or renewed under regulations for the time being in force made under section 11 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1934".

(v) In regulations 44 and 46 for the words "under the said Rules" there shall be substituted the words "granted or renewed under regulations for the time being in force made under section 11 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1934".

REGULATION No. 4.

A Regulation of the City of Chelsea numbered 4 made under section 4 of Part VI. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1928* in force in the city by virtue of a By-law of the above-named city numbered 23, and also by virtue of Part XXXVII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* for regulating the conditions under which dancing saloons may be registered.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and all other powers thereunto enabling it, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Chelsea make the following Regulations which shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Chelsea.

1. No person shall run or conduct a dancing saloon unless such dancing saloon has been registered in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

2. Every person desiring to obtain a certificate of registration of any dancing saloon shall make written application to the Council for such certificate in accordance with the provisions contained in Part XXXVII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*.

3. Fourteen days before the issue of any such certificate as aforesaid, the applicant shall at his or her own expense give notice by advertising in some newspaper to be named and appointed by the Council and circulating in the Municipal District of the City of Chelsea of the applicant's intention to apply for such certificate.

4. A certificate of registration shall entitle the premises or buildings so registered as aforesaid to be conducted as a dancing saloon from the first day of January until the thirty-first day of December of the year in which such certificate as aforesaid shall have issued.

5. The holder of a certificate of registration as mentioned in paragraph four hereof may on payment of the prescribed fee and before the date of expiry of the said certificate have such certificate renewed for a further period of twelve months.

6. Any certificate which has not been renewed before the date of expiry thereof shall be deemed to have lapsed and expired, and any person being the holder of such lapsed or expired certificate desiring to apply for a certificate of registration in connexion with the building or premises for which such lapsed or expired certificate was issued shall make application for a certificate of registration under the provisions of Part XXXVII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* and of this regulation and follow the procedure therein stated notwithstanding the fact that a certificate of registration had previously been issued.

7. A dancing saloon may be open for the purpose of dancing on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each and every week from ten o'clock in the forenoon until midnight, provided that on the written permission of the Town Clerk of the said city, the dancing saloon may be kept open for a specified number of hours outside of the hours fixed herein, provided always that the Town Clerk shall not be entitled to enlarge such period of time beyond that of 2 o'clock in the morning of any week day save and except that of Sunday.

8. No dancing shall take place in any building or premises for which a certificate of registration has been issued on any Sunday.

9. No dancing shall take place in any building for which a certificate of registration has been issued between the hours of two o'clock in the morning or forenoon and midnight on any Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Anzac Day.

10. Subject to the provisions of paragraph seven hereof, no dancing saloon shall be open or used for the purpose of dancing between the hours of midnight and ten o'clock in the forenoon on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday or Saturday.

11. Any officer of the Council appointed for that purpose may inspect the premises at any time whatsoever.

12. No structural alteration of any kind shall be made to the building or premises in respect whereof a certificate of registration has been issued under these Regulations without the consent, in writing, of the Council first had and obtained.

13. Should any person being the holder of such certificate of registration as aforesaid transfer, assign, or sublet the premises in respect whereof such certificate has issued, such certificate shall lapse unless the Council amends the said certificate by endorsing thereon the name of the transferee and the prescribed transfer fee shall have been paid.

14. No intoxicating liquor shall be brought into or consumed on the premises.

15. Good order and conduct shall be observed in any registered dancing saloon.

16. The fees payable shall be:—

For the registration of premises for any year or portion thereof	... £1 0 0
For the transfer of any certificate	... 0 5 0

17. Person shall include "owner" or "occupier". Dancing saloon shall mean and include "premises where dancing is conducted for which a fee of admission is charged."

