Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE DISPENSARIES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 27th September, 1935, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in dispensing, compounding, or selling medicines, drugs, or medicinal preparations in a Friendly Society's or Hospital Dispensary has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 27th September, 1935, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

*Apprentices.*  
One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 104s. 6d. per week.

*Improvers.*  
One improver to every ten or fraction of ten workers receiving not less than 104s. 6d. per week.

(3) TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK:—

Times of Beginning.	Times of Ending.	
9 a.m. ...	6 p.m. ...	on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.
9 a.m. ...	9 p.m. ...	on Friday.
9 a.m. ...	1 p.m. ...	on Saturday.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

Outside the times of beginning and ending work ... } Time and a half.  
 Within the times of beginning and ending work, in excess of 46 hours in any week ... }

(5) CASUAL LABOUR.—Any person casually employed during any week for not more than 23 hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, then the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

The results show a clear trend of increasing values across the different groups. The control group shows the lowest values, while the final group (Group Z) shows the highest values.
