AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Factories and Shops Acts.

CARTERS AND DRIVERS TRADE TRIBUNAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that section 40 of the said Act shall extend and apply to and in respect of any trade specified in such Proclamation other than the trade of making or baking bread, or in the trade of delivering bread: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council by such Proclamation may appoint a trade tribunal of the name, style, or designation stated therein, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade specified as aforesaid the powers and duties conferred upon the Bread Trade Tribunal by section 40 of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Proclamation

hereby declare that section 40 of the said Act shall, from the date hereof, extend and apply to and in respect of the trade relating to persons employed:—

(1) in carting or driving, or in accompanying a carter or driver, and assisting him in carting, driving, loading, unloading, or delivering in connexion with or incidental to some trade or business, but not including persons employed at such work in connexion with a trade which may be or is the subject of a determination of any of the following Wages Boards, viz.:—

Bread Carters Board,
Chaffcutters Board,
Coal and Coke Board,
Quarry Board,
Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers),
Shops Board No. 4 (Butchers—Country),
Shops Board No. 5 (Butchers—Provincial),
Shops Board No. 7 (Country Shop Assistants),
Shops Board No. 12 (Fuel and Fodder),
Shops Board No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder—Country),
Shops Board No. 15 (Grocers).

(2) in or in connexion with any stable in which are stabled the horses used in his trade or business by any person subject to the Determination of the Carters and Drivers Board;

(3) in driving horse-drawn passenger vehicles hired or plying for hire;

(4) in the business of a livery stable keeper or in a stable where cabs or cab horses are kept:

And doth by this Proclamation appoint a trade tribunal styled the Carters and Drivers Trade Tribunal, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade above specified, the powers and duties conferred by section 40 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, upon the Bread Trade Tribunal.

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1936 for Free Places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made the 6th day of March, 1928, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of March, 1928, pages 955 and following, Regulations were made by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria for securing the adoption of such standards of plant and equipment and of system frequency and pressure for the generation, distribution, and supply of electricity as will admit of the efficient interconnexion of electricity supply under-

takings and interchange of electricity throughout the same and generally the safe economical and effective supply of electricity throughout Victoria, and for securing the persons and property of the public from injury by fire or otherwise, and for other purposes (in these Regulations referred to as "Electricity Supply and Construction Regulations 1928.") His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, amend the aforesaid Regulations in manner following, that is to say :—

Date of Operation.

1. These Regulations shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Amendment of Specification.

2. The Specification for Overhead Line Construction contained in regulation 4 (aerial lines) of the Electricity Supply and Construction Regulations shall be modified as follows:—

(1) After paragraph (b) of clause (iii) there shall be inserted the following paragraph (c)—

" (c) Rural Lines.—Notwithstanding the requirements of paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof, in any place which is outside the boundaries of any city, borough, town or township, any stranded conductor of steel or of hard-drawn aluminium, copper or copper alloy may be used provided that it has an ultimate breaking strength of not less than 1,237 lb., and provided also, where a steel conductor is used, it shall consist of not less than three strands, and where a copper or copper alloy conductor is used, it shall consist of not less than seven strands. No undertaker shall use any conductor permitted under this paragraph unless he has obtained the prior consent of the Commission thereto in writing."

(2) After clause (vi)—height above ground—there shall be inserted the following proviso—

“ Provided that in any place which is outside the boundaries of any city, borough, town, or township, and where the safety of the public will not, in the opinion of the Commission, be prejudiced, conductors may be erected so that they are not at any point within 16 feet of the ground where their pressure to earth is 650 volts or less, and within 20 feet of the ground where their pressure to earth exceeds 650 volts, but the reduction in height permitted hereunder shall not apply to any conductor erected across any road or highway, and no conductor shall be erected at the reduced height as aforesaid by any undertaker without the prior consent in writing of the Commission thereto.”

(3) After the table contained in clause (x)—stability of poles
—there shall be inserted the following proviso—

“ Provided that in any place which is outside the boundaries of any city, borough, town or township, and where the safety of the public will not, in the opinion of the Commission, be prejudiced, intermediate poles of the lengths shown below supporting straight lengths of an electric line may be set to the following respective depths in average ground:—

Overall Length.	Depth of Pole in the Earth.
35 feet Not less than 5 ft. 6 in.
40 feet " " " 6 ft.
45 feet " " " 6 ft. 6 in.

No pole shall be set at a reduced depth by any undertaker pursuant to this proviso without the prior consent of the Commission thereto in writing."

(4) After clause (xviii)—party poles—the following new clause (xix)—permission of Commission—shall be inserted:—

"(xix) Permission of Commission.—Where the permission of the Commission is required under clauses (iii), (vi), and (x), or any of them, the undertaker shall make application in writing therefor, stating the reasons for his application and the nature of the works and the manner in which the works are proposed to be carried out."

At the end of paragraph (c) (iii) of the Employer's Covenants contained in the Second Schedule to the General Regulations (No. 2) as incorporated by Regulation 5 of the Painting, Decorating, and Signwriting Regulations (No. 2), add the following paragraph:—

- (c) (iv). In the event of the employer being unable owing to lack of orders, or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Act, the Commission may on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines or for the cancellation of the indentures.

The proviso to paragraph (3) of the Mutual Agreements contained in the said Schedule as incorporated by the aforesaid Regulation 5 approved by the Governor in Council on the 29th day of December, 1932, shall be amended in the following manner:—

Provided further:—

- (i) that where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month or
- (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission,
- the total period of time not served by an apprentice by reason of either of the abovementioned provisions shall at the option of the apprentice be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

The amended Regulation shall come into operation on and from the 15th day of October, 1935.

FURTHER AMENDMENT OF PLUMBING AND GASFITTING REGULATIONS (No. 3).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Apprenticeship Acts* and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Regulation 4 of the Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 3) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the 15th day of October, 1935.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

4. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall commence on the 15th day of October, 1935, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Act and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years—

1st year—at the rate of 13s. 9d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 19s. 4d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 25s. 5d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 34s. 7d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 45s. 9d. per week.
6th year—at the rate of 63s. 1d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 19s. 4d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 25s. 5d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 34s. 7d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 45s. 9d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 63s. 1d. per week.

And the Honorable Murray William James Bouchier, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

3. "Sleepout" shall mean a single-roomed building detached from the main building and used or intended to be used or capable of being used as a bedroom.

4. Anything to the contrary in the said By-law No. 60 notwithstanding alterations or additions may be made to any wooden building which is on land described in clause 1 of part III. of the said By-law No. 60 or in or within the area described in said clause 1 of said part III. of said By-law No. 60 and which building was in existence at the time of coming into operation of this by-law provided that such alterations and/or additions do not together increase the cubic capacity of any such building as it existed prior to such additions and alterations by more than ten per centum of such previously existing cubic capacity.

5.
