VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 324.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Act 1928, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The Victorian Railways Commissioners will make special rates for the carriage of goods in quantities in the following circumstances and conditions, namely:—

- That the Commissioners are satisfied that it is advisable to do so for the purpose of conserving their traffic or regaining traffic to their railways from any competitive form of transport whether existing or otherwise;
- (2) That a written undertaking shall be given to the Commissioners that in consideration of his being granted such special rates the person giving such undertaking will during a period specified by the Commissioners use for the carriage of goods between the points specified in the undertaking only—
 - (a) an available railway service; or
 - (b) a commercial goods vehicle duly licensed by the Transport Regulation Board (and then only for commodities specified in the licence) but not including a commercial goods vehicle licensed by the said Board pursuant to paragraph (g) of Section 22 of the Transport Regulation Act 1933.

Marine Act 1928.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF LIFE AND OF THE PROPERTY OF PASSENGERS AND OTHERS.

TN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1928, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following. that is to say:—

- 1. Short Title.—These Regulations may be cited as the "Regulations for the Protection of Life and of the Property of Passengers and Others 1934."
- 2. Commencement.—These Regulation shall take effect on and from the date of publication hereof in the Government Gazette.
- 3. Smoking on Vehicular Ferries.—No person shall smoke, strike matches or ignite any inflammable substance whilst on board a vehicular ferry within any port in Victoria.
- 4. Exhibiting Lights.—(a) No person shall display a coloured light on any vehicle using a vehicular ferry plying within any port in Victoria; and
- (b) No person shall display on any vehicle using a vehicular ferry plying within any port in Victoria any light which tends to endanger navigation or which the master of the ferry, or any person acting on his behalf, has ordered to be extinguished.
- 5. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held on the sixth day of December, 1934.

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

259. When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure I opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference. of his preference.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

260. Notwithstanding anything contained in the last preceding section, at any election where there are only two candidates the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preserence only.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

281. (1) A ballot-paper shall be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate, and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided, a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section, but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

262. At elections where there are only two candidates section 144 of the Local Government Act 1928 shall have full force and effect.

Procedure to Ascertain the Number of Votes where more than Two Candidates.

- 283. At an election where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward or riding (as the case may be) to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as

 - (a) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling booth at which each presides shall, in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other person—

 (i) open each ballot-box at such polling booth; (ii) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in a separate parcel all those on which first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates, omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected;

 (iii) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively;

 - each candidate respectively;

 (iv) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and (v) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

Duties of Deputies.

- (b) Each deputy shall in respect of the polling booth at which he presides
- ch deputy shall in respect of the polling booth at which he presides—

 (i) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate verified as well by the signature of the deputy and the poll clerk (if any) as by the signatures of such of the scrutineers as are present and consent to sign the same;

 (ii) make out an account verified as aforesaid in which such deputy shall charge himself with the number of ballot-papers originally delivered to him specifying therein the number thereof delivered to and used by voters and the number not so delivered or left unused and the number set aside for separate custody and the number cancelled as spoilt;

 (iii) make up in one parcel the ballot-papers which have been used in voting at his polling booth during the election; in another separate parcel the ballot-papers which have remained unused thereat; in another separate parcel the ballot-papers which have been set aside for separate custody thereat and also the ballot-papers cancelled as spoilt; and in another separate parcel the certified copies of rolls supplied to the said deputy signed by him or (as the case may be) the copies of rolls certified by the said deputy, and all books, rolls, and papers kept or used by him during the polling;

 (iv) seal up the said several parcels and permit any scrutineer who desires so to do to affix his seal to such parcels;

 (v) endorse the said parcels severally with a description of the contents thereof and with the name of the division or subdivision and polling booth, and the date of polling, and sign his name to such endorsement; and

 (vi) transmit such list and such account and such sealed parcels to the returning officer as required by section 144 of the Local Government Act 1928.

Duties of Returning Officer at Polling Booth at which he Presides.

- (c) The returning officer shall in respect of the polling booth at which he presides—
 - (i) make out a list of first preference votes given for each candidate and a like account of the ballot-papers as herein required, in the case of deputies duly verified by the signatures of the returning officer, the poll clerk (if any), and of such of the scrutineers as are present and consent to sign the same; and
 - (ii) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers, books, rolls, and papers used by him during the polling, and endorse the same in like manner as is herein required in the case of denuties deputies.
- (d) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
 - (i) ascertain from the list made out by himself as aforesaid, and from the certified lists re-ceived from the deputies, the number of first preference votes given for each candidate;
 - and

 (ii) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the first preference votes given for each candidate by allowed postal ballot-papers, so as to ascertain the number of first preference votes given for each candidate respectively.

Where Results Ascertained on First Count.

(e) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes, if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary), shall by the returning officer be declared duly elected as hereinafter provided.

Declaration as to Defeated Candidate and First Distribution of Preferences.

- (f) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer, upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputies and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary, shall, in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present, and the poll clerk (if any), but of no other person—
 - (i) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers; and

(ii) arrange such ballot-papers, together with the allowed postal ballot-papers, by placing in a separate parcel all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates, omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected, and shall declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference. voters' preference.

After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascer-

Further Declarations and Distributions of Preferences.

