BY-LAWS
OF THE
**NORAH COSGRAVE TERANG AND DISTRICT
COMMUNITY HOSPITAL**

INTRODUCTORY

1. These By-laws shall come into operation on the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

DEFINITIONS

2. In these By-laws the word "contributor" shall have the same meaning as in the Act.

The words "the Act" shall mean the Hospital and Charities Act 1928 or any amendment thereto, and Regulations made by the Governor-in-Council under such Acts.

The word "Hospital" shall mean the "Norah Cosgrave Terang and District Community Hospital".

OBJECTS

3. The objects of the Hospital shall be:—
- (a) To afford relief including maintenance and the treatment, or cure of or attention to any disease or ailment or any injury consequent on any accident, medical and/or surgical attendance, medicine, nursing assistance, support or aid of any kind or in any form to such persons as are entitled thereto under the Act.
 - (b) To provide for carrying out investigations into ailments, diseases, injuries or other matters affecting the human body.

SEAL

4. The Common Seal of the Corporation shall be kept by the Secretary and shall not be affixed to any deed, document or writing except by order of the Committee at a meeting at which ten members are present at the time of making such order.

CONSTITUTION

5. The incorporated institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and the members of the Committee herein after referred to, Honorary Treasurer, Governors and Contributors.

LIFE GOVERNORS

6. A Life Governor shall be any person who being eligible under the By-laws is elected a Life Governor by the Committee. Any person may be elected a Life Governor—

- (a) who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the Hospital other than by contributing thereto;
- (b) who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the funds of the Hospital a sum of not less than Twenty Pounds in one donation;
- (c) who is nominated as a Contributor by any corporation, company or firm which at any time has contributed to the Hospital a sum of not less than Twenty Pounds in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm;
- (d) who is nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company, firm or employer who at any time have contributed to the funds of the Hospital a sum of not less than Twenty Pounds in one donation;
- (e) who is nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any will who at any time have allocated a sum of not less than Twenty Pounds to the Hospital in one donation out of the moneys of the testator not directed to be paid to the Hospital under the will;
- (f) who at any time between the sixth day of February 1933 and the twenty-sixth day of November 1935 has contributed to the funds of the Hospital a total amount (whether in one sum or otherwise) of not less than Twenty Pounds;

PROVIDED that any such contribution as aforesaid has been made without any right of relief having accrued or accruing in respect thereof to any person, corporation, company, firm, executor or trustee making the same or to any person nominated in respect of the same.

6a. Every Life Governor upon election shall forthwith be enrolled as such in the books of the Institution and shall be entitled to a Certificate stating that he has been so elected.

7. Every annual contribution shall be paid in advance and every first annual payment shall be calculated from the date thereof.

MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS

8. All Annual Meetings of contributors shall be advertised by the Secretary at least fourteen days and all special meetings at least seven days before the day on which such meeting is to be held in a newspaper circulating in the Terang district.

9. The Annual General Meeting of Contributors shall be held on such day between the first day of July and the thirty-first day of August in each year as shall be fixed by the Committee for the following purposes:—

- (a) To confirm the minutes of the previous Annual Meeting and special meetings if any no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.
- (b) To receive the report of the General Committee and audited statements of receipts and expenditure for the year to the 30th June preceding.
- (c) For election of President, two Vice-Presidents, Honorary Treasurer and Auditors for the ensuing year.
- (d) The election of members of the General Committee for the ensuing year in place of those retiring.
- (e) For the transaction of any business of which at least seven days notice has been given in writing to the Secretary by any contributor.

10. If required by the Committee or upon the requisition in writing of six members of the Committee or of ten contributors the secretary shall convene a special meeting of contributors the occasion for calling such meeting being stated in such requisition and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting excepting that for which it shall have been summoned.

11. At every General Meeting the President or in his absence the Senior Vice-President in attendance shall preside as Chairman but if none of these office-bearers is present the contributors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman at that meeting.

12. At all meetings of Contributors twenty shall form a quorum and if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the time named such meeting shall stand adjourned until the following week at the same day hour and place.

13. At all meetings of contributors all questions except questions involving contested elections shall be decided by a show of hands unless before or on the declaration of the result a division is demanded by any contributor in which event it shall be decided by a division. A declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has on a show of hands been carried or otherwise and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the fact provided however that where at least seven contributors so demand any resolution confirming a By-law shall be decided by poll as hereinafter provided.

14. Votes of contributors given through the post shall on a show of hands division or poll be counted in the same manner as if they had been given in person.

