PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.,

T. THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the J. State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the fourth day of December, 1916, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirteenth day of December, 1916, page 5111, respecting netting near the mouth of the Merri River, and, in lieu there-

of, prohibit during the whole of each year the use of transmels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the area bounded as

Commencing at a post situated on Pickering Point; thence south-easterly by an imaginary line to a post on the most northerly point of Middle Island; thence north 62 deg. east (magnetic) by another line to a netting boundary post on the railway viaduct; thence by the said viaduct in a northwesterly direction to a post on the viaduct marking the mouth of the Merri River: thence by the line defining the mouth of the said river to the starting point.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazzite, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL

AWARD NO. 16 OF 11TH NOVEMBER, 1935, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY AND HOURS OF DUTY OF CERTAIN WORKERS.

The State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932 (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder dated 21st August, 1934, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. Where miners are required to wheel their coal to a jig from their working places for a distance not exceeding 99 feet, and also to work the jig for a distance not exceeding 99 feet, they shall be paid fourpence per ton for such work. In the case of stone, fourpence per skip shall be paid for such

Western Arca.

2. All workers, including preliminary shaft sinkers, engaged in connexion with the preliminary sinking of the new shaft and the erection of all superstructures in relation thereto

and construction of the skip road, shall be paid a margin of \$\forall d\$, per hour above the basic rate (except where otherwise provided in this Award or any other Award of the Tribunal).

- 3. Preliminary shaft sinkers, working at a depth of over 10 feet and not over 20 feet, shall be paid a margin of 2½d, per hour above the basic rate; over 20 feet and not over 30 feet, 4d, per hour above the basic rate.
- 4. The hours of duty of preliminary shall be sper fortuight, including crib time of 30 minutes for each 8 hours.
- 5. Any preliminary shaft sinker who is required to work in a wet place shall, if he is not provided with clothing so as to protect him from getting wet, be paid one shilling extra per shift or part of a shift.
- 6. A place shall be deemed to be wet when water other than rain is continually dropping from overhead so as to saturate the clothing of the employee, if unprotected, and/or when the water in the place where the employee is standing is over 2 inches does. is over 2 inches deep.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that hehalf His Frankers A. enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):-

PART I.—INTERPRETATION.

- 4. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-

- "Approved" means approved in writing by the Commission; and "Approval" has a corresponding interpretation.

- " Boarding-school" means any school at which five or more scholars are lodged or boarded for hire or reward, and includes every building used in connexion therewith, whether within the same curtilage

- "Door "includes gate; and

- "Main lighting wall" means the wall admitting daylight to the left side of the class when it is at work, and "main lighting window" means a window in a main lighting wall.

- "Open-air dormitory or bedroom" includes any dormitory bedroom sleeping verandah or sleeping balcony in which the aggregate area of the ventilation or other permanent openings in the external walls thereof is at least equal to one-fourth of the floor area of the compartment.
- " Passage." " Proprietor."
- "Passage" includes passageway, corridor, vestibule and lobby.
- "Proprietor" of a school includes the owner, the occupier, the manager, the trustees, the person by whose authority the scho ol has been or is being or is intended to be erected or altered, or any person having the management or control thereof and also includes the headmaster or head teacher of such school.
- "Scholar." " School."
- "Scholar" includes student and examinee.
- "School" means any school (not being a State school referred to in Parts I., III., and IV. of the Education Act 1928), and includes buildings appurtenant thereto, and also includes any business or commercial
- college. "The Act" means the Health Act 1928 (No. 3697), the Health Act 1931 (No. 4010), and any Act amending the same.
- "Wall" includes fence, other than a wire fence. " Wall."

Application of regulations.

5. These Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter shall apply to all'schools except business colleges conducted in commercial buildings, provided however that in the case of a school used as such at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations any regulation or part thereof may be waived altered modified or varied at the discretion of the Commission.

Business colleges conducted in commercial buildings shall be subject only to Part I., Part II., Division 8 of Part V., and to Parts IX., X., XI., XII., and XIII.

PART II.—APPLICATION FOR COMMISSION'S APPROVAL OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Application to

- 6. Whenever it is intended to erect or alter any school or to use as a school any building the plans and specifications of which have not been approved by the Commission under these Regulations the proprietor shall make application in writing to the Commission for its approval in the form set out in Schedule A to these Regulations and such application shall be accompanied by the plans sections and specifications referred to in the said Schedule.
- 7. In all other respects the provisions of Divisions I. and II. of Part II. of the Building Regulations 1933 shall apply to schools.

PART III .-- SITE.

Site

- 8. No site for any new school shall be approved unless-
 - (a) it is well drained by gravitation into a storm-water drain channel watercourse or the sea;
 - (b) it is free from any accumulation of decomposing or decomposable organic or other unwholesome dangerous or offensive matter; and
 - (c) it is in the opinion of the Commission sufficiently remote from factories works and other sources of noise dust smoke offensive odour or danger to the pupils.
- 9. The Commission may require the site of a new school building to be wholly or partially covered with a layer of mineral asphalt, concrete or other approved impervious material.