(g) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes In o candidate then has an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer) the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference, shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) and such candidate shall be declared duly elected as hereinafter provided. after provided.

Provision for Equality of Votes and Casting Vote.

(h) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated, the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated, and if on the final count two candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in such case have the casting vote, but, except as provided in paragraphs (e) and (y) and in this paragraph, shall not vote at such election.

Adjournment of Count of Votes.

264. (1) If on the date of the polling at any election the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(2) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer deems necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, Ac., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

(3) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes-(a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballotboxes; and

(b) the returning officer shall then, in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present, seal such ballot-box or boxes, and before recommencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited, unbroken, to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

Declaration of Election.

265. In declaring a candidate duly elected the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the Local Government Act 1928 shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets According to Class, and Sealed, &c.

267. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the Local Government Act 1928.

Deposit Moneys.

205. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the Local Government Act 1928, altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Mode of Voting by Means of Postal Ballot-papers.

280. The following directions for regulating voting by means of postal ballot-papers shall be substantially observed:—

(1) The elector shall exhibit his postal ballot-paper (in blank) to an authorized witness.

(2) The elector shall in the presence of the authorized () witness, but so that the witness cannot 'see' the

First write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and write the figure 1 against such sur-name; and also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates, numbering them 2, 3, 4 and so on in the order of his preference.

Provided that where there are only two candidates the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written by him on the ballotpaper.

(3) In the case of more candidates than one having the same surname the elector shall also insert in the ballot-paper the christian or other names of the candidate for whom he votes, and if the surname and christian or other names of two or more candidates are the same they shall be distinguished by the addition of their residence and occupation. (2)

(4) If the elector's sight is so impaired that he is unable to vote without assistance, the authorized witness, at the request of the elector, shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper, and shall (if the elector so desires) mark the same in the presence of another person.

(5) The elector shall, then refold the ballot-paper and fasten the same.

(6) The elector shall then sign his name in his own handwriting on the counterfoil in the place provided for the signature of the voter.

A By law of the City of Sandringham made under section 80 of the *Health Act* 1928, and numbered 95, for regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any animals in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928, the Mayor. Councillors, and Citizens of the municipality order as follows :-

1. No person shall at any time in any portion of the City of Sandringham keep or place or allow to be kept or placed within 30 feet of any portion of any dwelling-house or place of living or sleeping any cow or cows horse or horses.

2. No person shall, except as hereinafter provided, keep or place or allow to be kept or placed at any time any cows or horses on a less area of enclosed land than 6,250 square feet per animal

feet per animal.

ret per animal.

Provided, however, that more than one cow or one horse may be kept on a less area of open land than 6,250 square feet, if such animals are securely housed in a stable or confined in an enclosure which is paved in bricks, concrete pitchers, flags, or other material to the satisfaction of the Council.

3. No person shall keep or place or allow to be kept or placed on any land within the boundaries of the City of Sandringham any bull for stud purposes unless such animal while accompanied by other cattle is confined within a structure approved by the Council.

4. This By-law shall, save as herein otherwise provided, apply to the whole of the municipal district of Sandringham and shall come into force on the day after its publication in the Government Gazette.

5. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law will upon conviction be liable to a penalty of not more than £2 per animal so kept or placed or allowed to be kept or placed. (Maximum penalty, £20).

BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

By-law No. 65.

By-law for securing the cleanliness and general sanitary
 condition of camps and camping sites within the Borough
 of Portland.

TN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portland do hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be read and taken in conjunction with the "Camping Regulations 1927" of the Department of Public

Health.

2. Every camp shall be provided with closet accommodation at the rate of one closet for the first 15 persons and thereafter at the rate of one closet for every additional 25 persons or portion of 25 persons after the first 15 persons. And, in addition, in the case of closets for males, there shall be provided one urinal for any number of males up to 15 and one additional urinal for every subsequent 25 males or portion of 25 males, provided that where a trough or similar urinal is in use every complete 18 inches of available length of such trough shall be deemed to be one urinal.

3. The construction of all closets in camps within a pan service area shall be similar in every respect to that provided in the General Sanitary Regulations of the Department of Public Health. In the case of urinals such shall be so

arranged as to discharge into a pit or trench situated at its lowest point not less than 3 feet deep filled to within 9 inches of the surface of the ground with scoria or loose rubble covered with not less than 9 inches of clean earth.

The interior of all closets and urinals shall be effectively screened from public view.

4. Where a camp is situated outside a pan service area and proposely constructed transh way he exhibited for a pan and

properly constructed trench may be substituted for a pan and such trench shall not be more than 3 feet in length and 1 foot in width. Closets in such areas shall have suitable overhead protection from the weather and shall also be suitably screened

protection from the weather and shall also be suitably screened from public view to secure privacy and decency.

5. No person shall camp upon any street or road within the municipality nor upon any reserve excepting those specially reserved for camping purposes.

6. Where the site of a camp is within an area provided with a house refuse service, all refuse and garbage shall be stored temporarily in covered receptacles and the owner or occupier shall arrange for such to be cleared as often as required.

All refuse and garbage produced at a camp site which is not situated within a house refuse service area, shall be buried or burnt daily. Upon the termination of any camp the occupier or owner of the site shall cover nightsoil and refuse trenches with at least 9 inches of clean earth.

7. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the Borough of Portland.
