BY-LAW No. 3089.—RATES.—QUAMRATOOK URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE QUAMRATOOK WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

3. The charge for water troughs shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

4. The charge for water supplied at stand-pipe shall be Nine-pence per load of 180 gallons.

That the said Order in Council bearing date the 28th day of April, 1892, as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby amended as follows:—For the words “the Councillors for the time being for the Romsey and Monegeetta Ridings of the Shire of Romsey and one other person” there shall be substituted the words “the Councillors for the time being of the Romsey Riding of the Shire of Romsey and two other persons”.

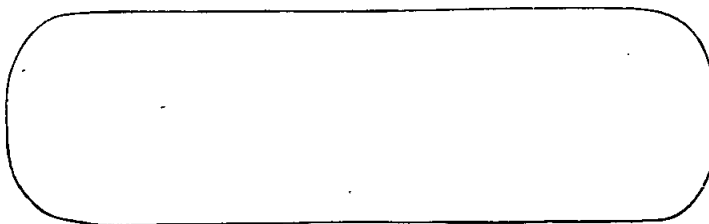

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LAKE OMEO RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently

reserved by Order in Council of 23rd October, 1933, as a site for Public purposes in the Parish of Hinnomunjie, and known as Lake Omeo Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean "cattle" as interpreted by section. 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall hold sports or entertainments of any kind on the Reserve for the purpose of gain without the written permission of the Committee of Management.
10. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve except those portions specially set apart for the purpose, and then only subject to payment of such fees and to such other conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.
11. All fees received for camping or any other purpose shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
12. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which would injure any person.
13. No person shall take into or remove from the Reserve, or have in his possession whilst in the Reserve, any ferns, trees, or any other vegetation.
14. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve.
15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sums which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

1. 2. 3. 4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licence therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. 9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act* 1928, the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.

CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 45.

A By-law of the City of Oakleigh, made under the provisions of section 198 of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 45, for the purpose of—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Regulating, restricting, or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade, or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.
- (e) Regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or fixed to or painted on any hoarding, or on any building, or on any fence or tree.
- (f) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1. All provisions relating to "hoardings" contained in By-laws Nos. 18 and 25 are hereby repealed.

2. In this By-law—

"Hoarding" means structure used for the exhibition of advertisements, and includes sky-sign.

"Surveyor" means the city surveyor, building surveyor, or any person acting as such, or other proper officer for the time being of the municipality.

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct or alter, or add to, or cause, or permit to be erected, built, or constructed, or altered, or added to any hoarding without first paying the fee prescribed in Schedule "A" of this By-law, and unless such hoarding is erected, built, or constructed, altered, or added to in such a manner as to comply with the provisions of this By-law, and in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by such person and previously approved by the Council.

4. No hoarding exceeding ten feet in height overall shall be erected or constructed or used for the purpose of the exhibition of advertisements unless such hoarding is set back a distance of at least ten feet from the building line of any street or road; nor shall the lowest part of such hoarding other than the main supports thereof be nearer than two feet from the level of the footpath or the ground adjoining, whichever is the higher, such space to be covered with three-inch by one-inch battens spaced at six inch centres.

5. The materials of which any hoarding may be built or constructed, or with which any hoarding is to be altered, or added to, shall be such as may be approved by the Council, having due regard to the height, position, and size of such hoarding.

6. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, no hoarding exceeding fourteen feet in height overall shall be erected or constructed, or used for the purpose of the exhibition of advertisements.

7. No hoarding exceeding in area 20 square feet shall be erected or constructed upon any portion of an allotment of land which is situate between the alignment of the front of any dwelling house erected on such land and the street or road upon which such land abuts.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, no hoarding shall be erected or constructed upon any land in any area which has been prescribed or which may hereafter be prescribed by the Council as a Residential Area by By-law made under section 197 (5) (b) of the *Local Government Act* 1928.

9. If, in the opinion of the Surveyor, any hoarding is in such a state as to be dangerous to public or private safety, the Surveyor may give notice, in writing, to the owner of the hoarding and/or the owner and/or the occupier of the land upon which such hoarding is erected to the effect that such hoarding is in a state as to be dangerous to public or private safety, and requiring such owner and/or owners and/or occupier to place such hoarding in such a state that it will not be dangerous to public or private safety, or to pull down and remove such hoarding, and in the event of these requirements not being complied with within 3 days from service of the within mentioned notice, such hoarding may be pulled down and removed by the Council's workmen, and the Council may sell the materials of such hoarding and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such hoarding or materials, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

10. No person shall exhibit any advertisement in any place within the city in such manner or by such means as will affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade, or disfigure the natural beauty of any landscape within the city.

11. No person shall attach, fix, or paint any advertisement which is unsightly or objectionable to, or on any hoarding, building, fence, or tree within the city.

12. If any person erects, builds, alters, adds to, constructs, or fixes, or causes to be erected, built, altered, added to, constructed or fixed, any hoarding, or exhibits, paints, fixes, or attaches any advertisement contrary to the provisions of this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of the premises to which the same is affixed, or on the person so exhibiting, painting, fixing, or attaching any such advertisement, a notice to pull down and remove such hoarding and/or remove any such advertisement by giving such notice to such owner, occupier, or person, or by affixing such notice on the hoarding, and such owner, occupier or person shall within seven days from the service or giving of such notice pull down and remove such hoarding and/or remove such advertisement, and in the event of such owner, occupier or person refusing or neglecting to pull down and remove such hoarding, and/or to remove such advertisement within such seven days as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Council (notwithstanding any proceedings taken for the imposition or recovery of any penalty, or the imposition or recovery of any penalty) to pull down and remove or cause to be pulled down and removed any hoarding constructed, erected, altered, added to or fixed contrary to this By-law, and/or any advertisement exhibited, painted, fixed, or attached contrary to this By-law and the Council may sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such hoarding, and in paying any fees and penalties due by such owner.

13. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Oakleigh, and shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

14. Any person who by any wilful act or default commits any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each such offence, and if such offence be a continuing one, a further penalty not exceeding £2 for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence is given by the Council or its Town Clerk, or its Surveyor to the person offending.

SCHEDULE "A"

Fee Payable under this By-law.

The fee to be charged and received by the Council for granting permission for the erection or construction of a hoarding shall be—

For any hoarding not exceeding in area 20 square feet—Five shillings.