10. Every new school and every new class-room shall be so situated in Provision relation to the boundaries of the land upon which it is erected that the access of light. distance of such boundaries from any wall of the school which is a main lighting wall for any class-room shall nowhere be less than twice the height of the school as measured vertically from the floor of the lowest class-room to the top wall plate of such school.

11. Every new school and every new class-room shall be so situated in relation to existing buildings walls or hedges on the same or any adjacent property and every new building on the same property shall be so situated in relation to all existing school buildings that the angle of sky included

- (a) the plane containing the upper glass line of the main lighting windows of every class-room and the junction of the opposite wall of such class-room with the floor; and
- (b) the plane containing the top of any opposite building wall or hedge and the said junction-

shall be not less than 5 degrees.

PART IV .-- PLAYGROUND.

12. (1) In the case of a new school an area uncovered by building enclosure Minimum area wall fences or other fixed objects of whatever description and equivalent to of playground. at least four times the aggregate area of the floor space of the class-rooms shall be provided as a playground for the use of the scholars.

(2) In the case of every school accommodating or intended to accommodate separate more than 50 scholars of different sexes a separate playground for each sex playgrounds and entrances shall be provided and shall wherever practicable have a separate entrance thereto for from the road or street.

(3) Every playground shall be properly levelled drained and enclosed Levelling and draining. with a fence or wall.

Provided that the Commission may-

(a) Exempt the proprietor from the obligation to provide a playground; grounds may be (b) Accept the provision of a playground of a smaller area than that commission.

prescribed by this regulation; or

(c) Allow the use of a flat roof as a playground.

PART V.—BUILDINGS.

Division 1 .- Construction.

13. (1) Every school shall be substantially and properly constructed be Buildings. dry internally throughout and he kept in a good state of repair.

(2) No wooden building of more than one story or capable of accommon restriction on dating in the aggregate more than 200 scholars shall be used as a school.

- (3) No school shall be of more than two stories unless the whole of the walls floors and stairs thereof are constructed of fireproof material.

(6) No room shall be used for school purposes if situated above or below Proximity of or immediately adjoining any compartment used as a kitchen laundry shop school to store or for a steam boiler or for the storage of fuel ashes or inflammable forbidden.

material unless separated from such compartment by fire-proof construction. (7) Every room used for school purposes shall be ceiled and shall have comments. walls at least 10 feet high from the floor to the level of the wall-plate. (See Regulation 45 hereof re height of class-rooms.)

Provided that in every such case, as well as in that of a roof open to an Proviso. apex, there shall be provided between the ceiling and the roof covering a Insulation of layer of approved heat-insulating material.

- (8) The introduction of needless projections or recesses facilitating projection &c. collection of dust whether on walls doors windows ventilators ceilings or on walls doors furniture shall be avoided.
- 14. The space between the under portions of any sink basin or wash-sinks trough and the floor of the compartment in which such sink basin or wash-troughs not to be encased. wash-trough is situated shall not be enclosed.
- 15. The height of a passage shall be not less than 10 feet. Its width purentions of shall be such as shall be determined by the Commission from a consideration passages. of the positions and widths of the necessary exits thereto and therefrom but shall in no case be less than 6 feet in clear measurement.

Building construction. Application of Building Regulations 1933. 16. The materials and methods of construction employed the methods of calculating and testing and all work done in relation to the erection of any new school or alteration of any school shall (except when otherwise herein specifically set out or directed) be in accordance with the requirements of the Building Regulations 1933 as far as such requirements may be applicable.

Division 2.—STAIRWAYS.

Staircases and stairs.

Handrails.

17. (1) The proprietor shall cause all stairs required to give effect to the provisions of these Regulations to be placed wherever practicable at the sides or ends of the building and to be well removed from each other.

(2) All windows for fire-isolated staircases shall be protected by wired

glass of approved thickness.

in (3) Every stairway shall be provided with an upper and a lower handrail fixed upon each side thereof and continued round the landings and chased into the end of newel walls where these occur.

Provided that the lower rail may be omitted from the wall side when the stair is not used by any pupils under 10 years of age.

Application of the Building Regulations 1933 as to 18. Where no provision is otherwise made in these Regulations in respect of steps stairways and landings the provisions of Part II., Division VI., of the Building Regulations 1933 shall (with such modifications as may in the opinion of the Commission be necessary) be deemed to apply thereto.

DIVISION 3.—EXITS AND ESCAPES.

Doors opening outwards.

19. Every main exterior door of a school shall open outwards or both ontwards and inwards.

Certain doors to open both ways.

20. All doors across corridors and passageways shall be hung so as to open both ways and shall be without fastenings or be fitted with only a single fastening capable of being operated from each side without a key.

Landings.

21. Where any exit door opens directly on to a stairway or flight of steps more than 20 inches high a landing extending at least 3 inches laterally beyond the door jambs and at least 3 feet in forward measurement shall be provided not more than 6 inches below the level of the doorway sill and shall extend to the head of the said stairway or flight of steps.