15. At all meetings of contributors the Chairman shall in the event of there being an equality of votes on any question have a casting vote in addition to his primary vote.

16. Contributors and Life Governors shall on all occasions each be entitled to one vote only.

17. Where at any meeting of contributors a poll is duly demanded on any resolution confirming a By-law the Chairman of such meeting shall adjourn the meeting to admit of the poll being taken to a day to be fixed by him not less than four nor more than ten days after the day of adjournment. On the day preceding that fixed for the adjourned meeting a poll of all contributors on the resolution in respect of which the poll was demanded shall be taken.

Notice of the poll specifying the By-law or By-laws to be confirmed and the day, place and time of polling shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the Terang district not less than three days before the day so fixed. The result of such poll shall be announced by the Chairman at the adjourned meeting and shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.

18. Where under the By-laws any election has to be decided by Poll such poll shall be taken on a day to be fixed by the Committee. Notice of the day so fixed of the time and place of polling and of the office or offices to be filled and the names of the candidates duly nominated shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the Terang district not less than three days before the day so fixed.

19. Upon a poll being taken each contributor may give his vote either in person or through the post. The Poll shall be kept open from eight o'clock in the morning to seven o'clock in the evening on the polling day and the votes of contributors who vote in person shall be recorded at any time between these hours. Votes recorded

by post shall reach the polling office appointed as aforesaid or the Secretary before the closing time for the poll. The Committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of the poll and the proper counting of the votes.

20. Upon a poll being taken as provided in By-law 17 the only persons entitled to vote thereat shall be Life Governors and contributors whose contribution for the then current year shall have been received by the Secretary at least 24 hours before the time fixed for the poll to be opened.

20a. For the purpose only of the election of members of the first Committee every person who has contributed to the funds of the Hospital at any time prior to the date fixed for such election shall be entitled to one vote.

21. Postal ballot papers may be obtained on application to the Secretary and must be returned to the Returning Officer in an envelope (which must be signed on the inside of the flap by the contributor or Life Governor) before the time fixed for the closing of the poll.

22. Each candidate may appoint a scrutineer for such election.

23. A minute book shall be kept as hereinafter provided in which shall be recorded minutes of all General Meetings. Such minutes if purporting to be signed by the Chairman of the meetings at which the proceedings were held or by the Chairman of the next succeeding General Meeting shall be evidence of the proceedings and such meeting shall be deemed to have been duly held and convened and the resolution recorded in the minutes duly passed or otherwise as recorded.

COMMITTEE AND OFFICE-BEARERS

24. The Committee shall consist of nineteen contributors comprising the President, the two Vice-Presidents and the Honorary Treasurer ex officio and fifteen elected members, and of the total number of nineteen members at least one member shall reside in and represent each of the following six districts namely:—Ecklin and Dixie; Laang and Garvoc; Noorat; Kolora; The Sisters; and Glenormiston. The boundaries of each such district shall be determined from time to time by the Committee and for the election of the first Committee under these By-laws such boundaries shall be tentatively determined by the Committee now engaged in the construction and establishment of the Hospital.

25. The Committee shall be elected and retire and any casual vacancy therein shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of the Act and any casual vacancy in the office of President, Vice-President, Treasurer or Auditor shall likewise be filled in accordance with such provisions.

At the first annual meeting of contributors held after the incorporation of the Hospital the members of the elected Committee to retire shall be the one-third number of those representing the six districts referred to in By-law 24 and the one-third number of the other elected members who in each case received the lowest number of votes at the first election of Committee members and at the second annual meeting of contributors held after the incorporation of the Hospital the members of the Committee to retire shall be the one-third number of the district and other elected members who in each case received the second lowest number of votes at the first election of Committee members and at the third annual meeting of contributors held after the incorporation of the Hospital all the other members of the original Committee then holding office shall retire but in every case the retiring members if eligible may be re-elected provided always that should two or more members of the elected Committee receive an equal number of votes the order of their retirement shall be determined between themselves by lot in the presence of a quorum of the Committee.

26. The President, Vice-President and Treasurer respectively shall hold office for one year and shall retire on the day of the Annual General Meeting next succeeding their election but may be re-elected.

27. Any contributor but no paid officer of the Hospital shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

28. The maximum number of legally qualified Medical Practitioners who may be members of such Committee shall not exceed one-sixth part of the members of the Committee or the integral number nearest to such one-sixth part.

