## ONIONS DECLARED A COMMODITY.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 6 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council when requested to do so by a petition signed (a) Where the number of producers of the product does not exceed two hundred—by at least fifty per centum of the total number of such producers or (b) Where the number of producers of the product exceeds two hundred—by at least one hundred of such producers plus five per centum of the number by which the total number of such producers exceeds two hundred, may by Proclamation declare that such product or any specified variety or grade thereof shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act: And whereas the Governor in Council has been requested by a petition signed in accordance with the abovementioned sub-section to declare that onions shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act: And whereas the said petition sets forth the particulars required by the provisions contained in sub-section (2) of section 6 of the said Act: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this my Proclamation hereby declare that onions shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE NETTING  
BOUNDARY NEAR THE MOUTH OF THE YARRA  
RIVER IN HOBSON'S BAY.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month, from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the twenty-first day of March, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of March, 1934, respecting netting in portion of Hobson's Bay, and in lieu thereof prohibiting the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine whether fixed or unfixed to be employed in fishing in Hobson's Bay within or inside the area bounded as follows:

Commencing at the north-eastern end of the Williamstown Breakwater Pier; thence in a northerly direction by a direct

imaginary line to the southernmost dolphin near Prince's Pier, Port Melbourne; thence westerly by a direct imaginary line to the junction of the small stone wall with the eastern training wall of the River Yarra; thence north-westerly by the said eastern training wall to the south boundary of Williamstown-road; thence westerly by a direct imaginary line across the River Yarra to the ferry berth; thence, in a generally southerly direction by high water mark to the eastern side of the Williamstown Breakwater Pier; thence north-easterly by the eastern side of the said pier to the point of commencement.

NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen a fishing boundary post has been erected at the junction of the small stone wall with the eastern training wall of the River Yarra.

## State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932.

## AWARD No. 17 OF 27TH NOVEMBER, 1935, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932* (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder dated 21st August, 1934, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

## (1) Examiner—

- (a) The marginal rate to be paid to employees in the grade of examiner shall be 4s. per day.  
(b) The margin specified shall also cover any consideration for commencing a day shift prior to 8 a.m.

## (2) Shiftman acting as examiner—

- (a) Any shiftman shall be paid an allowance of 1s. per shift if acting as an examiner for one hour or less, and 1s. 6d. per shift if acting for more than one hour and up to four hours. If acting as an examiner for more than four hours he shall be paid the rate prescribed for examiner for the whole shift.  
(b) The allowances of 1s. and 1s. 6d. shall not be included in calculating the extra rate for afternoon and night shift, and shall also cover any consideration for commencing a day shift prior to 8 a.m.

(3) Any wheeler acting as a set runner shall be paid the respective allowances specified in addition to his ordinary wage, viz.:—

- (a) When not required to ride, 6d. per day.  
(b) When required to ride, 1s. per day.

## (4) Definitions—

- (a) Clipper includes any lad clipping on or clipping off.  
(b) Weighbridge boy includes any lad performing the work of a weighbridge boy on any brace.

**REGULATIONS.**

**W**HEREAS by section 4, sub-section (5) (a) of the *Melbourne Market and Park Lands Act 1933*, and section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, provision is made for the making of regulations for portion of an area of 2 acres 26 perches of land in the City of Melbourne on which is built the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons: Now therefore I, John Richards Harris, the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of so much of the said land as is not required for buildings or any extensions thereof and approaches thereto and hereinafter referred to as "The Reserve."

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

2. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the Reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, fruit peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the trees, seats, or fences in or around the Reserve, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts, or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or other structures, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless held by a chain or cord.

5. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

6. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management thereof first obtained.

7. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the Reserve any article, fruit, or merchandise.

8. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals, and any such found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

9. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the Reserve, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to the members of the public in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management thereof first obtained.

10. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

11. No person shall play at or engage in any game, athletic sport, or gymnastic exercise in the Reserve.

12. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the Reserve unless in charge of an adult friend or nurse.

13. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management thereof, carry, use, or discharge any firearms in the Reserve.

14. No person shall in any part of the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management thereof.

15. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within the Reserve.

16. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management thereof.

17. No person shall interfere with or remove any plants, flowers, seeds, or other property from the Reserve, or injure any property therein, and any person offending shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve.