Door fastenings (see Public Building Regulations 1933 Part II., Division VI.). Certain doors openable from inside.

- 22. Every exit door shall be fitted with an approved fastening only within the meaning of the Building Regulations 1933.
- 23. All doors of passageways bed-rooms dormitories bath-rooms dining-rooms lavatories classrooms studies or other rooms occupied by the scholars shall be fitted with such fastenings only as will enable them to be readily opened from the inside without the use of a key.

Use of drapery &c. in exits prohibited. 24. No drapery or curtains and no articles decorations or material of a combustible obstructive or otherwise dangerous character shall be placed in any entrance or exit passage.

Dimensions of doorways.

25. Every class-room doorway shall be at least 3 feet wide in clear measurement. Every class-room shall have direct access either to the playground or to a public thoroughfare or to a passage but no door opening into a passage shall be hung so as to be capable when opened of obstructing any passage...

Marking of

26. On the outer face of the entrance door of every class-room and of every dormitory accommodating scholars shall be painted or otherwise legibly marked in prominent permanent characters in consecutive order of class-room or dormitory (as the case may be) the distinguishing letter of every such room the use of which has been approved of by the Commission and under such letter the number in figures of individual seats or beds (as the case may be), thus—

Provided that in the case of premises accommodating not more than twenty (20) boarders above the ground floor the Commission may accept one centrally placed stairway not less than 3 ft. 4 in. wide. In such case the stair and all landings lobbies or passageways from one flight to another shall be enclosed by fire-proof walls and the staircase shall be ceiled with fire-resisting material.

Provided further that the Commission may require the provision of additional stairways from any series or block of dormitories if in its opinion the use of the minimum number of stairways hereinbefore required results in excessive distances between stairways.

Division 4.—Natural Lighting.

30. The proprietor shall cause every room (not being a class or lecture Natural room) to be properly lighted by glazed windows in an external wall or walls lighting. and presenting a total area of clear glass equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room.

(For class-rooms and laboratories, vide Divisions 1 and 2 of Part VII. hereof.)

31. The sashes of all windows shall be so formed and arranged as to be Windows fully the pacessary fittings for opening openable. openable, and shall be furnished with the necessary fittings for opening op them and keeping them open to an extent equivalent to at least one-half of the glazed area of the window in each case. The means for opening the said sashes shall in each case be conveniently accessible from the interior of the room to which the window pertains.

DIVISION 5.—ARTIFICIAL LIGHTING.

Artificial lighting. 32. The proprietor shall cause artificial lighting to be provided in all rooms and passages of a school which are used at night and to be in compliance with the relevant provisions of Part III. of the Building Regulations 1933.

(For special provisions as to lighting of night-school class-rooms corridors &c. see Regulations 56 and 57 hereof.)

Division 6.—Ventilation.

- 33. Where not otherwise required by these Regulations the proprietor shall cause-
 - (a) every school building to comply as regards space and ventilation under wood floors with Division VII. of Part II. of the Building Regulations 1933; and
 - (b) every compartment of a school building to be provided with approved ventilators in or immediately below the ceiling and having a total clear opening of at least I square inch for every 4 square feet of floor area of the compartment.

Provided that the Commission may allow the omission of such ventilators in any room (not being a class-room or a laboratory) in which the windows are openable to within 12 inches of the ceiling and are in the opinion of the Commission well distributed.

DIVISION 7.—DRAINAGE.

Drainage and drains. 34. The proprietor shall cause efficient drainage to be provided and all work in connexion therewith to be carried out in accordance with the provisions of Division X. of Part II. of the Building Regulations 1933.

DIVISION 8.—CLOSETS AND URINALS.

- 35. (1) The proprietor shall provide on the premises closets and urinals conveniently situated and complying with the relevant provisions of Division IX, of Part II. of the Building Regulations 1933.
- Number required for day scholars.
- (2) For day scholars the number of such conveniences shall be at east—
 - (a) one closet for every 15 or fraction of 15 girls up to 75 and one additional closet for every 35 or fraction of 35 girls in excess of 75 and
 - (b) one closet and one urinal for every 25 or fraction of 25 boys up to 75 and one additional closet and one additional urinal for every 50 or fraction of 50 boys in excess of 75.

- (3) For boarding scholars the number of such conveniences shall be at
 - (a) for girls one closet for any number up to 7 and one additional closet for every subsequent 10 or fraction of 10; and
 - (b) for boys one closet for every 10 or fraction of 10 and one urinal for any number up to 10 and one additional urinal for every subsequent 20 or fraction of 20.

DIVISION 9.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS:

36. The proprietor shall make approved provision for—

Control of unwholesome vapours. (1) the collection and conveyance to the open air of vapour from washing boilers fumes from gas stoves or other gas cooking or heating appliances and from bath heaters of every description from which products of combustion are given off; and

(2) the collection conveyance and disposal without causing nuisance offence or danger to health of all refuse and drainage of the

Refuse and drainage collection.

