ESTABLISHMENT OF LIGHTS AND BEACONS, EASTERN ENTRANCE AND HASTINGS CHANNEL, WESTERNPORT BAY.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that the following beacons, lights, and single pile beacons are established at the Eastern Entrance, Inner Passage, and Hastings Channel, Westernport Bay.

OUTER LIGHT, INNER PASSAGE.

Position.—On the starboard hand in Lat. 38 deg. 30 min. 54 sec. S.; Long. 145 deg. 22 min. 28 sec. E.; on chart No. 1707.

Elevation.—15 feet.

Character.—A single flashing all round red light every 8 seconds, thus:—

<i>Flash.</i>	<i>Eclipse.</i>
3-10 sec.	7 7-10 secs.

Visibility.—4 miles.

Structure.—Three-pile beacon with gallery, painted red.

INNER LIGHT, INNER PASSAGE.

Position.—On the port hand in Lat. 38 deg. 30 min. 06 sec. S.; Long. 145 deg. 22 min. 48 sec. E.; on chart no 1707. This light replaces the Fairway Buoy (black cask) at the inner end of the inner passage.

Elevation.—15 feet.

Character.—A single flashing all round white light every 10 seconds, thus:—

<i>Flash.</i>	<i>Eclipse.</i>
3-10 sec.	9 7-10 secs.

Visibility.—6 miles.

Structure.—Three-pile beacon with gallery, painted black.

BEACONS—ENTRANCE AND INNER PASSAGE.

The red nun buoy on Middle Sand in the Eastern Entrance has been removed and replaced by a single pile beacon painted red and surmounted by a red globe.

In the main channel between Woody Point and outer light (inner passage), two port hand single pile beacons painted black and surmounted by black squares have been established.

The Black Cask buoy, on the eastern edge of the shoal ground, and marking the crossing from the main channel, has been removed, and a new entrance to the inner passage has been established to the west of the crossing, giving a more direct entrance.

CHANNEL BEACONS AND BUOYS.

Entering from seaward, the following lights and beacons, marking the Eastern Entrance Channel and inner passage, should be passed in the following order:—

Port side.—Red Point beacon (Aunt Sally), black, with square top, situated on the shore about 50 feet above sea level, and 530 feet clear southwards of the line of leading lights.

Port Side.—Black Reef beacon, black, with spherical top, on the north edge of Black Reef, 2 cables from shore, 317 deg. 6 cables from Red Point, and clear 370 feet to southward of the line of leading lights.

Because of the existence of the foundation of original concrete beacon on the point of reef, mariners are warned when passing beacon to pass at least 30 feet off.

Starboard side.—Single pile beacon (Middle Sand) with globe top painted red, on the eastern edge of the channel at 4½ cables, 330 deg. from Black Reef beacon, is clear 400 feet to the northward of the line of leading lights.

Starboard side.—Red Nun buoy on the eastern edge of the channel, at 2,600 feet, 013 deg. from Middle Sand beacon.

Port side.—Concrete beacon, with a spherical top painted black, on the western edge of the channel, about 1½ cables, 272 deg. from San Remo jetty.

Port side.—Black beacon with a square top, on the outer detached rock off Newhaven jetty, lies 143 deg. 400 feet therefrom.

Starboard side.—Single pile beacon with a globe top painted red, on the eastern edge of the channel, lies 050 deg. 4 1-3 cables from San Remo jetty.

Port side.—Single pile beacon with a square top, painted black, on the western edge of the channel, lies 068 deg., 1,400 feet from Newhaven jetty.

Port side.—Single pile beacon with a square top, painted black, on the western edge of the channel, lies 060 deg., 1,790 feet from Newhaven jetty.

Starboard side.—Outer light, red, outer end of inner passage. The inner passage is thence marked on the starboard side by two red pile beacons, and on the port side by three black pile beacons (all in line).

Port side.—Inner light, white, inner end of inner passage

MAGGIE SHOAL BUOY.

The red cask buoy has been removed and replaced by a single pile beacon, with a globe top mark painted red.

LOELIA SHOAL.

The black and white striped cask buoy has been removed and replaced by a single pile beacon painted black.

HASTINGS CHANNEL.

Outer Light at Entrance to Channel.

Position.—On the starboard hand in Lat. 38 deg. 19 min. 36 sec. S.; Long. 145 deg. 13 min. 24 sec. E.; on chart No. 1707.

Elevation.—15 feet.

Character.—A single flashing all round red light every 10 seconds, thus:—

<i>Flash.</i>	<i>Eclipse.</i>
3-10 sec.	9 7-10 secs.

Visibility.—4 miles.

Structure.—Three-pile beacon with gallery, painted red.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BRANXHOLME RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 2nd December, 1870, as a site for Athletic Sports, Cricket, and General Recreation at Branxholme.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding sixteen in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, shows, gymkhanas, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the fees provided hereinafter may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult.
2. For admission of each adult on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, shows, gymkhanas, or holiday amusements, a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
3. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the Reserve, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, or wagon be driven through or within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall ride or drive any animal, with or without vehicles, upon that part of the Reserve used for racing purposes.
5. No person, not being a player or official, shall trespass on the playing arena or racing track during the progress of any football or cricket match, or any sports gathering or race meeting, nor wilfully obstruct or interrupt or in any way interfere with any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work or duty.
6. The Committee of Management may let the Reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the maximum fee shall not exceed the sum of £5 5s. per day.
7. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game, horse races, or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds so set apart.
8. The Committee of Management may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars and vehicles, and for tethering of horses, and no cars, vehicles, or horses shall be parked or tethered in any portions of the Reserve other than in the portions set apart for the purpose. A charge of One shilling per day may be made for the admission of any vehicle to the Reserve, on such days, not exceeding sixteen in any one year, on which a charge for admission is being made, as provided by clause 1 of these Regulations.
9. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

10. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, first obtained; provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

14. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, train any horse within the Reserve, or bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.

15. No person or persons shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

18. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management, viz.—

- (a) That he be duly registered as a bookmaker and pay to the Committee of Management such fee as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) for each meeting.
- (b) That during the time that he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied to him by the Committee of Management which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

19. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, race meetings, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

20. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE.

BY-LAW No. 24.

A By-law of the Shire of Dunmunkle, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and the *Health Act 1928*, and numbered 24, for repealing certain By-laws, and for the purpose of carrying into execution certain provisions of the said *Health Act 1928*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and in further pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1928*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Dunmunkle, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Dunmunkle, for the purpose of carrying the said *Health Act 1928* into execution, within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.