18. Regulation number two of the City of Chelsea shall be and the same is hereby wholly repealed.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 14th day of December, 1934, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham and the Shire of Braybrook as are not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since the twenty-third day of July, 1934, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—

(a) the process, trade, or business of a maker of—

(i) agricultural machinery or implements;

(ii) parts of agricultural machinery or implements;

(iii) bag-filling machinery, bone-crushers, butter-making machinery, chaff-cutters, corn-crushing machinery, cream separators, hay presses, horse works, iron feeding troughs, lawn mowers, machinery for treating flax or hemp, maize shellers, windmills; or

(iv) garden tools or implements or parts thereof;

(b) assembling or putting together any parts of machinery or implements of classes or kinds (whether the same have been made inside or outside the State) same or similar to those mentioned in paragraph (a),"

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 14th day of December, 1934, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

DEFINITIONS—

Juvenile Workers—

Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed—

- (a) Finning, pointing, heating, and cutting off.
- (b) Screwing and tapping bolts in any department.
- (c) Holding-up.
- (d) Striking for apprentices to blacksmithing.
- (e) Working ungeared drilling machines, drilling holes up to and inclusive of $\frac{7}{8}$ -in. diameter.
- (f) Process workers engaged in the making of garden tools, garden implements, or parts thereof.

Assemblers—

Any adult person employed in putting together any of the classes or kinds of machinery or implements affected by the Determination, and which have been previously fitted or so standardized as to require no fitting; but shall not include any adult person employed in cutting or shaping the material of which such machinery or implements are composed.

(3) OVERTIME—

- (a) For all time of duty, before the usual commencing time, or after the usual finishing time, or in excess of 8 hours 45 minutes on any of the five days, Monday to Friday inclusive, or in excess of 4 hours 30 minutes on Saturday, an employee shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.
- (b) In computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.
- (c) When an employer requires overtime to be worked in excess of one hour, employees shall be allowed 30 minutes for crib time after the ordinary ceasing time, and before commencing such overtime. After an employee has worked four hours' overtime, he shall be entitled to a further 30 minutes for crib time. Provided that such crib time shall not be deemed to be part of the time worked.
- (d) Should an employee be required to work overtime for any period in excess of one hour after the usual time of ceasing duty, he shall either be supplied with a meal at the employer's expense, or be allowed 2s. for each meal required, if the expense is incurred. Provided that this clause shall not apply where the employee was notified the previous day of the intention to work such overtime. Provided further that where the employee was notified the previous day of the intention to work overtime, and such overtime was not worked, he shall be entitled to the meal allowance provided in this clause.
- (e) When an employee is recalled to work after leaving the premises, he shall be paid as for three hours' overtime at the least.
- (f) When an employee is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at full ordinary rates from the time he is required to hold himself in readiness, and does do so.
- (g) When an employee is required for duty during the meal interval, he shall be paid at overtime rate until he is allowed the usual length of time for a meal, unless he is allowed twenty minutes for crib, and is paid at the overtime rate for the balance of the meal interval worked by him.

(4) SHIFT WORK—

- (a) The ordinary hours of duty of employees engaged on shift work shall not (without payment for overtime) exceed 48 hours per week, or eight consecutive hours on each of six days in a week, or 9 hours 36 consecutive minutes on each of five nights in a week Monday to Friday inclusive. All time of duty in excess of such eight hours per day or 9 hours 36 minutes per night respectively shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (b) Employees required for duty for a shift other than a day shift shall be paid at the rate of 1s. 6d. a shift additional to the ordinary rate of pay for the first four weeks, and 1s. a shift additional to the ordinary rate of pay thereafter.
- (c) One shift only in each 24 hours shall be deemed to be a day shift.
- (d) A night shift shall not be worked on Saturday night or Sunday night.

(5) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Time and three-quarters shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) **PIECE-WORK.**—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 150 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions; and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 9 (DRAPERS AND MEN'S CLOTHING).

NOTE.—1. On the 9th March, 1921, this Board was appointed in lieu of the Drapers Board and the Men's Clothing Board.

2. (b) goods usually sold by drapers or haberdashers, including mantles, costumes, millinery, gloves, stockings, and underclothing,"