PART VI.-BOARDING SCHOOLS.

BED-ROOMS AND DORMITORIES.

Sleeping roo &c. to be aid disconnected from certain other rooms. 37. No bed-room dormitory living-room or study shall have any direct aerial connexion with any kitchen scullery larder dairy cleaning-room lavatory bath-room box-room boot-room cloak-room or soiled linen-room or with any sanitary convenience.

Bed-rooms and dormitories. 38. In every bed-room dormitory or sleeping apartment the proprietor shall provide for each of the scholars staff and servants to be accommodated therein floor space and cubic space as follows:—

Air space and floor space.

- (a) In the case of a boarding school in use as such prior to the 23rd day of February 1927 not less than 540 cubic feet of air space nor less than 54 square feet of floor space.
 (b) In the case of a house or premises coming into use as a boarding
- (b) In the case of a house or premises coming into use as a boarding school after the 23rd day of February 1927 not less than 600 cubic feet of air space nor less than 60 square feet of floor space.
- (c) In the case of a separate junior house or wing reserved for the accommodation of scholars under 12 years of age not less than 450 cubic feet of air space nor less than 45 square feet of floor space.

Provided that in an open-air dormitory or bedroom the minimum floor space shall be 50 square feet per person generally and 40 square feet per scholar in a separate junior house or wing.

- 39. The proprietor shall not accommodate more scholars than the cubic space and floor space allow when calculated in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 38 hereof.
- 40. The proprietor shall provide a separate bed with adequate bedding Bods. and bed clothing for the use of each of the scholars staff and servants and shall not permit any dormitory to contain more than twenty (20) beds.
- 41. The proprietor shall provide in every bed-room or dormitory ventilation ventilators in accordance with Regulation 33 hereof but having not less than 24 square inches of airway for every bed in such bed-room or dormtory.

BATHS, LAVATORIES, ETC.

- 42. The proprietor shall provide on the premises in situations convenient Bath-rooms to the bed-rooms and dormitories properly equipped constructed lighted drained and ventilated bathrooms and lavatories having impervious floors in accordance with the following requirements:-
 - (1) Where the scholars do not exceed 10 one bathroom fitted with combined plunge and shower bath and for every additional 10 scholars or fraction of 10 one additional plunge or shower
 - (2) The total number of plunge baths shall be as required by the Commission in each case after taking into account the distribution of the dormitories between separate houses wings or floors.
 - (3) Lavatory basins not less in number than the baths herein required Lavatories. except in cases where the hed-rooms and dormitories are fitted with wash basins connected with an approved drainage system.

KITCHENS, ETC.

43. The proprietor shall provide-

Kitchen.

- (1) a suitably situated kitchen of approved dimensions; (2) a scullery conveniently situated in relation to the kitchen and scullery. furnished with approved sink and draining board; such sink and draining board where fitting against any wall or partition shall be properly flashed thereto;
- (3) a larder or larders suitably constructed and fitted properly lighted tarder. and ventilated and not in direct communication with any living-room bed-room bath-room laundry wash-house or sanitary convenience nor placed under a stair;
- (4) effectual means for the exclusion of flies rodents and other vermin protection of and (as far as practicable) dust from every compartment food fro wherein food is stored cooked prepared or served.

PART VII.—CLASS-ROOMS AND LABORATORIES.

DIVISION 1.—CLASS-ROOMS (INCLUDING LECTURE-ROOMS).

- 44. Instruction or examination of scholars (except in practical work in Instruction decomperimental or applied science or an art or craft) shall not be given or in approved conducted in class-rooms other than those approved for the purpose.
- 45. (1) A floor area of at least 15 square feet and an air space of not less Floor space.

 Cubic space.
 Cubic space. than 180 cubic feet for each scholar shall be provided in each class-room.
- (2) The length of a class-room shall in no case be more than one and two- Proportions. thirds (12) times its breadth, nor exceed 32 feet. Its breadth shall not exceed twice its height as measured from the floor surface to the highest part of the glass in the windows of the main lighting wall, and shall not (without the special approval of the Commission) exceed 25 feet.
- 46. The class shall in every case face in the direction of the greater length Position of or longer axis of the room.

Natural Lighting.

- 47. Every class-room shall have a main lighting wall which shall be an Main external wall and shall be situated on the left-hand side of the class. (See lighting wall. Regulations 10 and 11 hereof re relation of main lighting wall to adjoining buildings, &c.).
- 48. The windows of every class-room shall be glazed with clear glass; class-room provided that the Commission may in special circumstances permit the use windows. of colourless obscured glass of approved pattern in the lower sashes only.
- 49. The net glazed lighting area of the windows of every class-room windows (exclusive of space occupied by sash frames glazing-bars or other obstructions Glass area. to light) shall be equal to at least one-sixth $\binom{1}{6}$ of the floor area of the room; provided that where the main lighting wall faces south or within 30 degrees of south the ratio shall be increased to at least one-fifth $(\frac{1}{6})$ of the floor area.