18. No person shall interfere in any way with the animals or birds in the Reserve.

19. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Committee of Management thereof, shall ride or drive any horse, or any bicycle, trieycle, motor car, or other vehicle in the Reserve.

Every person offending against any such Regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The Committee of Management of the Reserve is the Council of the City of Melbourne.

## Scaffolding Fees.

A By-law of the City of Moorabbin made under the provisions of Part XXXIX. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 66, for the purpose of repealing portion of By-law No. 50 of the said Municipality, and for appointing fees which may be charged and received on account of the Municipal Fund by the officer authorized herein to receive the same for any inspection or service made or performed by an Inspector under such Part or any Regulations thereunder.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. That portion of the First Schedule to By-law No. 50 of the City of Moorabbin (known as the "Building Regulations") commencing with the words "Fees payable for inspection of Scaffolding" and ending with the words and figures "Scaffolding over 30 feet in height . . . £2" is hereby repealed.

2. The following fees are hereby appointed which may be charged and received on account of the Municipal Fund of the City of Moorabbin by the Building Surveyor of the said City (who is hereby authorized to receive same) for any inspection or service made or performed by an Inspector under Part XXXIX. of the *Local Government Act* or any Regulations under that Part in connexion with any building in the Municipality other than a wooden building not more than 15 feet in height, namely:—

(a) For inspecting swinging stages—the fee of 2s. 6d.  
(b) For inspecting buildings up to but not exceeding sixteen squares in area—

(1) Where the scaffolding does not exceed 15 feet in height—the fee of 5s.

(2) Where the scaffolding exceeds 15 feet but does not exceed 30 feet in height—the fee of 10s.

(3) Where the scaffolding exceeds 30 feet in height—the fee of £1.

(c) For inspecting buildings exceeding sixteen squares in area—

(1) Where the scaffolding does not exceed 15 feet in height—the fee of 10s.

(2) Where the scaffolding exceeds 15 feet but does not exceed 30 feet in height—the fee of £1.

(3) Where the scaffolding exceeds 30 feet in height—the fee of £1 10s.

3. In this By-law the area of any building shall mean the aggregate area of every floor thereof.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipality of the City of Moorabbin.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928* and every other power it thereunto enabling and numbered 121 for repealing or altering clause 3 of By-law No. 75 and for preserving public decency.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. That the By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 75 is hereby altered as follows:—

Clause 3 of the said By-law shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be inserted the following clauses, viz.:—

3. Every person over four years of age bathing in any waters exposed to public view (other than baths to which special regulations apply) shall in order to secure the observance of decency be clad in a bathing costume covering the body at least to the extent provided in this By-law, and such costume shall—

(a) have legs at least three inches long;

(b) completely cover the chest and front of the body from a line at the level of the armpits down to the waist. Below the waistline the whole of the trunk, front, back, and sides shall be covered, and the covering shall descend without a break to the lower end of the leg covering;

(c) be provided with shoulder straps or other means of keeping it in position;

(d) have, in addition, in the case of a person over the age of twelve years a half skirt attached to the waist covering the front of the body below the waistline and descending to the lower end of the leg covering.

3A. Any employee of the Council or any police constable or any person authorized in writing under the seal of the Council may require any person contravening the provisions of the preceding clause 3 to at once resume his or her ordinary clothes.

2. The provisions of this By-law shall come into operation and have full force and effect throughout the whole of the Municipality of the City of Hawthorn on from and after the first day of May, 1936.

## Quarrying or Blasting Operations.

A By-law of the Shire of Keilor made in accordance with the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 16, for prohibiting, regulating, or controlling quarrying or blasting operations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Keilor order as follows:—

1. Except with the written consent of the Council, no person or persons shall, within the Shire of Keilor, carry on any quarrying operations for the removal of rock, stone, gravel, clay, soil, or other materials, or use explosives for blasting.

2. Provided that the provisions of this By-law shall not apply to any such operations in connexion with works commenced before the fourth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, or to works carried on by any Government

Department of the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the Metropolitan Gas Company, the Colonial Gas Association, the State Electricity Commission, or by the Keilor Shire Council.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Keilor.

4. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day and not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continued.

5. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately on its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
