Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

OFFENSIVE TRADES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928* (No. 3697), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation define the locality included in section 30 and part of section 29, Parish of Yering, Township of Lillydale, County of Evelyn, bounded on the north by Nelson-road, on the east by the Lillydale-Warburton railway line, on the south by Gippsland (3-chain) road, and on the west by Victoria-road, within the Shire of Lillydale, as the locality in such shire in which it shall not be lawful hereinafter to establish, or after a period of disuse to carry on any of the offensive trades specified in the second schedule to the *Health Act 1928*.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING NETTING IN MALLACOOTA INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me

enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamations made the twenty-fourth day of August, 1914, and the first day of October, 1918, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the second of September, 1914, and the ninth of October, 1918, respectively, regarding the close season for netting in Mallacoota Inlet, and in lieu thereof do provide as follows:—

1. The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, is prohibited in Mallacoota (sometimes called Mallagoota) Inlet, within an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlet enter the ocean, from the fifteenth day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive).

2. The use of nets, to be employed in fishing between the first day of May in each year and the fourteenth day of October next following shall be restricted in the above-mentioned inlet as follows:—

No person shall—

- Use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms.
- Use at the same time a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets): Provided that, in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be 1,200 fathoms: Provided further that, in the case of two or more persons working together in one fishing boat, each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.
- Use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.
- Use any "mesh" or "set" net between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m. on each day.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING NETTING IN SYDENHAM AND TAMBOON INLETS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of July, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth of July, 1930, respecting restrictions on netting in Sydenham and Tamboon Inlets, and in lieu thereof provide as follows:—

1. The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, is prohibited in Sydenham and Tamboon Inlets, within in each case an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlets enter the ocean, from the first day of December in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive).

2. The use of nets to be used in fishing between the first day of May in each year and the thirtieth day of November next following shall be restricted in the above-mentioned inlets as follows:—

No person shall—

- (a) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms.
- (b) Use at the same time a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets): Provided that, in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures 4½ inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be 1,200 fathoms: Provided further that, in the case of two or more persons working together in one fishing boat, each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.
- (c) Use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.
- (d) Use any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, between the hours of Ten a.m. on Thursday in each week and Ten a.m. on the following Friday.
- (e) Use any "mesh" or "set" net between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m. on each day.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING NETTING IN LAKE TYERS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamations made the sixteenth day of May, 1911, and the fourth day of May, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fourth of May, 1911, and the twelfth of May, 1915, respectively, regarding the use of nets in Lake Tyers, and do hereby prohibit the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in Lake Tyers from the first day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year

(both days inclusive): and do also prescribe that the maximum lengths of nets to be used by any person fishing in Lake Tyers between the first day of May and the thirtieth day of September in each year shall be as follows:—

For "mesh" or "set" nets, six hundred fathoms;

For "seine" or "hauling" nets, one hundred and eighty fathoms;

and I do further provide that, from the first day of May to the thirtieth day of September in each year (both days inclusive), the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in Lake Tyers shall be prohibited at any time between sunset on each Thursday and sunrise on the following Saturday.

- (d) employed whole or part time selling confectionery, or pastry in any place in which the business of a restaurant is carried on.

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers calculated to the nearest higher penny.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC
RECREATION AT MALDON.**

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the balance of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 1st of September, 1891. And the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 20th February, 1899, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Maldon.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, which is parcelled out in the following divisions, shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding sixteen in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, horse races, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the fees provided hereinafter may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to—

- (a) the Saddling Paddock;
- (b) the remainder of the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb over the gates or fences in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle; horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, or in liquidation of any liability incurred in the erection of improvements thereon, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall be permitted to train any horse within the Reserve, or bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the payment of such charges as may be prescribed.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning No. 112.—7612.—2

of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the Reserve, or remove any turf or other material from any part thereof. No loaded dray, cart, or wagon shall be driven through or within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No persons, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall ride or drive any animals, with or without vehicles, upon the part of the Reserve used for racing purposes.

12. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve:—For admission of each adult to the Saddling Paddock on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for horse races, such a sum not exceeding Ten shillings; for admission of each adult to the remainder of the Reserve, such a sum not exceeding Five shillings; for admission of each adult to any part of the Saddling Paddock and the Reserve, on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, such a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence. (These charges are exclusive of taxation charges.)

13. No person shall carry on the trade of a bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purposes, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

15. No persons, except workmen or labourers employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or young trees and shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE "MACLEAN RESERVE," IN
THE CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.**

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 9th April, 1935, as a site for a Public Park and Recreation, and known as the "Maclean Reserve," being allotments 2 and 5 of section 3A, in the Parish of Cut Paw Paw, in the City of Williamstown.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter or remain in the Reserve.

2. No person shall unduly interfere with or damage in any way the footpaths, waterpipes, seats, drinking taps, buildings, fences, walls, or other erections, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein excepting in the places especially provided by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and then only with the written permission of the Committee of Management.

3. No person shall climb, or jump over or upon the buildings, trees, or fences, or cut names or letters or figures on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones, or use slings or catapults in the Reserve.

4. No person shall put or take or allow to wander into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or geese, save and except by and with the written permission of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog which is not led or controlled by a leash, chain, or cord, and no vicious dog shall be taken into the Reserve unless securely and efficiently muzzled.

6. No person shall, without the written consent of the Committee of Management, camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any tent or building, booth, or other structure in or from which any article may be offered for sale, and no person shall, without the written permission of the Committee of Management, hawk or offer any article for sale in the Reserve.

7. No person shall place any bill, placard, or other document or, or write or paint on, or otherwise deface any fence, structure, building, seat, wall, or tree in the Reserve.

8. No person shall within the Reserve distribute or give out to any person, or scatter about, or throw down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, papers, or any other such like matter.

9. No person shall throw, place, or leave, anywhere about such Reserve, any glass, filth, dirt, paper, rubbish, or any such like matter, or interfere with, or in any way damage, any notice, placard, sign, or Regulation erected or placed on such Reserve.

10. No person shall, in the Reserve, spit or expectorate on the footpaths, or on any structure, building, or erection, or on the floors thereof.

11. No person shall lead, ride, or drive any horse, ride a bicycle, drive, draw, or propel any vehicle, motor car, motor conveyance, or motor cycle, or engage in cricket, football, or other game in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall enter in or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication, or behave in a disorderly manner, or sing any obscene song or ballad, or write or draw any indecent or obscene word, figure, or representation, or use any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or create or take part in any disturbance, or interfere with any games, sports, or amusements, or use any threatening, insulting, or abusive words or gestures, or otherwise misbehave therein.

13. No person shall tether any horse or other animal to any of the trees, fences, or other erections in the Reserve.

14. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots in the Reserve which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

The Council of the City of Williamstown has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