29. The advertisement calling the Annual General Meeting shall state the names of the members of the Committee who will retire at such meeting and the number of vacancies to be filled and that nominations for the offices of President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Auditor and of the Committee require to be delivered to the Secretary on or before a day named being not less than seven nor more than ten days before the date fixed for such Annual General Meeting.

30. Where on or before the day so named in the advertisement as aforesaid more eligible candidates have not been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled the Chairman at the Annual General Meeting shall declare the persons so nominated duly elected to the offices for which they have been nominated.

31. Where on or before the date so named in the advertisement as aforesaid more eligible candidates have been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled a poll shall be taken. Such poll shall be held before the day of the Annual General Meeting and the results of such poll shall be announced by the Chairman at such meeting and the persons elected by such poll shall be deemed to have been elected at the Annual General Meeting.

32. The President shall be ex officio a member of all sub-committees and the Treasurer shall be ex officio a member of the Finance Committee.

33. No person who holds any office or place of profit under the corporation or who is in anywise concerned or participates in any contract with the Committee or in the profit thereof or of any work to be done under the authority of the Committee shall be or continue to be a member of such Committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any person by reason only of his being a shareholder in any Company which is concerned or participates in any contract or the profit thereof or of any work to be done as aforesaid nor by reason of his being interested in any public newspaper or journal publishing advertisements.

34. The Committee shall control the collection and distribution of funds appoint and dismiss all officials and servants frame rules and/or regulations for the management of the Hospital present a report to the annual meetings of contributors and manage and control the affairs of the Hospital generally.

35. All accounts for payment shall be passed by the Committee and the list thereof signed by the Chairman at the meeting at which the same are passed for payment.

36. No person shall hold or be eligible for any honorary office (except that of honorary medical officer or honorary dentist) nor have any vote nor exercise any privilege connected with the Hospital unless he is a Contributor to the funds of the Hospital within the meaning of these By-laws.

37. Any special meeting of contributors called for the purpose may alter the number of members of the Committee and every such alteration shall take effect immediately before the annual election of the Committee next following the making of the alteration.

MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE

38. The Committee shall meet on the first Tuesday of each month at such place and at such time as the Committee may determine.

39. Special Meetings of the Committee may be convened by the President or any four members. Notice shall be given to members of such meeting specifying the general nature of the business to be transacted and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

40. Written notice of each monthly meeting shall be served on each member of the Committee by delivering it to him 24 hours before the meeting or by sending it by post in a prepaid letter addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode in time to reach him 24 hours prior to the meeting being held.

41. No less than ten of the members shall form a quorum at any meeting of Committee. No business shall be transacted unless a quorum is present and if within half-an-hour of the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned.

42. The President or in his absence the senior Vice-President in attendance shall preside at all meetings of Committee but if none of these office-bearers is present the members shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

43. All questions arising at any meeting of the Committee shall be decided by a show of hands or if demanded by any member by a division. Each member including the Chairman shall have one vote. In the event of the numbers being equal the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

44. Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings at all meetings of Committee.

45. No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or rescinded for one calendar month after such resolution has been passed except at a Special Meeting of the Committee called for the purpose or by an absolute majority of the whole Committee.

46. The Committee shall prepare and lay before the contributors at each Annual General Meeting a general report of the affairs of the Hospital together with a balance sheet duly audited exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure for the twelve months ended on the 30th day of June next preceding the day of such meeting.

HOUSE COMMITTEE

47. The Committee shall at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of the contributors appoint from among themselves a House Committee of three members, two to form a quorum. The Committee shall elect its own Chairman at its first meeting.

The House Committee shall:—

- (a) Visit the Hospital at least once during the month;
- (b) Inspect the various parts of the Hospital;
- (c) Examine the condition of the furniture beds and bedding in the Hospital;
- (d) Satisfy themselves that all articles for human consumption in the Hospital are sound and wholesome, and that all food given to patients and staff is properly cooked and served out in a suitable manner;
- (e) Hear and investigate all complaints upon any matter relating to the Hospital;
- (f) Make suggestions for the further good management and discipline of the Hospital and for the comfort of the patients;
- (g) Perform such other functions as the Committee may from time to time determine;
- (h) Report in writing to the next monthly meeting of the Committee the result of their inspection and examination and otherwise regarding their work.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

48. A Finance Committee consisting of the Treasurer and two other members shall be elected by and from the General Committee at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of contributors. The Finance Committee shall elect its own Chairman at its first meeting. Two members shall form a quorum.

