AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

- (1) Whether the construction, accommodation, and management of the said sale yards are suitable and adequate or otherwise for effectually moving, handling, and selling live stock offered for sale thereat.
- (2) Whether if the said sale yards are unsuitable or inadequate for the sale of live stock the said yards can reasonably be made suitable or adequate for such purpose and by what means and at what cost.
- (3) Whether existing railway and/or road transport facilities and conveniences are adequate and sufficient for conveying live stock to and from the said sale yards, and, if not, whether such facilities can reasonably be made adequate and sufficient, and in what way and at what cost.
- (4) Whether the methods or systems by which live stock are exhibited for inspection by and offered for sale to prospective purchasers operate in the best interests of vendors of live stock.
- (5) Whether if the present accommodation is inadequate or insufficient the position can be satisfactorily and economically alleviated by any other means such as a system of inland killing of stock.
- (6) Whether the presence of the existing sale yards is detrimental to the health of the residents in the neighbourhood thereof.
- (7) Whether the competition amongst buyers of stock at the existing yards would be decreased by the removal of the yards to another site at a distance approximately seven miles further from the General Post Office than the present site.
- (8) Whether the present market dues are reasonable or otherwise and whether the charging of such dues is confined to stock offered for sale solely within the yards.

MEDICAL ACT 1928 (PART II.) AND THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATION.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the Medical Act 1928, Part II., hereby amend the Regulations made by the Dental Board of Victoria on the twenty-third day of March. One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and approved by the Governor in Council on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, as follows, viz.:—

At the end of the said Regulations the following new Regulation is added:—

Regulation.

V. "A person upon whom the Degree of Bachelor of Dental Science has been conferred by the University of Melbourne shall in any event be entitled, upon payment of the prescribed fee, to the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria. This Regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of January, 1935."

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria, held on the fifteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