Windows, main and supplementary. 50. (1) In every case not less than three-fourths (3) of the glazed lighting surface required by this regulation shall be in the windows of the main lighting wall and the balance shall be in the form of supplementary windows as hereinafter provided.

When only on external wall,

(2) If there is no second external wall the whole of the glazed lighting surface required by this regulation shall be disposed in the main lighting wall.

Levels of windows in main lighting wall. 51. (1) The lowermost edge of the clear glass in each window in the main lighting wall shall be from 3 ft. 6 in. to 4 feet above the adjacent floor surface, and the uppermost edge of such glass shall be as close as practicable to the ceiling. (See Reg. 45 (2) re height of window heads.)

Bear and front glass line. ceiling. (See Reg. 45 (2) re height of window heads.)

(2) The extreme rear glass line in the main lighting wall shall be not more than 18 inches from the rear cross or return wall or partition and the extreme front glass line in the main lighting wall shall be not less than 6 nor more than 8 feet from the front cross or return wall or partition; provided that should it be desired to place a window or windows less than 6 feet from such latter wall for architectural effect this will be permitted on condition that such windows shall not be considered as forming part of the required lighting surface of the class-room and shall be fitted with blinds for use when necessary.

Width of piers between windows. (3) The distance measured from glass line to glass line between any two adjacent windows in a main lighting wall shall not exceed 2 feet 6 inches.

Supplementary windows. 52. (1) Where the wall opposite the main lighting wall is an external wall supplementary windows shall be provided therein; and where such wall is not an external wall but the wall behind the class is an external one the supplementary windows shall be provided in the latter wall.

(2) The lowermost part of the glass in any supplementary window shall be not less than 7 feet above the floor of the class-room.

Use of front lighting and skylights forbidden. 53. No window in a wall in front of the class and (except with the approval of the Commission) no skylight shall be used for the illumination of a class-room.

Windows to be openable.

- 54. (1) Every window shall be readily openable at the top and at the bottom to an extent of not less than 50 per cent. of the glazed surface of such window.
- (2) The area of any pane of glass in a class-room window shall be at least one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ square feet.
- (3) Every class-room window (except a window which faces south or within 30 degrees of south) shall be fitted with a blind of translucent material of a yellowish or light-green shade; and preferably blinds shall be fitted at the sill and shall unroll upwards.

intensity of illumination on deaks, &c.

55. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations the windows of every class-room shall contain glass of such quality area and position and of such degree of cleanliness as shall ensure that the illumination of the interior of the class-room by means of daylight shall not be less than 5 candle-feet at any time during school hours on every desk top and not less than 3 candle-feet on every blackboard chart or map.

(See Regulations 10 and 11 hereof re relation of main lighting wall to adjoining buildings, &c.).

Artificial Lighting.

- 56. (1) In every class-room which is used at night artificial lighting shall be provided by means of approved lamps so placed and so equipped as to secure as far as possible a uniform diffusion of light upon every desk or table and on the blackboard.
- (2) The intensity of illumination on every desk or table and on every blackboard shall be not less than eight (8) foot-candles in the case of every drawing class-room art studio and sewing class-room and not less than five (5) foot-candles in the case of every other class-room.
- (3) No lamp (except a properly-shaded table-lamp for the use of one person only) shall be placed at a height of less than 8 ft. 6 in. above the floor in any class-room.
- (4) Every lamp which is at less height above eye-level of the scholars than half its distance in front of any scholar shall either be such that the intensity of the source of light does not exceed three (3) candle-power per square inch or else it shall be so shaded that the source of light is invisible to such scholar.
 - (5) The distance between lamps shall not exceed-
 - (a) for direct lighting one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ times the height of the lamps above the tops of the desks or tables; or
 - (b) for indirect or semi-indirect lighting not more than twice such height.
- (6) The distance between the left-hand and rear walls of every classroom and the lamps nearest thereto shall not exceed one-third (\$\frac{1}{2}\$) of the permissible distance between lamps; and the distance between the righthand and front walls and the lamps nearest thereto shall not exceed one-half (\$\frac{1}{2}\$) of the permissible distance between lamps.

57. In every school which is used for teaching purposes at night every Lighting of room which is used by the scholars together with all exits shall be properly rooms and pass lighted so as to render all exits passages or other ways therein and therefrom to the available public thoroughfare or thoroughfares at all times readily visible during the whole time the scholars are on the premises.

Wall and Ceiling Surfaces.

- 58. The internal surfaces of walls and partitions of every class-room shall internal be hard smooth impervious and washable up to a height of at least 6 feet surfaces of walls &c. from the floor.
- 59. The whole of the internal surfaces of such walls shall be coloured a colour of walls light shade of greyish-green green buff or cream so that the light-absorbing and ceilings. power of such surfaces shall not exceed 40 parts per centum.