49. The Finance Committee shall:—

- (a) Visit the hospital once in each week;
- (b) Examine the admission form of each patient admitted to the Hospital and fix the amount payable by each patient by way of fee towards the cost of maintenance of the Institution.
- (c) Examine a statement (prepared by the Secretary) of all outstanding patients' fees and make recommendations to the committee whether
 - (i) the outstanding fees should be written off and why;
 - (ii) further action should be taken and by what means;
- (d) Examine the Secretary's cash book and other books of account and compare same with the bank pass book;
- (e) Give all needful instructions to the Secretary and Collector with reference to keeping books of account and collection of contributions and donations;
- (f) Examine the abstract of accounts prepared by the Treasurer for presentation to the Committee at its monthly meeting satisfy itself that all services in relation thereto have been duly executed and that all vouchers connected with the abstract have been correctly acquitted or certified;
- (g) See that the vouchers in connection with previous payments passed by the Committee have been properly receipted;
- (h) Examine the returns prepared for the Charities Board of Victoria and other Government Departments and the annual statement of accounts;
- (i) Perform such other duties as may be allotted by the Committee.

50. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the Finance Committee the signature of some member thereof should be appended with the date of examination.

OTHER SUB-COMMITTEES

51. The Committee may at any time appoint any number of other sub-committees (consisting of members of its own body) as it may think fit and may prescribe the functions of and delegate any of its powers to any such sub-committee.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR

52. The Secretary shall be the chief executive officer of the institution and shall be responsible for bringing under the notice of the Committee the provisions of the Act in force for the time being relating to Hospitals regulations under the Act conditions of grant and all other regulations that may from time to time be issued.

53. He shall attend all General and Special Meetings of contributors all meetings of the Committees and sub-committees take the minutes of the proceedings and shall transcribe them into books to be kept for that purpose, he shall keep the records of the institution conduct all correspondence call all meetings giving proper notice thereof and carry out the directions given to him by the Committee or any sub-committee.

54. He shall be responsible for the conduct of all the clerical business and shall keep the necessary books of account under direction of the Finance Committee.

55. He shall enter into a guarantee for the sum of £100 in some guarantee company approved of by the Committee. The Committee shall be responsible for the payment of the premium on such guarantee.

56. The Collector shall under the direction of the Finance Committee collect subscriptions and donations to the funds of the institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum that he receives and keep a duplicate of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the Committee.

MEDICAL OFFICERS

57. The Committee may make suitable arrangements for the proper medical supervision and care of patients. Such officers may be honorary, salaried or part honorary and part salaried.

FINANCE

58. The Secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the institution and issue the official receipt forthwith. Such moneys shall be deposited without delay to the credit of the Hospital in such Bank as the Committee may from time to time determine and the Treasurer shall satisfy himself that all moneys received are so paid in.

59. All accounts shall be paid by cheque and no payments shall be made without the authority of the Committee.

60. Cheques shall not be drawn or signed by the Treasurer except for moneys the payment whereof has been duly authorised by the Committee.

61. All cheques shall be drawn and signed by the Treasurer and be countersigned by the Secretary.

ALLOCATION OF FUNDS RECEIVED

62. All pecuniary gifts (inter vivos or testamentary) made to the Hospital specifically for endowment purposes shall be placed to the credit of the endowment fund and shall be invested by the Treasurer as the Committee shall from time to time direct and any income arising from such investment shall be paid to the credit of the maintenance account.

63. All unconditional pecuniary gifts (inter vivos or testamentary) not exceeding the sum of £100 shall be paid to the credit of the maintenance account.

64. All unconditional pecuniary gifts (inter vivos or testamentary) exceeding the sum of £100 shall be paid to the credit of a reserve fund.

65. All amounts placed in the reserve fund shall be invested from time to time in such manner as the Committee directs and any income arising from such investments shall be paid to the credit of maintenance or reserve funds. Provided that the Committee may at any time for maintenance building or equipment purposes authorise the disposal of the whole or any part of the reserve fund.

66. Accumulated credits to the maintenance account shall not be applied for endowment purposes but may be transferred to the reserve fund from time to time as the Committee directs.

67. All amounts placed in the reserve fund may be invested by the Treasurer from time to time as the Committee directs and any income arising from such investments shall be paid to the credit of maintenance or reserve funds at the discretion of the Committee provided that the Committee may at any time for maintenance building or equipment purposes authorise the disposal of the whole or any part of the reserve fund investments.

AUDITORS

68. Two Auditors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting each year and remuneration if any to be paid to them shall then be fixed.

69. The Auditors shall have access to the books and accounts of the Institution at all times and shall if they consider it necessary report direct to the Committee.