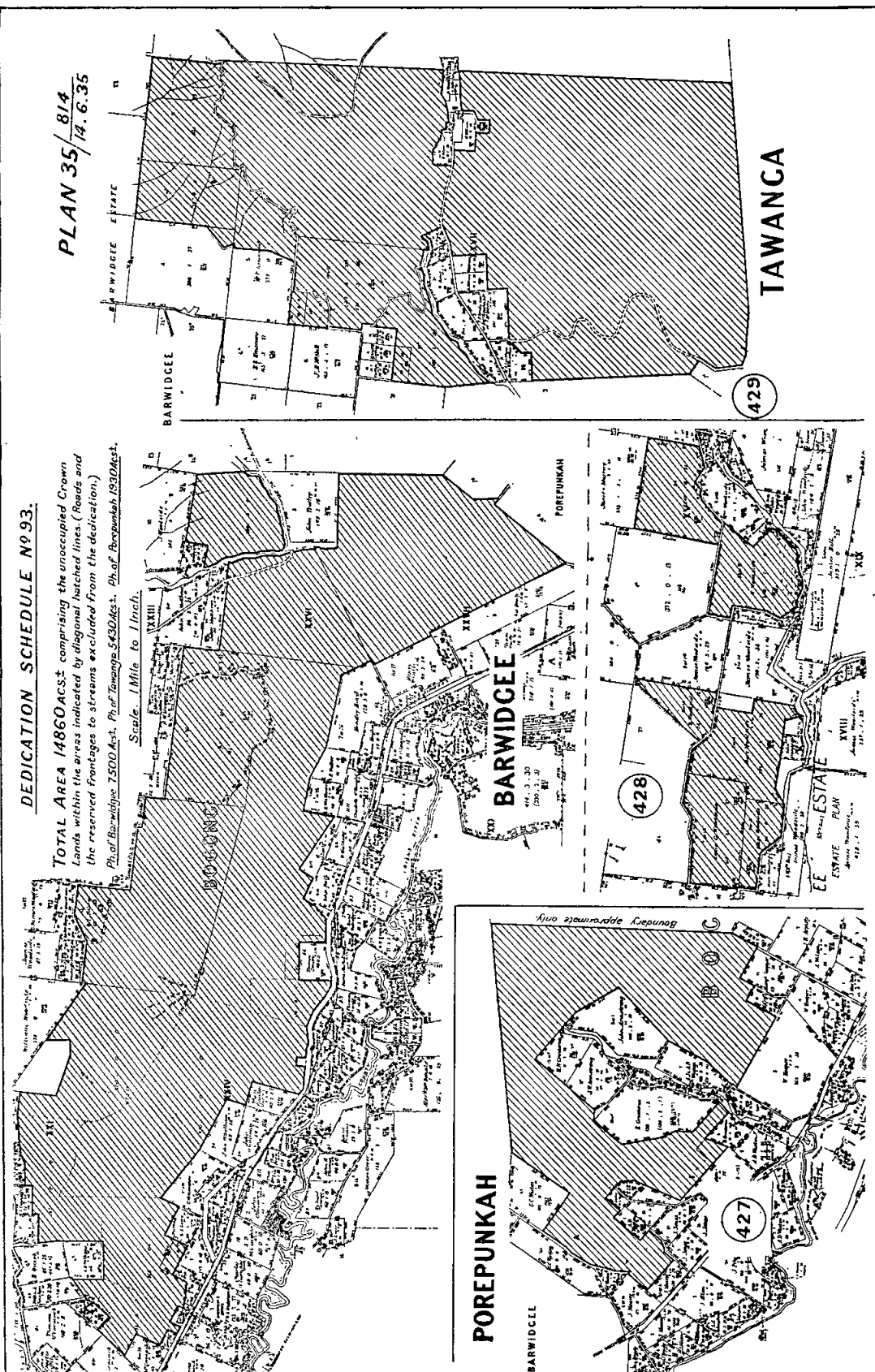

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the *Wheat Growers Relief (Commonwealth Payment) Act 1935* (No. 4281), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Wheat Growers Relief (Commonwealth Payment) Regulations 1935*.

2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears, "officer" means an officer of the Department of Agriculture or of the Department of Lands, and includes any person declared, in writing, by the Minister to be an officer for the purpose of these Regulations.

"Schedule" means the schedule to these Regulations.

"The Act" means the *Wheat Growers Relief (Commonwealth Payment) Act 1935*.

3. Claims for payments under section 6 of the Act shall be in accordance with Form A in the first schedule, and shall contain the following particulars:—

- (a) The area sown to wheat for grain by claimant in Victoria in 1934 (a) on fallow land, (b) on stubble land, (c) on other land.
- (b) The area of self-sown wheat crop on the claimant's farm or farms in 1934.
- (c) The location of the farm or farms on which the wheat was sown for grain, and the area of such farm or farms, together with the area sown to wheat for grain on each such farm.
- (d) The area of wheat harvested for grain by claimant after 1st October, 1934, and the yield of grain obtained in bushels.
- (e) The area of self-sown wheat harvested for grain by claimant after 1st October, 1934, together with the yield obtained in bushels.
- (f) Area sown to wheat for grain by claimant in 1933, together with yield of grain in bushels obtained from that area.

4. Where the claimant is a share-farmer, he shall state in the claim the nature and extent of his interest in the wheat under the share-farming agreement, and the name and address of the other party or parties to the share-farming agreement, and must declare that he contributed towards the growing of the wheat by the provision of either (a) land, (b) labour, (c) material, or (d) plant.

5. The claimant must state whether a Protection Certificate under the *Farmers Relief Acts* has been issued to him.

6. Claims for payments shall be supported by a statutory declaration made by the claimants before a justice of the peace, or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits.

7. Claims shall be forwarded in the first instance to the Inspector of Land Settlement stationed in the district in which the farm of the claimant is situated.

8. Claimants for payments or progress payments under section 7 of the Act must declare that they are in adverse financial circumstances, and that in the growing of wheat crops in 1934 they have suffered losses owing to—

- (a) specially adverse seasonal conditions; or
- (b) extensive damage to those crops arising from the prevalence of pests or disease.