Provided that a dado not exceeding 4 feet high may be of a darker colour.

The ceiling of every class-room shall be white.

Desks and Blackboards.

- 60. (1) Desks in class-rooms shall be single or double and if not adjustable Type of desks. shall in respect of the relative positions of the front edge of the seat and of the nearer edge of the deak be of the "plus" or "zero" type as depicted in the diagrams in Part XIV. of these Regulations.
- (2) The top of each desk shall have a surface slope of about 15 degrees Desk slope. 53 below the horizontal towards the user.

(3) Every seat shall be fitted with a suitable back.

(4) The front row of desks shall be at least 7 feet from the front wall of Situation and the class-room unless the room be less than 16 feet in width in which case arrange the distance may be reduced to 6 feet. A clear space of at least 18 inches shall be left between the side walls of the class-room and the outermost rows of seats and desks; and a clear longitudinal aisle between adjoining rows of seats such aisles being at least 18 inches wide in the case of single desks and at least 2 feet wide in the case of double desks.

61. Every black-board shall present a matte surface and shall be placed Black-boards. in the most advantageous position for view by the class.

Ventilation.

62. The provisions of Part II., Division VII., of the Building Regulations ventilation 1933, shall (subject to the following alterations and substitutions) extend and General apply to all class-rooms and shall for such purpose be deemed to be incorpor- providens. ated with these Regulations.

In Regulation 73 of the said Building Regulations 1933, for 1 square inch shall be substituted 10 square inches and for 2 square feet shall be substituted 15 square feet in respect of ventilation airway in relation to floor area of class-

Kindergarten Class-rooms.

63. Every class-room which is to be used solely for the teaching of Kinderga children under the age of six years by bona fide kindergarten methods rooms to destined shall comply with the foregoing regulations respecting class-rooms with the classfollowing exceptions:

- (a) The lower glass-line of windows may be less than 3 ft. 6 in. Exception above the floor but no glass within 2 ft. of the floor will be allowed. considered as forming part of the glazed lighting area required to be provided.
- (b) Main lighting windows may be distributed in more than one external wall of a class-room.
- (c) The limits of 18 inches from the rear cross-wall to the glass-line of the main lighting windows and of 2 ft. 6 in. between adjoining windows may be exceeded provided that no badly-lighted area is thereby created.

Division 2.—Laboratories, Experimental and Applied Science ROOMS AND STUDIOS.

- 64. In no case shall the floor space for each scholar be less than 24 Floor space. square feet.
- 65. (1) Working benches in every laboratory shall be not less than working 4 ft. 6 in. apart in the case of double nor less than 3 ft. in the case of single benches, &c. benches.
- (2) The width of each double bench shall be between 4 ft. and 5 ft. and of each single bench between 2 ft. and 2 ft. 6 in.; and the length of each bench shall be such as to allow not less than 3 ft. 6 in. run for each scholar at a single or for each pair of scholars at a double bench.

Provided that in a laboratory (other than a chemical laboratory) in which it is intended that scholars shall work singly or in groups of two or three at separate tables or benches the Commission may allow the above dimensions to be varied.

66. In the case of every laboratory the following provisions shall also apply, viz. :-

Shelves

- (1) All shelving shall stand 12 inches clear of the floor;
- Concealed pipes
- (2) All chasing or other: recessed work containing gas water waste or other pipes shall be fitted so as to be readily openable for purposes of inspection.

Bench tops impervious

(3) Bench tops shall be made impervious to water by ironing paraffin wax into them or by some other approved method.

Sinks and basins.

(4) Every sink or basin in a bench top shall be sunk with its upper edge slightly below the surface of the bench top so that spilt liquid may readily drain from such surface into the sink or basin.

Acid drainage.

(5) Every sink or basin and every drain and waste channel for conveyance of acid drainage shall be formed of such materials or lined with such protective coating as shall in the Commission's opinion render it sufficiently acid-resisting.

Treatment and disposal of offensive fumes, vapours, gases, or dust.

67. (1) Where any process producing or discharging any offensive fumes vapours gases or dust is used there shall be provided means (whether in the form of fume cupboards hoods and aprons extract flues and fans or other devices) in the opinion of the Commission adequate for collection of such fumes vapours gases or dust as closely as practicable to the origin thereof and for conducting them as directly as possible to the outer air without allowing them to mix with the general atmosphere of any compartment of the school.

Electrically driven fans.

(2) Where electric energy is available it shall be used for the purpose of actuating fans for the extraction of such offensive fumes vapours gases or dust

General (3) Where fumes vapours gases or dust are produced on so small a scale ventilation of laboratories, ac. as in the Commission's opinion not to be offensive and when the Com-(3) Where fumes vapours gases or dust are produced on so small a scale mission so approves the general ventilation may be effected by the use of the "hatural "system in accordance with Regulation 60 hereof. Otherwise an approved system of ventilation by mechanical means capable of supplying 50 cubic feet of fresh air per person per minute shall be provided.

Natural Lighting.

