BY-LAW No. 51.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* for the control of the parking of cars.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

The Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale hereby appoints the following sites as parking areas for motor cars and other vehicles other than horse drawn:—

1. *Main-street, Township of Bairnsdale*.—The whole of the right-hand or street reserves side of the carriage way.
2. *Bailey, Nicholson, and Service Streets*.—In the centre of the street at right angles to the street line.
3. In all other streets in the street channels on the kerb line.
4. All vehicles not parked in areas as described above shall be drawn up close to the kerb in such a manner as to be wholly within an imaginary line drawn nine feet from and parallel to the kerb, and shall not remain in such position for a longer period than twenty minutes.
5. No truck with a capacity of over half a ton will be allowed to park in Main-street.