9. Claims shall be in accordance with Form A in the second schedule, and shall contain the following particulars:—

(a) The area sown to wheat for grain by the claimant in 1934—

- (a) on fallow land;
- (b) on stubble land;
- (c) on other land;

showing in respect of each—

- (a) the estimated total normal yield (in bushels);
- (b) actual yield (in bushels);
- (c) loss in yield (in bushels).

(b) The cause of such total loss in yield because of—

- (a) drought; (b) storm damage; (c) fire; (d) rust;
- (e) grasshoppers; (f) other causes.

(c) The amount received by the claimant by way of insurance in respect of losses incurred in the growing of crops sown to wheat for grain in 1934.

10. Claimants for payments or progress payments shall state that they are in adverse financial circumstances, and shall supply the following particulars:—

(a) A statement of their total liabilities as at the date of making the claim.

(b) A statement of their total assets as at the date of making the claim.

(c) A statement of their total income for the year ended 30th April, 1935.

(d) A statement of their total expenditure for the year ended 30th April, 1935.

(e) The location of the farm or farms on which the wheat was sown for grain in 1934, and the area of such farm or farms, together with the area sown to wheat for grain on each such farm.

(f) The area of wheat harvested for grain by claimant after the 1st October, 1934, together with the yield obtained in bushels.

(g) The area of self-sown wheat harvested for grain after the 1st October, 1934, together with the yield obtained in bushels.

(h) The area of wheat cut for hay after 1st September, 1934, showing the approximate yield in tons and the approximate value per ton.

11. Where the claimant is a share-farmer, he shall state in the claim the nature and extent of his interest in the wheat under the share-farming agreement, and the name and address of the other party or parties to the share-farming agreement, and must declare that he contributed towards the growing of the wheat by the provision of either (a) land, (b) labour, (c) material, or (d) plant.

12. No payment shall be made out of either the Wheat Growers Relief (No. 2) 1934 Fund or the Wheat Growers Special Relief 1935 Fund, unless a claim therefor is made on or before the twenty-fifth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

13. Claims for payments or progress payments shall be supported by a statutory declaration made by the claimants before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits.

14. Claims shall be forwarded in the first instance to the Inspector of Land Settlement stationed in the district in which the farm of the claimant is situated.

15. For the purpose of verifying any claim for payment or progress payment under the Act, any officer duly authorized, in writing, by the authority may, by notice in writing, call upon any person who makes a claim for payment or progress payment under the Act to furnish to him, within such time as may be specified in the notice, such books, documents, diaries, or other documents or writings relating to wheat as the officer thinks necessary, and any such person who without reasonable excuse fails, after receipt of such notice, to comply with the requirements of such notice shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds, or imprisonment for not more than three months.

All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. 4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 6 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, but the contractor must have 48 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

5. 4. This By-law shall be read and construed as in aid and not in derogation of the provisions of By-law No. 80 of the City of Richmond.

CITY OF RICHMOND.

BY-LAW No. 119.

A' By-law of the City of Richmond made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 119, for preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the Municipality or under the control and management of the Council, and preventing damage to such building and to the furniture and fittings thereof, and for preserving public decency, and for preventing and extinguishing fires.

2. No person shall in any building—

(a) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, violent, quarrelsome, insulting, threatening, or disorderly manner; or

(b) use any threatening, abusive, obscene, indecent, or insulting words.

3. No person shall enter or remain in any building while in a drunken or intoxicated condition.

4. No person shall expectorate upon the floor, walls, furniture, or fittings of any building.

5. No person shall cut, mark, deface, write or scribble on, or otherwise damage or injure any building, or any part thereof, or the furniture or fittings of any building.

6. No person shall in any building stand on any chair, seat, or table, or stand, or sit on any window sill, parapet, roof, gutter, gable roof or parapet cornice of any building.

7. No person shall use any stair handrail otherwise than for support or assistance by hand in ascending or descending such stair.

8. No person shall in any way interfere with or destroy, damage, or injure any fire prevention appliance of or in any building.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Municipality.