- 68. In every laboratory-
 - (1) The main lighting windows shall be placed in one or (if both are external) in both of the longer walls of the laboratory.
 - (2) The total glazed lighting area the proportion of such area which shall be openable and the levels of sills and heads of main lighting windows shall be as hereinbefore required for class
 - (3) Supplementary windows having an aggregate glass area equal to not more one-fourth (1) of the required glass area may be provided in one or both of the shorter walls of a laboratory; provided that no window shall be placed behind or above any demonstration table or any blackboard.
 - (4) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the intensity of lighting on each working bench shall be not less than eight candle-feet.
 - (5) Every working bench shall be arranged so that its longer axis is at right-angles to the main lighting wall or walls of the laboratory and the relative positions of windows and benches shall be such that there is a window opposite at least one end of each working bench; provided that-
 - (a) the Commission may permit the use of a single bench along the main lighting wall or walls on condition that the fittings thereon are so arranged that no scholar shall be required to work at any section of bench which is more than 1 foot laterally from a window; and
 - (b) in a laboratory (other than a chemical laboratory) in which benches or tables as described in the proviso to Regulation 63 (2) hereof are used either the longer or the shorter axis may be at right-angles to the main lighting wall.

Artificial Lighting.

69. In every laboratory which is used at night artificial lighting shall be provided in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 56 hereof.

Division 3.—Miscellaneous.

70. (1) The proprietor shall in every laboratory sloyd-room or work-room proprietor to guard dangerou machinery &c. provide guards for-

(a) all dangerous parts of the machinery;

(b) all dangerous appliances used in or in connexion with the laboratory or any such room; and

(c) all dangerous parts of the laboratory or any such room.

(2) In any laboratory, sloyd-room or work-room-(a) no female unless her hair is cut short or securely fixed and confined and women from close to her head by net or otherwise and no male wearing any machinery. apron or loose garment shall be allowed to work among or near moving machinery; and

(b) no male under eighteen years of age and no female of any age shall be allowed to clean machinery whilst the same is in motion or to work between the fixed and traversing part of any selfacting machine while the machine is in motion.

PART VIII.—ASSEMBLY HALLS.

71. Assembly halls shall be subject to the provisions of the Building Assembly halls. Regulations 1933.

PART IX.—CLOAK-ROOMS AND LAVATORIES.

72. Cloak-rooms of sufficient size and number adequately furnished with Ther size and shelving and hooks for the reception of the scholars' hats and cloaks shall be provided on the premises of every school and shall be subject to the conditions following, viz.:

(1) they shall be situated conveniently near to the class-rooms but situation. shall be completely air-disconnected therefrom and from all occupied rooms;

(2) they shall be thoroughly cross-ventilated and (except with the ventilation. special approval of the Commission) shall not be located in

basements: (3) fittings for the reception of hats and cloaks shall be so arranged Hat and cloak as to secure complete circulation of air around such clothing as far as practicable.

73. (1) Wash-basins shall be provided at the rate of at least one basin for every 25 or fraction of 25 day scholars.

(2) Wash-basins shall be installed in positions convenient to but airdisconnected from the class-rooms and when not in a lavatory or a cloak-room shall be properly protected from the weather.

(3) The floor of every room compartment verandah or shelter containing wash-basins shall be formed of or covered with durable impervious material and its surface shall be adequately graded to an approved outlet for drainage.

(4) The walls of every such room compartment verandah or shelter where within 2 feet horizontally or vertically of any wash-basin shall be finished so as to be smooth impervious and washable.

(5) Every lavatory shall be thoroughly cross-ventilated to the satisfaction of the Commission.

PART X.—BUSINESS COLLEGES IN COMMERCIAL BUILDINGS.

- 74. No room shall be used for school purposes if situated above the second floor in a non-fireproof building nor above the fourth floor in a fireproof building.
- 75. The Commission may refuse to approve of the use of any portion of a building as a business college if any other portion of the building or any adjoining building is so used as to render the proposed class-rooms in the opinion of the Commission unsafe for any reason or unhealthy or undesirable by reason of noise or otherwise.
- 76. The width and number of exits from any floor which contains any business college class-room shall be at least as great as required in Part V. of these Regulations due allowance being made for the number of persons other than scholars likely to make use of the said exits; provided that in no case shall there be less than two exits from any floor above the ground floor.
- 77. Every class-room on any floor above the ground floor shall be so situated in relation to the stairways leading from such floor that in event of one stair being unavailable by reason of fire or smoke or otherwise another stair shall be accessible without the scholars having to pass the first stair.
- 78. Stairs shall comply with the provisions of Division 2 of Part V. of these Regulations except that the Commission may-

(a) accept stairs which have treads not less than 10 inches wide exclusive of nosing or overhang and rises not more than 7 inches

(b) approve of the use of class-rooms on a floor above the ground floor when one of the stairs therefrom is not constructed of fireproof material.