70. The Auditors shall during July in each year examine the Treasurer's annual financial statement compare it with all books and accounts and documents relating thereto and list of contributions and donations; they may make any special report thereon which they consider necessary to the annual meeting.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS

71. All patients (when able to do so) shall supply the particulars on the prescribed admission form and shall sign the appropriate declaration thereon.

72. The Committee or a sub-committee duly appointed for the purpose or an officer of the Institution authorised to act on their behalf will determine the admission of patients.

73. Except in cases of accident or other emergency which may be admitted by an authorised officer without recommendation those requiring treatment at the Hospital must be examined by a medical practitioner and subject to his recommendation or certificate that treatment is necessary the application may be dealt with.

FEEs

74. Fees for accommodation maintenance and nursing attention in the Institution and for service to out-patients shall be such as are fixed by the Committee from time to time.

VISITORS

75. Friends may be allowed to visit patients at such hours as are fixed by the Committee.

GENERAL

76. Patients and their friends are prohibited from giving money or any gratuity whatsoever to the Nursing Staff or other employees of the Hospital for their personal benefit.

77. Any patient gambling smoking in the wards without permission or behaving in any indecent manner in any part of the hospital premises will be liable to immediate discharge by the Committee.

NORAH COSGRAVE TRUSTEES

78. The Trustees for the time being of the estate of Norah Cosgrave late of "Southfield" Terang Widow deceased and/or their representatives or agents may at any time or times visit the Hospital and inspect the various parts thereof and examine the condition of the buildings grounds furniture equipment instruments implements and plant used therein or in connection therewith and may make such investigations and enquiries as they consider expedient from patients members of the staff and others concerned in the management or conduct of the Hospital to ascertain whether or not the same is being conducted satisfactorily and efficiently and is receiving adequate support and being effectually maintained and they may make suggestions to the Committee or office-bearers from time to time for the good or better management and control of the Hospital and for the welfare and treatment of patients.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

79. Subject to the provisions of the Act and of these By-laws the Committee may from time to time make rules and regulations for the internal management of the Hospital for the admission of patients for defining the duties of the various members of the staff and for such other purposes as it may consider expedient.

AMENDED ORDER RESPECTING MOTIVE POWER AND RATES TO BE CHARGED.—TRAMWAY IN THE SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 5th day of August, 1910, under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1890*, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 10th August, 1910, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Alexandra was authorized to construct a tramway within its municipal district; and whereas by Order in Council made on the 4th day of December, 1922, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th December, 1922, the rates provided in the aforesaid Order to be charged upon the said tramway for the carriage of timber, goods, and produce were amended as therein set forth; and whereas the Council of the said Shire of Alexandra has now made application under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1928*, to have the said Order amended respecting the motive power to be used in connexion with the said tramway and so as to provide for altered rates to be charged for the carriage of timber, goods, and produce upon the said tramway in lieu of the rates fixed by the Order in Council of the 4th day of December, 1922, and the said Council having duly complied with the requirements of the said Act and the regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objections having been lodged thereto within the time provided by the said rules, and the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Order in Council of the 5th day of August, 1910.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following, that is to say:-

That from the 1st day of December, 1935, in lieu of the motive power provided by the Order in Council of the 5th day of August, 1910, there shall be substituted the following:-

The motive power to be used shall be steam or electricity under the over-head trolley system, provided however that unless electricity is used the Council shall during the months from the first day of November to the first day of April in each and every year run the engine by internal combustion.

That the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Alexandra shall be and is hereby authorized to charge the following rates for the carriage of timber, goods, and produce upon the said tramway, from the 1st day of December, 1935, in lieu of the rates previously fixed by Order in Council of the 4th day of December, 1922:-

For all goods and produce (which shall not include live stock) other than timber, 6d. per ton per mile.

Consignments of less than one ton and more than 5½ cwt. shall be charged as a ton, and mileage of less than 6 miles as 6 miles, which minima shall apply to all timber, goods, and produce other than as follows:-

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF PURRUMBETE NORTH.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 17th October, 1923, as a site for Recreation Purposes in the Parish of Purrumbete North and known as Purrumbete North Recreation Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any entertainment, organized game or sport within the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. The Committee of Management shall have power to let the Reserve for the purposes of holding sports, matches, entertainments, or performances on such terms and conditions as may be considered reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the charge therefor shall not exceed the sum of Ten pounds per day.

4. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

6. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

7. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any Order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

4. 12. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling or other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.