- 79. In all other respects the provisions of Part V. of these Regulations shall be complied with.
- 80. Where the main lighting wall of any proposed class-room faces a street lane yard or other open space measuring 66 feet or less in a direction at right angles to the said wall the provisions of Regulation 11 hereof shall apply:

Provided that the Commission may approve a class-room where the plane containing the upper glass-line of the main lighting windows and the top of the opposite building or wall makes an angle with the horizontal not exceeding 45° subject to the condition that the opposite building or wall is painted white and is repainted as often as the Commission considers necessary.

- 81. Where the main lighting wall of a class-room faces a street lane yard or other open space measuring over 66 feet in a direction at right angles to the said wall the provisions of Regulation 11 hereof shall not apply.
- 82. Where the breadth of any class-room exceeds that allowed by Regulation 46 (2) hereof no deak or table occupied by any scholar shall be placed farther from the main lighting wall than twice the height from the floor to the highest part of the glass in the main lighting wall and a line shall be painted on the floor at that distance from the main lighting wall.
- 83. In any class-room used solely for the teaching of typewriting the main lighting windows may be on the left or on the right of the pupils or partly on the left and partly on the right.
- 84. Class-rooms in which scholars are taught by individual tuition methods and in which no instruction by means of a blackboard is given may exceed 32 feet in length and desks in such rooms may be less than 7 feet from the front wall and main lighting windows less than 6 feet from such wall.
- 85. In all other respects business colleges shall comply with the provisions of Part VII. of these Regulations.

PART XI.—FIRE EXTINGUISHING APPLIANCES.

Fire extinguishing appliances.

- 86. (1) Fire hoses and/or chemical fire-extinguishers fire buckets or other means of preventing and extinguishing fires shall be provided in such number and position as the Commission shall direct, but not less than one bucket shall be provided for each 600 square feet or one chemical fire-extinguisher to each 1,800 square feet of floor area.
- (2) Fire buckets shall be of 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ gallons capacity with convex rimless bottoms and shall be painted red and marked FIRE and placed in holed stands or hung from strong brackets.

Chemical fireextinguishers. (3) Chemical fire extinguishers shall be of at least 2 Imperial gallons capacity and be approved by the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria and shall be placed on brackets or suspended from strong hooks.

PART XII.—DRINKING WATER.

- 87. (1) Drinking taps shall be provided in the proportion of not less than one such tap to every 30 or portion of 30 scholars.
- (2) Where the water supply is under pressure and does not require filtration to render it potable the drinking taps shall be bubble-taps projecting a jet of water diagonally upward and fitted with a guard to prevent application of the lips to the tap.

Air disconnexion of supply from sanitary conveniences.

88. (1) There shall be complete air-disconnexion between every pipe or cistern from which water is drawn for human consumption and every sanitary convenience or other source of unwholesome effluvium.

Filters

(2) Every filter shall be readily accessible and capable of being effectually cleaned and shall be so cleaned as often as may be necessary for maintaining a sufficient and wholesome output of water.

Use of lead

(3) Use for water supply purposes of pipes made of lead or other unwholesome or poisonous material is hereby prohibited.

PART XIII.—ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS.

Responsibility

89. The proprietor of any school in which there is a contravention of any prohibition made under these Regulations or a failure to do any act directed by these Regulations to be done shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

Offence and penalties.

90. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds; and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.





BY-LAW No. 120,

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the City of Hawthorn did make By-law No. 120, under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1928, the Local Government Act 1934 (No. 4279), section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1928, and all other powers it thereunto enabling.

The By-law contains the following provisions:-

Clause 1 (a).—Alteration of By-law No. 56 (Clause 11) in respect to the distances from streets at which fowl-houses may be erected.

(Clause 12) in respect to the erection of wire fences on land adjoining streets or roads.

(b) Alteration of By-law No. 112 by repealing clause 21, and substituting therefor a clause providing that pedestrians passing along a footpath shall keep to the left, and when meeting or overtaking any person proceeding in the same direction shall pass on the right-hand side of such person.

Clause 2.—Prohibits or regulates the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges abutting on any such street or road, or within 10 feet therefrom.

Clause 3.—Requires the removal or lopping of trees, shrubs, or hedges from or on private property so situate where such trees, shrubs, or hedges abut on, or are within 10 feet of such street or road; and

Clause 4.—Authorizes the Council to remove or lop, at the expense of the owner, trees, shruls, or hedges growing or being on private property so situate, which are not removed or lopped as required by or under any By-law.

Clause 5.—Defines the word "junction" under the By-law. Clause 6.—Prohibits the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages.

Clause 7.—Prohibits or regulates the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land, and requires the removal or destruction of rubbish on land.

Clause 8.—Fixes penalties for breach of, or continuing offence against By-law.

This By-law shall apply to and operate throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn.

The By-law shall come into operation immediately after this publication in the Government Gazette.

This By-law was passed by the Council of the City of Haw-thorn on 16th October, 1935, and confirmed on 13th Novem-ber, 1935.

5. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default offend against the provisions of the By-law shall, for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
